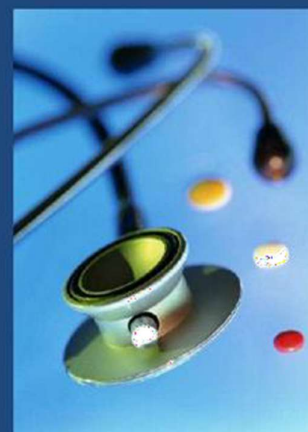

IMPORTANT NOTICE

1. Registration on the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC)/ Director General Health Services (DGHS) Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) website www.mcc.nic.in, under the Priority as applicable, is **MANDATORY for candidates of all priorities** in order to be eligible for taking admission in AFMS institutions. Counselling schedule will be published by MCC.
2. Online counselling for Priority-I & II candidates will be conducted by O/o DGAFMS. Online counselling consisting of registration, payment, choice filling/ locking and processing of provisional seat allotment for Priority-III, IV & V candidates for the academic session 2026-29 will be conducted by MCC through their web portal/ website (mcc.nic.in). The seats allotted will be provisional and subject to fulfillment of the general and priority specific eligibility criteria, as laid down in this Information Bulletin and the local State/ University/ National Board of Examination (NBE)/ National Medical Council (NMC)/ Dental Council of India (DCI)/ National Dental Council (NDC)/ GoI rules & regulations. Dates will be published on MCC/ DGHS (MoHFW) website.
3. The candidates are advised to read the Information Bulletin carefully.
4. Desirous candidates are to print and retain a copy of the registration slip till completion of the admission process.
5. All other relevant timelines/ information will be made available on the DGHS website www.mcc.nic.in and the AFMS websites www.afmcdg1d.gov.in.
6. **Candidates are advised to visit these websites regularly for updates.**

INTRODUCTION

1. Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) conducts Post Graduate training primarily for the in-service medical and dental officers of the AFMS so as to fulfill the specialist requirements. Surplus seats, if any, are offered to other eligible candidates as per priority system sanctioned by the Govt of India. The civilian doctors who get admission in Post Graduate courses (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) at any AFMS institution shall be liable to serve as Short Service Commissioned Officers (SSC) for 05 years in AFMS.

2. Admissions for PG courses in AFMS PG Teaching Institutes is as per the Priority system outlined below (Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No 10(4)/2024/D(Med) dt 25 Jul 2025 & it's corrigendum dt 02 Sep 2025) :-

2.1 Priority – IA : Permanent Commissioned (PC) AFMS Officers detailed on Advance Specialist/PG Courses.

2.2 Priority – IB : Short Service Commissioned (SSC) AFMS Officers detailed on Advance Specialist/ PG Courses.

2.3 Priority – II : Candidates sponsored by Friendly Foreign Countries and AFMS Officers granted Study Leave.

2.4 Priority – III : Medical Officers sponsored by Para Military organizations and other Govt. of India organizations.

2.5 Priority – IV : Ex-SSC Officers of AFMS within 3 years of their release from service.

2.6 Priority – V : Civilian candidates.

3. Counselling for Priority-I & II candidates will be conducted by O/o DGAFMS after they have successfully registered on the MCC portal. Counselling of Priority-III, IV & V candidates will be conducted by MCC. Priority-III, IV & V candidates are advised to register themselves on the MCC portal for counselling as per published schedule and further select the preferred institute and seat. More information in this regard, including the detailed registration and counselling process, will be available on the MCC website www.mcc.nic.in and the AFMS websites www.afmcdg1d.gov.in once the MCC publishes the counselling schedule. Seat allotment during counselling by MCC is provisional and subject to fulfillment of all eligibility criteria as mentioned in this Information Bulletin. AFMS reserves the right to deny admission to any candidate who is found to be ineligible due to any of the following:-

3.1 Deficiency in documents.

3.2 Upon being found to be medically unfit. (For candidates of Priority-V, the medical examination would be conducted as per the medical standards, as amended from time to time, available on www.afmcdg1d.gov.in).

3.3 Any other ground as decided by the competent authority.

NUMBER OF SEATS

4. The total number of PG seats in AFMS institutions available for counselling and admission in a particular academic session, are governed and limited as per the accreditation/ recognition status, existing recognized faculty / resources available and directions of the NBE/ NMC/ DCI/ NDC/ MoHFW/ DGAFMS/ Hon'ble Court. The total number of recognized and accredited seats available in AFMS PG Teaching Institutes generally exceeds the requirement of the AFMS. Thus, as sanctioned by the Govt of India, after fulfilling the AFMS requirements, the remaining seats, if any, are made available to other eligible candidates as per a priority system.

5. Details of available seats will be available as part of seat matrix uploaded on the MCC website.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

6. Candidates may kindly note that appearance in NEET PG/MDS does not confer any automatic right to secure a Post Graduate (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) seat in AFMS institutions. Counselling, allotment of seat and admission is subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility criteria, medical fitness test/ examination and any such criteria as may be prescribed by the respective universities, AFMS institutions, NBE, NMC, DCI, NDC and State/ Central Government. Counselling for Priority–III, Priority–IV & Priority–V candidates will be conducted by MCC. Candidates are thus required to first select their priority and then fill their choice of seat at the time of registration on MCC website itself. For further information regarding counselling procedure, desirous candidates are directed to visit the MCC website.

7. Candidates producing false or fabricated information shall not be considered for admission in AFMS institutes. Candidature of such candidates will be liable to be summarily rejected at any stage and appropriate legal action will be taken.

8. Candidates should go through the Information Bulletin carefully before contacting the AFMS for any queries. Queries pertaining to eligibility and other issues shall only be entertained if the information requested is not given in this bulletin.

9. A candidate's eligibility is purely provisional and is subject to the fulfillment of eligibility criteria as prescribed in this Information Bulletin. Instructions in the Information Bulletin are liable to changes based on directions issued by the NBE/ NMC/ DCI/ NDC/ MoHFW/ AFMS/ Hon'ble Court from time to time. Desirous candidates will have to fulfill all the criteria stipulated at the time of admission.

10. The existing schedule, pattern, policy and guidelines as contained in this Information Bulletin are for ready reference for admission for the academic session 2026-29 only.

11. In case of any ambiguity in interpretation of any of the instructions/ terms/ rules/ criteria regarding the determination of eligibility of candidates, counselling, grant of admission, information contained herein, the interpretation of the AFMS will be final and binding.

12. All correspondence should be addressed by e-mail on oiexams.afmc@nic.in. The e-mail query shall be addressed only if it contains NEET PG/ MDS Roll No and contact telephone number of the candidate in the subject heading. Any e-mail containing vague or general queries that are covered in the Information Bulletin shall not be entertained. Queries shall not be entertained from any person(s) claiming to be a representative, associate or officiate of a desirous candidate.

13. Candidates are advised to visit the websites www.afmcdg1d.gov.in & www.mcc.nic.in regularly for information and notices pertaining to admission to PG courses (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) at AFMS institutions for the academic session 2026-29.

14. Candidates may note that by registering for AFMS PG/ MDS counselling and selecting a seat on the MCC website, the candidate is deemed to have read, understood and accepted the terms and conditions laid out in the Information Bulletin of AFMS and any notice/ notification for admission to PG courses (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) for the academic session 2026-29 as uploaded on the AFMS website (www.afmcdg1d.gov.in) from time to time.

15. Not abiding by the instructions as promulgated vide this Information Bulletin and all the notices/ notifications that are uploaded on the AFMS website will lead to the candidature being summarily deemed as cancelled. Seat allotment during the online counselling conducted by MCC is purely provisional and subject to the candidate fulfilling the various general and priority specific criteria contained in this Information Bulletin and in any notice/ notification as and when uploaded on AFMS website. Furthermore, the provisionally allotted seat may also be deemed to be cancelled if the candidate fails to report to the allotted institute within the stipulated time.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CANDIDATES OF ALL PRIORITIES

16. Candidates desirous of admission to Post Graduate courses in AFMS institutions shall appear in the NEET PG/ MDS 2026 and secure minimum qualifying score as indicated by NBE to be eligible. All candidates have to register on MCC website for AFMS Institutions as per priority. Further, candidates under Priority-III, IV & V would also have to select the preferred institute and seat as per schedule and methodology stipulated by the MCC.

17. Admission to the Post Graduate courses (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) at AFMS institutions, subject to the priorities laid down in this Information Bulletin is open to graduates of medical/ dental colleges recognized by NMC/ DCI/ NDC and who have registered themselves as

'Registered Medical/ Dental Practitioners' with any State Medical/ Dental Council recognized by NMC/ DCI/ NDC. **Cut-off dates in respect of MBBS/BDS students for completion of internship towards eligibility for NEET-PG 2026/ NEET MDS- 2026 will be same as notified by NBEMS.** However, the Provisional Registration Certificate / Permanent Registration Certificate should be available at the time of admission.

18. All candidates, except Priority-II, must be **citizens of India.**

19. **Candidates applying under Priority-III, IV & V shall not be eligible to take admission in AFMS Institutions if he/ she has 'cancelled'/ 'failed to report for admission within the stipulated time'/ 'vacated a seat mid-course in the past', which has resulted in lapse/ wastage of a seat. The effective period of debarment will be three years from the year of joining the seat.**

20. The liabilities of vacating an allotted seat in respect of **Priority-III, IV & V** candidates admitted under any priority on conclusion of the counselling will be as per the policy and directions of the NBE/ NMC/ DCI/ NDC/ MoHFW/ MCC/ DGAFMS/ Hon'ble Court. Candidates leaving a seat mid-session after the commencement of course as a result of which a seat gets wasted, will not be considered eligible to participate in the AFMS counselling **for three years from the year of joining the seat.** They will be liable to pay the University charges to which the college is affiliated and bond money as laid down in the Surety Bond executed at the time of admission, as applicable. Format of the Surety Bond for are attached as Appx 'A' for MD/MS/DNB courses and Appx 'B' for MDS courses.

PRIORITY SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

21. **Priority-I** : AFMS Officers (Priority-I A & I B) detailed on Advance Specialist Course/ PG Course (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) are guided by laid down extant training rules.

22. **Priority-II** : Candidates of 'Friendly Foreign Countries' sponsored by respective countries and approved by the GoI (Authority: Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No 10(4)/2024/D(Med) dt 25 Jul 2025 & it's corrigendum dt 02 Sep 2025) and also qualified in the NEET PG/MDS 2026. As per NMC/DCI/NDC guidelines candidates of 'Friendly Foreign Countries' sponsored by respective countries are required to apply for temporary registration in NMC/DCI/NDC. AFMS Officers granted Study Leave are guided by laid down extant training rules

23. **Priority - III** : Medical/ dental officers sponsored by Para Military Organizations/ other Govt of India organizations.

23.1 'Sponsorship Certificate' of candidates with necessary supporting documents will be forwarded to the O/o DGAFMS by the respective Ministries/ Departments/ HQ of the Para Military organizations/ Head office of other GoI organizations, duly endorsed by the

competent authority. Correspondence in this regard will only be accepted from official channels and correspondence by individual candidates will not be entertained.

23.2 The format, timeline and methodology of forwarding the Sponsorship Certificate in respect of medical officers only is outlined in detail vide letter No 38217/NEET PG-2026/DGAFMS/DG-1D dt 24 Apr 2026 addressed to respective Ministries/ Para Military Organizations. The same has been notified on the official website www.afmcdg1d.gov.in vide notification No 38217/NEET PG-2026/I/DGAFMS/DG-1D dt 24 Apr 2026. For dental officers sponsored by Para Military Organizations/ other Govt of India organizations the last date for the sponsorship certificates to reach the O/o DGAFMS has been notified on the official website www.afmcdg1d.gov.in vide notification No 38217/NEET PG-2026/I/DGAFMS/DG-1D dt 24 Apr 2026. **Format of Sponsorship Certificate for Priority-III candidates for MD/MS/DNB courses is attached as Appx 'A' and Sponsorship Certificate for Priority-III candidates for MDS courses is attached as Appx 'B'.**

23.3 Priority-III candidates will be considered eligible for admission in AFMS Institutions **only for those subjects, which are mentioned in their sponsorship certificate** as forwarded by the respective sponsoring authority. In case a Priority-III candidate is allotted a seat during the counselling conducted by the MCC which is not mentioned in the Sponsorship Certificate forwarded by the sponsoring organization, admission in AFMS PG Teaching Institutes would not be granted and the candidate would be liable to suffer the consequences.

23.4 List of eligible candidates sponsored by respective sponsoring authorities will be forwarded to MCC for the seat allotment.

23.5 Any Priority-III candidate leaving the allotted seat after conclusion of AFMS PG admission will have to submit an application duly signed & recommended by competent authority of the Sponsoring Organization. **Any application, vide which a Priority-III candidate is requesting to leave the seat without the recommendation of the sponsoring authority will not be accepted.**

24. **Priority – IV** : Ex-SSC AFMS Officers after completion of contractual service and within three years of their release from service. The date of release, for admissions into AFMS PG teaching institutes for the academic session 2026-29, should not be before 01 May 2023.

24.1 SSC officers who have finished or are likely to finish their initial contractual service on or before the date of NEET PG Exam-2026 may appear under this category subject to having submitted their application for release along with the Appx 'C' to the O/o DGAFMS

letter No 38217/NEET PG-2026/DGAFMS/DG-1D dt 25 Mar 2026. At the time of admission, they will have to produce documentary proof of them having attained Ex-SSC status without which they will not be considered for admission.

24.2 SSC Officers who have resigned their commission/ dismissed/ removed from service/ not completed their initial contractual service or have been removed from PG course (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) on disciplinary grounds while in service are NOT ELIGIBLE as Priority-IV candidates in this priority.

24.3 However, SSC Officers who have being removed from PG Course (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) on medical grounds while in service, are eligible to pursue PG courses as Priority-IV candidates in AFMS Institutions.

24.4 Ex-SSC officers will have to send their release order via mail (oicexams.afmc@nic.in) to this office to determine their eligibility as and when notified vide notice/ notification uploaded on our website, afmcdg1d@gov.in. The list of eligible candidates, who have submitted their release order within the stipulated time period, will be forwarded to MCC for the provisional seat allotment.

25. **Priority – V :** Civilian candidates willing to serve in the AFMS subject to fulfilling the eligibility criteria mentioned in this Information Bulletin. It may be noted that offering of PG (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) seats to civilian candidates as Priority - V is with the sole objective to meet the specialist requirement of the AFMS. Civilian candidates at the time of admission will have to submit a bond agreement to pay an amount as sanctioned by the Govt of India in case they are unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission. They also have to be medically fit as per the standards required for commission in the AFMS at the time of admission. Officers of the AFMS who have resigned their commission/ dismissed/ removed from service/ not completed their initial contractual service as SSC officers are not eligible to be considered even as Priority-V candidates, though they may fulfill the age criteria. Detailed eligibility criteria are as under:-

25.1 Due to the service liability, eligibility criteria for Priority-V candidates includes the age & medical fitness. Priority-V candidates, are expected to be conversant with the medical standards, available on www.afmcdg1d.gov.in, for entry into the AFMS as a commissioned officer. Priority-V candidates will undergo medical examination by a duly constituted medial board before grant of admission, so as to assess their fitness for commissioning as per laid down criteria and will be admitted only if found **MEDICALLY FIT**.

25.2 Seat allotment during MCC counselling is purely provisional and final admission will be subject to the candidate successfully fulfilling the age criteria and medical fitness examination in conjunction with the general eligibility criteria promulgated vide this

Information Bulletin. Candidature of candidates found to be unfit or over-aged at the time of admission, will be deemed to be cancelled/ forfeited.

25.3 Maximum permissible age for Priority-V candidates is less than 30 years as on 31 Dec 2026 (i.e., date of birth being on or after 01 Jan 1997) in order to fulfill the service liability.

25.4 The candidate shall be liable to serve the AFMS for 05 years on successful completion of PG Course (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) subject to fulfilling other eligibility criteria.

25.5 For admission into PG (MD/MS/DNB) courses, the candidate will have to execute a bond agreement as per **Appx 'C'** at the time of admission, to pay a sum of Rs. 60,50,000/- (Rupees Sixty Lakh and Fifty Thousand only) for the session 2026-29, to Govt of India, in case unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission on completion of the course.

25.6 For admission into MDS courses, the candidate will have to execute a bond agreement as per **Appx 'D'** at the time of admission, to pay a sum of Rs. 55,50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Five Lakhs Fifty thousand only) for the session 2026-29, to Govt of India, in case unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission on completion of the course.

25.7 A candidate who fails to complete the course successfully before crossing 35 years of age, due to any circumstances, **WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE** for commission in the Armed Forces and rendered Non Service Liability (NSL). Such candidates will be liable to pay the **bond money** to the Govt of India as applicable.

METHODOLOGY FOR APPLYING

26. The following methodology will be adopted by all candidates :-

26.1 Candidates seeking admission to any of the institutions of the AFMS will have to mandatorily appear in the NEET PG/ MDS-2026 and secure minimum qualifying score as indicated by NBE.

26.2 All candidates will have to register, opt for AFMS, and subsequently select their priority as applicable on the MCC website www.mcc.nic.in.

26.3 A copy of the printed registration slip/ printout of the registration details page should be kept safely by the candidate to be produced at the time of admission or as indicated by this office.

26.4 Priority-III candidates:- For medical officers sponsored by Para Military Organizations/ other Govt of India organizations, the Sponsorship Certificates of (Medical officers) have been invited vide letter No 38217/NEET PG-2026/ DGAFMS/DG-1D dt 24 Apr 2026 (addressed to respective Ministry/ Para Military Organizations) and notification No 38217/NEET PG-2026/I/DGAFMS/DG-1D dt 24 Apr 2026 as uploaded on official

website www.afmcdg1d.gov.in. For dental officers sponsored by Para Military Organizations/ other Govt of India organizations, the last date for the sponsorship certificates to reach the Office of DGAFMS has been notified on the official website www.afmcdg1d.gov.in vide notification No 38217/NEET PG-2026/I/DGAFMS/DG-1D dt 24 Apr 2026.

26.5 Priority-V candidates will have to submit a bond agreement at the time of admission to pay an amount as sanctioned by the Govt. of India. Candidature of any candidate found to be giving wrong information will be liable for summary rejection at any stage of the admission process by the Commandant of the institution where a seat has been provisionally allotted during online counselling by the MCC. The decision of the Commandant of the institution will be final.

26.6 List of certificates to be submitted in original by the selected candidates at the AFMS PG Teaching Institute on the day of admission along with the same as a scanned (.pdf format) softcopy on a CD are as under:-

- 26.6.1 06 (Six) Passport size photographs.
- 26.6.2 NEET PG/MDS 2026 Admit card and printed copy of the DGHS website registration slip.
- 26.6.3 NEET PG /MDS 2026 rank card allotted by NBE.
- 26.6.4 Class X/ SSLC/ ICSE certificate as valid certificate of proof of age.
- 26.6.5 Nationality Certificate/ Xerox copy of valid passport/ Domicile Certificate (where applicable)/ Birth Certificate endorsed with **INDIAN** nationality on it.
- 26.6.6 First to Final year MBBS/ BDS Mark Sheets of respective university. Priority – V candidates (Dental only) should have secured a min of 55 % marks in final BDS.
- 26.6.7 MBBS/ BDS Pass Certificate/Degree Certificate.
- 26.6.8 Internship Completion Certificate.
- 26.6.9 Permanent/ Provisional State Medical/ Dental Council registration certificate.
- 26.6.10 Attempt Certificate.
- 26.6.11 Transfer Certificate/ Migration certificate.
- 26.6.12 Educational Gap affidavit, if any.
- 26.6.13 Provisional allotment letter issued by the MCC.
- 26.6.14 Priority - III candidates only: Permission to proceed on Study Leave from the employing/ sponsoring organization is mandatory for Priority-III candidates and **admission without the same will not be granted under any circumstance.**
- 26.6.15 Priority - IV candidates – Release order from AFMS and movement order from last unit for proceeding on release.

26.6.16 Declaration by the candidate is placed at **Appx 'E'**.

Candidature of the applicants without any of the above documents is liable to be summarily rejected.

COUNSELLING SESSION

27. Counselling for allocation of subjects will be held as described below:-

27.1 Counselling of Priority-I & II candidates will be conducted by O/o DGAFMS. Priority-wise online counselling for Priority – III, IV & V will be conducted by MCC based on the candidates' merit-cum-choice.

27.2 Candidates will be personally responsible with regards to determining their eligibility as per their priority based on the criteria enumerated in this Information Bulletin before participating in the counselling process.

27.3 Candidates who are found to be ineligible at time of admission or during the course, due to them not fulfilling any of the criteria mentioned in this Information Bulletin and in the various notices/ notifications uploaded on official website or due to them providing false information, will not be admitted and their admission would be liable to be cancelled at any stage. Further, legal action based upon level of indiscretion/ fraud may also be initiated.

27.4 The candidates who have been allotted seats shall produce all the original certificates for verification as applicable. Candidates without documents in original at the time of admission will not be eligible for admission to the college regardless of their merit.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

28. Admission procedure shall be as follows:-

28.1 Admission to PG courses (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) at AFMS institutions is provisional subject to confirmation/ ratification by the O/o DGAFMS & concerned university. The selected candidates are required to submit additional documents/ certificates as per specific requirement of the institute/ university. Candidates should ascertain these details from the Dean Academics of the institute.

28.2 Decision of Commandant of the institute, duly approved by the DGAFMS, shall be final and binding.

28.3 All candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Cards of the NEET PG / MDS 2026 and NEET Rank card till allotment of the seats and admission to the institution.

29. **Medical examination of civilian (Priority V) candidates:** This is a mandatory requirement for all civilian (Priority - V) candidates. The medical standards required for civilian

candidates are those applicable for selection as commissioned officers in the AFMS. Admission to PG courses (MD/MS/DNB/MDS) shall only be given to those civilian doctors who are found medically fit for commission by a designated Medical Board as per laid down medical standards for commissioning. For reference of the candidates, the medical parameters are available on www.afmcdg1d.gov.in. The candidates who are found medically unfit by the Medical Board will not be admitted to any of the AFMS institutes. There is a provision of appeal for any candidate who has been found to be medically unfit, by a Board of Medical Officers as per directions of the O/o DGAFMS. If the candidate wishes to appeal, he / she should apply to the Commandant, of the AFMS Training institution by 1800hrs on the day of being declared medically unfit. The decision of the Appeal Medical Board will be final. There is NO provision for medical examination / board of any other nature after a candidate has been declared unfit by the Appeal Medical Board. There is no provision for declaring a candidate temporary unfit. Candidates finally declared unfit, will not be considered for admission. No seat will be kept pending on account of the candidate wishing to undergo treatment (Medical / Surgical) for a disease / disability for which he / she is made unfit.

30. It is recommended that, candidates prior to participating in the counselling as a Priority-V candidate should ascertain their medical fitness as per the stipulated guidelines mentioned above. AFMS and MCC will not be responsible for any loss suffered by the candidate as a consequence of denial of admission in AFMS PG Teaching Institutes due to the candidate being declared medically unfit.

BOND AGREEMENT FOR CIVILIAN CANDIDATES UNDER PRIORITY-V CATEGORY

31. All Priority-V candidates, if selected, are required to execute a bond agreement to serve as Short Service Commissioned (SSC) Officers for 5 years with the AFMS or pay an amount as sanctioned by the Govt. of India at the time of admission in case they are unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission. For the academic session 2026-29, the bond amount is **Rs. 60.5 Lakhs (Rupees Sixty Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only) for MD/MS/DNB courses** and **Rs. 55.5 Lakhs (Rupees Fifty Five Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only) for MDS courses** (Authority: Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No.17436/DGAFMS/DG-1D/334/21/D(Med) dated 15th Mar, 2021). The bond is to be executed on a Rs. 500/- non judicial stamp paper and registered/ notarized with office of sub-registrar and submitted on the day of admission. Expenses in connection with registration of Bond Agreement are to be borne by the respective candidate. The conditions in which the civilian candidates are not eligible to join the AFMS as SSC Officers are laid down in the Surety Bond which will be executed at the time of admission.

DISCIPLINE

32. Any candidate found obstructing or trying to influence the counselling and/ or the admission process in any unlawful manner shall be liable for disqualification from the process of admission. Canvassing directly or indirectly for allotment of seat will lead to direct disqualification of the candidates. Attempt at influencing the counselling authority and/ or their staff by unfair/any means shall lead to the cancellation of allotment of seat and such a candidate will be liable to face disqualification from taking admission/ appearing in the counselling in subsequent years. The decision taken by the counselling authorities in this respect shall be final and binding.

LEGAL JURISDICTION

33. The redressal of disputes, if any, shall only be through civil courts having jurisdiction of New Delhi alone.

POST ADMISSION ASPECTS AS APPLICABLE

34. **Stipend** - Selected candidates under Priority IV and V only shall be paid Stipend, as applicable as per respective University/ State Govt rules. Details of the institutions are available and placed at **Appx 'F'**.

35. **Discipline** - All candidates are expected to be well turned out, polite, courteous, disciplined and sincere and will follow the rules of the college. The college reserves the right to prematurely terminate the course of a candidate in case of repeated breaches or a major breach of discipline by him/her. Registration once granted is valid only if the Head of the Department and Commandant of the Institute are satisfied about regularity and diligent pursuit of studies by the student as well as good conduct and discipline befitting the institution and the university. The Commandant, in consultation with the Officer I/C Training and Head of Department may recommend to the university for removal/ withdrawal of registration of a PG Student for irregularity or misconduct.

Security Deposit

All selected candidate who opt to join the course at AFMS institution (except serving officers) will have to deposit Rs. 10,000/-(Rupees Ten Thousand only) as security deposit by DD in favour of Commandant of the AFMS institution where he/ she has accepted the seat. The same is refundable after completion of course.

Non-Completion of Course

Once registered, the candidate is expected to complete the course of the respective University. The students shall be liable to give an undertaking to this effect as per the regulations of respective university. Any candidate opting to forgo his seat mid-session/ before completing the course will have to pay the university charges to which the college is affiliated and bond money as laid down in the Surety Bond executed at the time of admission,

as applicable.

38. **Fee Structure**

The candidates will follow the fee structure as laid down by the University / existing Govt. of India regulations. Fees will not be refunded once admission process is completed.

39. **Amendments**

Amendments to the rules/ procedures governing admission may be carried out as per regulations laid down by the Govt of India/ NMC/ NDC/ DCI/ DGAFMS/ University from time to time and candidate will have to abide by such revised rules/ regulations/ policy.

2.2 That in the event the PG student either attains the age of 35 years as on 31 December of the year of successful completion of his/her PG course or refuses to accept commission in the Armed Forces Medical Services on successful completion of his/her PG course the PG student and the Surety shall jointly be liable to pay and refund forthwith to the Government of India on demand and without demur an amount of **Rs 60.5 Lakhs (Rupees Sixty Lakhs and Fifty Thousand only)** as per Govt of India letter No 17436/DGAFMS/DG-1D dated 15 Mar 2021 and No. 3569/DGAFMS/DG-1B(i)/389/21/D (Med) dt 19 Apr 2021 together with interest on the said money, calculated at the rates in force then. The interest will be calculated after 30 days from date of successful completion of PG course or from the designated date of joining the Armed Forces unit as per the posting order issued whichever is later.

2.3 That the PG student shall on successful completion of his/her PG degree course will report within such period, as may be allowed by the Director General Armed Forces Medical Services as joining time to the unit or station as specified in this behalf by the Director General Armed Forces Medical Services for grant of Short Service Commission on terms and conditions set out in Army Instruction 75/78 and as amended from time-to-time.

2.4 That the PG student after grant of short service commission, if applies for release from service within **Five years** of grant said commission for any reason whatsoever and provided his/ her release is sanctioned by the Govt of India, as per rules in force, he/ she shall be relieved only after he/ she has refunded Bond money at the rate of Rs. **12.1 Lakhs (Rupees Twelve Lakhs and Ten Thousand only)** per completed year or part thereof of unfulfilled liability limited to the Bond money as contained in the Bond agreement executed at the time of admission.

2.5 That if the PG student leaves the institution without completing the course due to any reason after the last date of admission to the PG course as specified by NMC/affiliated University, he/ she will be required to pay a sum of **Rs. 20,16,667/- (Rupees Twenty Lakhs Sixteen Thousand Six Hundred and Sixty Seven only)** per year or part thereof of the education at the institution based on extant rules subject to the conditions laid down in the subsequent paras.

2.6 That if the PG student will be declared to have become Non-Service Liability (NSL) on being rendered medically unfit for commission by a Medical Board due to any disease/disability detected at any stage during the training or prior to commissioning as under: -

2.6.1 The Medical Board will express their opinion on the circumstances under which the PG student acquired the diseases/ disability and whether or not he/she had any control over those circumstances. The three categories of PG student declared Non-Service Liability on medical grounds are as follows: -

2.6.1.1 Category- I

Declared medically unfit due to disease/ circumstances within their control like drug abuse, accidents, and injury in brawl/fights.

Such candidate will be liable to pay Bond Money as applicable to him/her before being allowed to continue further studies and will have to pay the cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the date declared NSL.

2.6.1.2 Category-II

Declared medically unfit due to disease/circumstances beyond their control, but are not related to service or training course he/she is undergoing. Such candidate will not be liable to pay Bond Money but will have to pay 50% of cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the date declared NSL.

2.6.1.3 Category-III

Declared medically unfit due to disease/circumstances beyond their control and are related to service or training course he/she is undergoing. In such cases Bond money and cost of training to be waived off. However, college/university fee and boarding and messing charges and hospital stoppage where applicable shall be levied.

2.6.2 Based on the above factors the Bond Money to be recovered is computed as under: -

2.6.2.1 No Bond Money will be recovered from the PG students who are declared unfit for Commissioning/ NSL on following medical grounds: -

2.6.2.1.1 Declared medically unfit due to disease/ circumstances beyond their control and are related to service or training course they are undergoing **(Category III)**.

2.6.2.1.2 Declared medically unfit due to disease/ circumstances beyond their control, but are not related to service or training course they are undergoing **(Category-II)**.

2.6.2.1.3 Due to disease/circumstances beyond their control and who do not refuse treatment but necessitating withdrawal from the College.

2.6.2.1.4 Due to death.

2.6.2.1.5 However, the PG students mentioned at Para 2.6.1.2 and 2.6.2.1.2 above (Category-II) may be permitted to continue their medical education on approval of Director General of Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS). They have to pay 50% of cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the day they are declared NSL. In addition, they will also be levied tuition fee and other charges including college fees, university fees, boarding and

messing charges and hospital stoppage where applicable from the day they are declared NSL.

The current cost of training is **Rs 36,551/- per week** and it may be revised in future based on training cost approved by the Govt of India. The cost of training is to be paid half yearly. Delay in payment beyond 30 days will invite interest and penal charges. PG students who cannot pay the further cost of training and other charges as specified by the Government or who do not wish to continue their education, consequent to being declared unfit for commissioning/ Non-Service Liability (NSL) on medical grounds or other circumstances, will be allowed to withdraw from the course.

2.6.2.2 PG students who are declared unfit for Commissioning/ NSL on Medical grounds/ circumstances other than those mentioned at Para 2.6.2.1 are liable to pay the Bond money as applicable to them before being allowed to continue further studies. These students may be allowed to continue their further medical education on approval of Director General of Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) and will have to pay the cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the date declared NSL. They will also be levied tuition fees and other charges including college fees, university fees boarding and messing charges and hospital stoppage whereas applicable from the day they are declared NSL.

2.7 That if the PG **(MD/MS/DNB)** student leaves the training institute voluntarily without completing the course due to any reason (other than medical grounds) after the permissible withdrawal period as governed by the prospectus, if any, will be liable to pay the amount of the Bond Money at a rate proportionate to the amount of time they have trained in the institute, limited to the total Bond money as contained in the Bond executed at the time of admission.

2.8 That if the PG **(MD/MS/DNB)** student rendered as Non Service Liability (NSL) due to reasons other than medical grounds (viz. indiscipline, failure to adhere to the stipulated code of conduct, violation of medical ethics etc.) will be removed from the College Rolls and will be liable to pay the Bond Money as applicable to student and will not be allowed to continue further studies.

Such candidate will be liable to pay Bond Money as applicable to him/her before being allowed to continue further studies and will have to pay the cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the date declared NSL.

2.6.1.2 Category-II

Declared medically unfit due to disease/circumstances beyond their control, but are not related to service or training course he/she is undergoing. Such candidate will not be liable to pay Bond Money but will have to pay 50% of cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the date declared NSL.

2.6.1.3 Category-III

Declared medically unfit due to disease/circumstances beyond their control and are related to service or training course he/she is undergoing. In such cases Bond money and cost of training to be waived off. However, college/university fee and boarding and messing charges and hospital stoppage where applicable shall be levied.

2.6.2 Based on the above factors the Bond Money to be recovered is computed as under: -

2.6.2.1 No Bond Money will be recovered from the PG students who are declared unfit for Commissioning/ NSL on following medical grounds: -

2.6.2.1.1 Declared medically unfit due to disease/ circumstances beyond their control and are related to service or training course they are undergoing (**Category III**).

2.6.2.1.2 Declared medically unfit due to disease/ circumstances beyond their control, but are not related to service or training course they are undergoing (**Category-II**).

2.6.2.1.3 Due to disease/circumstances beyond their control and who do not refuse treatment but necessitating withdrawal from the College.

2.6.2.1.4 Due to death.

2.6.2.1.5 However, the PG students mentioned at Para 2.6.1.2 and 2.6.2.1.2 above (Category-II) may be permitted to continue their medical education on approval of Director General of Armed Forces Medical Services. They have to pay 50% of cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the day they are declared NSL. In addition, they will also be levied tuition fee and other charges including college fees, university fees, boarding and messing charges and hospital stoppage where applicable from the day they are declared NSL.

The current cost of training is **Rs 33,470/- per week** and it may be revised in future based on training cost approved by the Govt of India. The cost of training is to be paid half yearly. Delay in payment beyond 30 days will invite interest and penal charges. PG students who cannot pay the further cost of training and other charges as specified by the Government or who do not wish to continue their education, consequent to being declared unfit for commissioning/ Non-Service Liability (NSL) on medical grounds or other circumstances, will be allowed to withdraw from the course.

2.6.2.2 PG students who are declared unfit for Commissioning/ NSL on Medical grounds/ circumstances other than those mentioned at Para 2.6.2.1 are liable to pay the Bond money as applicable to them before being allowed to continue further studies. These students may be allowed to continue their further medical education on approval of Director General of Armed Forces Medical Services (DGAFMS) and will have to pay the cost of training as applicable for further period of study from the date declared NSL. They will also be levied tuition fees and other charges including college fees, university fees boarding and messing charges and hospital stoppage whereas applicable from the day they are declared NSL.

2.7 That if the PG (**MDS**) student leaves the training institute voluntarily without completing the course due to any reason (other than medical grounds) after the permissible withdrawal period as governed by the prospectus, if any, will be liable to pay the amount of the Bond Money at a rate proportionate to the amount of time they have trained in the institute, limited to the total Bond money as contained in the Bond executed at the time of admission.

2.8 That if the PG (**MDS**) student rendered as Non Service Liability (NSL) due to reasons other than medical grounds (viz. indiscipline, failure to adhere to the stipulated code of conduct, violation of medical ethics etc.) will be removed from the College Rolls and will be liable to pay the Bond Money as applicable to student and will not be allowed to continue further studies.

2.9 Civilian students (Priority-V candidates of AFMS institutions) found to be medically unfit in the pre-commission medical examination due to any disease/ disability/pregnancy, will be reviewed by a medical board within six months of initial medical examination or within six months of delivery (in case of pregnancy) and if found fit, will be offered SSC. The candidate will report to his/ her parent teaching institute for such medical examination within six months of

initial medical examination or within six months of delivery. If the candidate fails to report to his/her parent teaching institute for medical examination within the stipulated time or fails to join on being declared fit and offered SSC, he/she will be liable to pay the full Bond money. If after review he/she is found medically unfit for commission due to disease/ circumstances within their control like drug abuse, accidents and injury in brawl/fights he/she would be liable to pay full Bond money as contained in bond executed at the time of admission, whereas, if after review he/she is found medically unfit for commission due to disease/ circumstances beyond their control, but are not related to service/ training course he/she is undergoing, he/she would be liable to pay 50% Bond money as contained in the bond executed at the time of admission. However, if the candidate is medically unfit due to disease/ circumstances beyond their control which are related to the service or training course, on which the decision of the DGAFMS would be final, in such cases the entire bond money may be waived off.

2.10 That if the PG (**MDS**) student who on completion of the course wants to be released from service liability before completion of the Liability period, provided the same is accepted by the Government, will be liable to pay the amount of the Bond Money at a rate proportionate to each complete year or part thereof of unfulfilled liability, limited to the total Bond Money as contained in the Bond or the total amount as contained in the undertaking executed at the time of admission.

2.11 That if the PG (**MDS**) student leaves the institution and refuses to fulfill any of the Bond conditions, his/her original documents will not be handed over until he/she pays the surety Bond money as applicable and any other dues decided by the Commandant of the AFMS PG institution.

3. The Terms and conditions mentioned in the agreement may get revised/ amended as per the directions of Govt of India as far as related to payment of Bond money in default of honoring this agreement. The SURETY will be liable to agree to the same. In case of dispute, the decision of Govt of India will be final and binding on the Sureties or either.

4. In the event of non compliance of the aforesaid clauses or failure on the part of Sureties to comply with the Bond, the sum due hereunder will be liable to be recovered as an arrear of Land Revenue.

5. Under no circumstances does the clauses mentioned under section 133 & 135 of the Indian Contract Act, 1872 or any other rule of law or equity as applicable on that behalf, any indulgence of forbearances shown by the Govt of India to the candidates whether with or without consent of the sureties or either shall not operate as discharge of the sureties' obligations under the said Bond.

6. NOW THE CONDITION OF THE OBLIGATION is such that the PG (**MDS**) student after grant of **Short Service Commission** serves for a period of **five years** or cause to

be paid to the Government the amount due to his/ her in contravention of the Bond agreement then this Bond shall be void, otherwise the same shall be and remain in full force.
