INTRODUCTION

1. Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) conducts Post Graduate training primarily for the doctors of the Armed Forces Medical Services so as to fulfill the specialist requirements. Surplus seats, if any, are offered to sponsored candidates of Friendly Foreign Countries, Para-military / other Govt. of India organizations, exservicemen (Ex-SSC AMC officers) and civilian doctors. The civilian doctors who get admission in post graduate courses at any AFMS institution shall be liable to serve as Short Service Commissioned Officer (SSC) for 05 years in AFMS.

AIM & OBJECTIVES

- 2. The courses are being conducted to fulfil the following requirements:-
 - (a) To meet the requirements of specialist cadre vacancies by training serving Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) officers.
 - (b) To meet the training requirements of foreign students sponsored by Govt of India.
 - (c) To offer PG courses to Medical Officers sponsored by Para-Military / other Govt. of India organization.
 - (d) To maintain a reserve pool of specialist officers by offering PG courses to Ex-SSC officers who are on the reserve lists of AFMS.
 - (e) To train civilian doctors to serve in AFMS and they will have to execute a bond to serve in AFMS for a period of 05 years as Short Service Commissioned Officers on successful completion of the post graduate course.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 3. Candidates may kindly note that appearance in NEET-PG does not confer any automatic rights to secure a Post graduate MD/MS seat in AFMS institution. Candidates who have registered for AFMS PG counseling on the MCC/DGHS(MoHFW) website only will be considered for PG seats at AFMS institutes through AFMS counseling subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility, medical fitness and any such criteria as may be prescribed by the respective universities, AFMS institutions, National Medical Council and State/Central Government.
- 4. Candidates producing false or fabricated information shall not be considered for admission in AFMS institutes.

- 5. Candidates should go through the Information Bulletin carefully before contacting the AFMS for any queries. Queries pertaining to eligibility and other issues shall only be entertained if the information requested is not given in this bulletin.
- 6. Instructions in the Information Bulletin are liable to changes based on decisions taken by the AFMS /NBE /NMC/ MoHFW from time to time. The candidate will have to fulfil all the criteria stipulated at the time of admission.
- 7. AFMS reserves the right to withdraw permission to participate in AFMS counseling, to any candidate who is not eligible to appear in the AFMS counseling.
- 8. Candidates' eligibility is purely provisional and is subject to the fulfilment of eligibility criteria as prescribed in this Information Bulletin.
- 9. The existing schedule, pattern, policy and guidelines are for ready reference only for admission for the year 2023.
- 10. In case of any ambiguity in interpretation of any of the instructions/ terms/ rules/ criteria regarding the determination of eligibility of candidates/ conduct of AFMS counseling/ information contained herein, the interpretation of the AFMS will be final and binding.
- 11. All the correspondence should preferably be addressed by e-mail. The e-mail query shall be addressed only if it contains NEET-PG Roll No. and contact telephone number of the sender. An e-mail containing vague or general queries that are contained in the Information Bulletin shall not be entertained. Queries shall not be entertained from person claiming themselves to be representative, associates or officiates of the applicant candidate.
- 12. Candidates are advised to visit the websites www.afmcdg1d.gov.in / www.mcc.nic.in regularly for information and notices pertaining to admission to PG courses at AFMS institutions for the year 2023.
- 13. Candidates may note that by registering for AFMS PG counseling on the MCC website, the candidate is deemed to have read, agreed and accepted the terms and conditions in the Information Bulletin of AFMS for admission to PG courses for year 2023.

NUMBER OF SEATS

- 14. The institution wise tentative number of seats available, in each speciality for the year 2023 session will be uploaded before the counseling. After fulfilling the AFMS requirements, remaining seats, if any will be available to candidates in order of Priority. The number of seats in AFMS institutions available in a particular year for admission may not tally with seats depicted on NMC or MCC website & will be governed by the existing recognized faculty / resources available, after approval of the Office of DGAFMS. It is also likely that no seat may be available for some of the priority categories.
- 15. The exact number of seats available along with their status as recognized/permitted by NMC in different AFMS institutes for the 2023 session, with their subject-wise break-up, will be displayed on the AFMS website before the commencement of counseling of that particular priority. Stipend/ Fee structure may vary from State wise and institution wise. Candidates are advised to visit the AFMS website regularly.

PRIORITY / CATEGORY FOR ADMISSION

- 16. Admissions for PG studies are strictly governed by Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No F/PC-8510/DGAFMS/DG-1/345/2013/D(Med) dated 6th March 2013. The admission and training is controlled by the Office of the DGAFMS in accordance with prevalent rules. The priority for admission of candidates is as follows:-
 - (a) Priority-I AFMS Officers detailed on advance specialist course/ PG courses.
 - (b) Priority-II Foreign students sponsored by Government On approval of DGAFMS/MoD/MEA subject to conditions laid down by the Govt. of India
 - (c) Priority–III Medical Officers sponsored by Para Military Organization / other Govt. of India organization. Sponsorship certificate mentioning the subjects for sponsorship, <u>duly countersigned by the sponsoring authority in respective ministry of Govt of India in which the individual is employed,</u> is mandatory requirement for the candidate to be considered for counseling.

- (d) Priority-IV Ex-SSC AMC Officers released from service after completion of contractual service and within three years after their release from service. The date of release should not be before 01 May 2020 or after the stipulated date of joining as notified by AFMS for the PG session 2023.
 - (i) SSC officers in their last year of initial contractual service and likely to finish the initial contractual service before registration on MCC website may appear under this category. They will have to produce their original release order and other documents as specified in our Information Bulletin at the time of counseling.
 - (ii) SSC officers in their extended contractual service may apply for this category subject to having submitted their application for release and NOC obtained from competent authority. At the time of admission to any college, they will have to produce documentary proof of their attaining Ex-SSC status without which they will not be considered for admission to the college.
 - (iii) SSC officers who have voluntarily withdrawn/ being removed from PG course on medical grounds, while in service are eligible to pursue PG courses as Priority-IV candidates in AFMS institutes.
 - (iv) SSC officers who have resigned their commission /dismissed /removed from service/ not completed their initial contractual service/ being removed from PG course on disciplinary grounds, while in service are NOT ELIGIBLE as Priority-IV candidates. Such officers are also not eligible as Priority-V candidates.
- (e) Priority-V Civilian candidates willing to serve in the Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) subject to their fulfilling the eligibility criteria mentioned at para 18. It may be noted that offering of PG seats to civilian candidates as Priority V is with sole objective to meet the specialist requirement of the Armed Forces Medical Services. Civilian candidates will have to submit a bond agreement to pay an amount as sanctioned by the Govt. of India at the time of allotment of PG seat, in case they are

unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission. They also have to be medically fit as per the standards required for commission in the AFMS at the time of admission. Officers of the AFMS who have resigned their commission/dismissed/ removed from service/ not completed their initial contractual service/ being removed from PG course on disciplinary grounds while in service as SSC officers are not eligible to be considered even as Priority-V candidates, though they may fulfill the age criteria.

17. Candidates desirous of admission to postgraduate courses in AFMS institutions shall appear in the NEET-PG 2023 and secure minimum qualifying score as indicated by NBE to be eligible for AFMS counseling. Candidates have to register on MCC website for AFMS PG Counseling, after securing minimum qualifying score as indicated by NBE in NEET-PG 2023 and shall produce the necessary documents, to participate in the AFMS counseling.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRIORITY-V (CIVILIAN) CANDIDATES

- 18. The age criteria is as mentioned under:-
 - (a) Maximum permissible age for Priority V candidates shall be less than 30 years as on 31 Dec 2023 (i.e date of birth is on or after 01 Jan 1994) to fulfill the service liability as mentioned here under.
 - (b) The candidate shall be liable to serve the Armed Forces Medical Service (AFMS) for 05 years on successful completion of PG Course subject to fulfilling other eligibility criteria. Candidate will have to execute a bond agreement as per Appx 'B' at the time of admission, to pay a sum of Rs. 56,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Six Lakhs only) for the session 2023-26 to Govt of India, in case unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission on completion of the course.
 - (c) A candidate who fails to complete the course successfully before crossing 35 years of age as on 31 Dec 2026 **WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE** for commission in the Armed Forces and rendered Non Service Liability (NSL). Such candidates will be liable to pay the **bond money** to the Gol as applicable to them.

(d) Civilian candidates (Priority V) will have to undergo medical examination by duly constituted medial board at the time of admission, so as to assess their fitness for commissioning as per laid down criteria and will be admitted only if found **MEDICALLY FIT**.

OTHER ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- 19. The following eligibility criteria shall be applicable:-
 - (a) Admission to the postgraduate medical courses at AFMS institutions, subject to the priorities laid down in the prospectus is open to graduates of medical colleges recognized by National Medical Commission and who have registered themselves as Registered Medical Practitioners with any State Medical Council recognized by NMC. Students who have completed / are completing internship on or before 11 Aug 2023 as notified by NBE are eligible to apply. However, the Provisional Registration Certificate / Permanent Registration Certificate should be available at the time of admission.
 - (b) The candidate must be a **citizen of India** (except Priority-II candidates).
 - (c) Priority-II (Friendly Foreign Candidates) sponsored by the Government and approved by the DGAFMS should have passed their MBBS / equivalent examination (Authority: Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No F/PC- 8510/DGAFMS/DG-1/345/2013/D(Med) dated 6th March 2013) and also qualified NEET-PG 2023. As per NMC guidelines, Priority-II candidates are required to apply for temporary registration in NMC under NMC Act.
 - (d) A candidate shall not be eligible if he / she has cancelled or failed to report for admission in the past which has resulted in lapse of a seat.
 - (e) A candidate who is already pursuing any PG course/ holding a PG degree from any medical institutions shall not be eligible for admission to PG course in AFMS institutions.

- (f) The number of candidates to be admitted in any discipline during the academic session 2023 2026 will be determined by the number of post-graduate teachers available, the student-teacher ratio and any other criteria laid down by the Board of Governors in suppression of NMC and affiliated University from time-to-time. However, the exact number of available seats in each priority will be displayed before the commencement of counseling for that particular Priority.
- (g) Any Priority III candidate leaving the allotted seat after conclusion of AFMS PG counseling will have to submit an application duly signed by competent authority of the Sponsoring Organization. Any such application requesting to leave the seat without recommendation of the sponsoring authority will not be accepted.
- (h) The liabilities of leaving an allotted seat in respect of any candidates in any priority on conclusion of the counseling will be as per the MCC Policy. Any candidate leaving a seat mid-session after the commencement of course for which the seat gets wasted will not be considered eligible to participate in the AFMS counseling in the next session and will be liable to pay the University charges to which the college is affiliated and bond money as laid down in the Surety Bond executed at the time of admission.

METHODOLOGY FOR APPLYING

- 20. The following methodology will be adopted by candidates:-
 - (a) All candidates seeking admission to any of the institutions of the AFMS will have to mandatorily appear in the NEET- PG 2023.
 - (b) All candidates will have to register and opt for AFMS on the Medical Counseling Committee website www.mcc.nic.in to be eligible for AFMS PG counseling.
 - (c) A copy of the printed registration slip / printout of the registration details page should be kept safely by the candidate to be produced at the time of counseling.
 - (d) Invitation of application in respect of Priority-III & Priority-IV candidates who have successfully registered on the MCC website after securing minimum qualifying score or more marks as indicated by NBE in NEET-PG 2023 and desirous of taking admission into PG courses in AFMS institutions

will be notified on our official website www.afmc.nic.in Merit list of the eligible Priority-III & IV candidates will be published on the same website.

- (e) The AFMS rounds of counseling will be as per the MCC PG counseling.
- (f) <u>List of certificates to be submitted in original by the selected candidates at the college on the day of admission:</u>
 - (i) 06 (Six) Passport size photographs
 - (ii) NEET-PG 2023 Admit card and printed copy of the DGHS website registration slip.
 - (iii) NEET-PG 2023 rank card allotted by NBE.
 - (iv) Class X / SSLC / ICSE certificate as valid certificate of proof of age.
 - (v) Nationality Certificate/ Xerox copy of valid passport /Domicile Certificate (where applicable)/ Birth Certificate endorsed with **INDIAN** nationality on it.
 - (vi) First to Final year MBBS Mark Sheets of respective university.
 - (vii) MBBS Pass Certificate / Degree Certificate.
 - (viii) Internship Completion Certificate.
 - (ix) Permanent / Provisional State Medical Council registration certificate.
 - (x) Attempt Certificate.
 - (xi) Transfer Certificate / Migration certificate
 - (xii) Educational Gap affidavit, if any
 - (xiii) Allotment letter which will be provided at the time of AFMS PG counseling
 - (xiv) **Priority III candidates** (Para-Military Officers / other Govt of India Org): Subject-specific sponsorship certificate (as per format placed at **Appx 'A'**) issued by the respective Para-Military / other Govt of India organization <u>duly signed by the Competent Authority in the respective ministry of Govt of India in which the individual is <u>permanently employed</u>. This has to be produced at the time of counseling without which candidate shall not be allowed to attend the</u>

counseling. During counseling, eligible candidates will be considered eligible for only those subjects, which are mentioned in their sponsorship certificate duly signed by competent authority in the respective ministry of Govt of India in which the individual is permanently employed. Ink signed copy of the sponsorship certificate will be required to be deposited at the time of admission to the respective AFMS Institution.

- (xv) **Priority IV candidates** Release order from Armed Forces Medical Services and movement order from last unit for proceeding on release and NOC in case of SSC Officers in their last year of initial contractual service/ extended contractual service.
- (xvi) Declaration by the candidate is placed at **Appx 'B'**.

Applicants without the above documents will be summarily rejected.

(xvii) Candidates are directed to submit the above documents as hard copy and scanned soft copy on a CD at the time of admission.

Admission of any candidate found to be giving wrong information will be summarily rejected at any stage of the admission process by the Commandant of the institution where a seat has been allotted finally. The decision of the Commandant will be final.

COUNSELING SESSION

- 21. Counseling for allocation of subjects will be held as described below :-
 - (a) Priority-wise online counseling will be held based on candidates' meritcum-choice except Priority-V whose counseling will be held at AFMC, Pune in person.
 - (b) The seat matrix will be displayed at the time of counseling.
 - (c) Counseling for Priority-I candidates will be followed by all other priorities. **ONLY** those vacancies which remain vacant after filling of the seats by the serving officers and foreign sponsored candidates will be available for allotment to other priorities. These seats will be filled in the order of priority and merit cum choice.
 - (d) All candidates are requested to watch the AFMS website www.afmcdg1d.gov.in / www.afmc.nic.in for updates regularly for schedule of counseling.

- (e) Eligibility of a candidate will be the responsibility of the candidate themselves as per the criteria mentioned in the Information Bulletin. He / She should check his / her eligibility for Priority/ Institution/ subject before participating in the counseling process.
- (f) The candidates who have been issued the admission letter shall produce all the originals certificates for verification as applicable. Candidates without documents in original at the time of admission will not be eligible for admission to the college even if he / she has got the necessary merit.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 22. Admission procedure shall be as follows:-
 - (a) Admission to PG courses at AFMS institutions is provisional subject to confirmation / ratification by the Office of DGAFMS & University concerned. The selected candidates are required to submit additional documents/ certificates as per specific requirement of the institute/ University. Candidates should ascertain these details from the Dean Academics of the Institute.
 - (b) Decision of Commandant of the college shall be final and binding.
 - (c) All candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Cards of the NEET-PG 2023 and NEET Rank card till allotment of the seats and admission to the institution.
 - (d) The Priority-V (civilian) candidates participating in AFMS PG counseling will have to report AFMC, Pune before cut off time on the designated date which will be intimated before the counseling through our official website for initiation of admission procedure.
 - (e) <u>Medical examination of civilian (Priority V) candidates</u>: This is a mandatory requirement for all civilian (Priority V) candidates. The medical standards required for civilian candidates are those applicable for selection as commissioned officers in Armed Forces Medical Services. Admission to PG courses shall only be given to those civilian doctors who are found medically fit for commission by a designated Medical Board as per laid down medical standards for commissioning. For reference of the candidates, the medical parameters are available at www.indianarmy.nic.in and same are also available on DGAFMS website (www.afmc.nic.in).

will not be admitted to any of the AFMS institutes. There is a provision of appeal / review for any candidate who has been found to be medically unfit by a Board of Medical Officers as per directions of the O/o DGAFMS. If the candidate wishes to appeal, he / she should apply to the Commandant, AFMC, Pune by 1800h on the day of being declared medically unfit. The decision of the Appeal Medical Board will be final. There is NO provision for medical examination / board of any other nature after a candidate has been declared unfit by the Appeal Medical Board. There is no provision for declaring a candidate temporary unfit. Candidates finally declared unfit, will not be considered for admission. No seat will be kept pending on account of the candidate wishing to undergo treatment (Medical / Surgical) for a disease/ disability for which he / she is made unfit.

BOND AGREEMENT

23. All Priority-V (civilian) candidates are offered remaining seats in AFMS institutions with the sole objective to fulfil service requirements of specialist doctors. Therefore, all civilian candidates, if selected, are required to execute a bond agreement to serve as Short Service Commissioned (SSC) Officers for 5 years with the AFMS or pay an amount as sanctioned by the Govt. of India at the time of admission in case they are unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission. All Civilian students joining AFMS institutions for Postgraduate Degree (MD/MS) course from the session commencing will have to execute a Bond of Rs. 56 Lakhs (Rupees Fifty-six lakhs) (Authority: Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No.17436/DGAFMS/DG-1D/334/21/D(Med) dated 15th Mar, 2021). The bond is to be executed on a Rs.500/- non judicial stamp paper and registered / notarized with office of sub-registrar and submitted on the day of admission. Expenses in connection with registration of Bond Agreement are to be borne by the respective candidate. The conditions in which the civilian candidates are not eligible to join the AFMS as SSC Officers are laid down in the Surety Bond which will be executed at the time of admission.

DISCIPLINE

- 24. PG students are expected to conduct themselves in a befitting manner as follows:-
 - (a) Any candidate found obstructing or trying to influence the counseling and or admission process in an unlawful manner/ creating nuisance shall be liable for disqualification for the process of admission. Canvassing directly or indirectly for allotment of seat would disqualify the candidates for admission on the basis of the entrance examination. Influencing the staff by unfair means shall lead to the cancellation of allotment of seat and such a candidate is liable to face disqualification from the appearance in counseling in subsequent years. The decision taken by the authorities in this respect shall be final and binding.
 - (b) All candidates selected for admission shall be subject to the disciplinary rules of the College, University and the Govt of India.
 - (c) Post graduate students of the institute will not indulge in ragging. In the instance of any incidence of ragging coming to the notice of the college authorities, the accused student will be given an opportunity to explain and if his explanation is not satisfactory the student will be expelled from the institute. All students will be required to furnish an undertaking annually stating that they have understood relevant regulations/ instructions regarding ragging and that if found guilty shall be liable for administrative action.

LEGAL JURISDICTION

25. Disputes, if any, with regard to any matter referred to herein shall be subjected to the arbitration and in that event, arbitrator will be decided by the DGAFMS. However, fees of the arbitrator will be paid by both the parties.

GENERAL

- 26. The following aspects will be applicable:-
 - (a) <u>Stipend</u> Selected <u>candidates under Priority IV and V only shall be</u> <u>paid Stipend</u>, as applicable as per respective university/ state rules. Details of the institutions are available and placed at **Appx 'C'**.
 - (b) <u>Accommodation</u> No accommodation will be provided to Priority IV and V candidate as per Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No F/PC-8510/DGAFMS/DG-1/345/2013/D/(Med) dated 06 March 2013.

- (c) <u>Security Deposit</u> All selected candidate who opt to join the course at AFMS institution (except serving officers) will have to deposit Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) as security deposit by DD in favour of Commandant of the AFMS institution where he / she has accepted the seat. The same is refundable after completion of course.
- (d) <u>Non-Completion of Degree / Diploma</u> Once registered, the candidate is expected to complete the Degree Course of the respective University. The students shall be liable to give an undertaking to this effect as per the regulations of respective University. Any candidate opting to forgo his seat mid-session/ before completing the course will have to pay the university charges to which the college is affiliated and bond money as laid down in the Surety Bond executed at the time of admission.
- (e) <u>Discipline</u> All candidates are expected to be well turned out, polite, courteous, disciplined and sincere and will follow the rules of the college. The college reserves the right to prematurely terminate the course of a candidate in case of repeated breaches, or a major breach of discipline by him/her. Registration once granted is valid only if the Head of the Dept and Commandant of the Institute are satisfied about regularity and diligent pursuit of the studies by the student as well as good conduct and discipline befitting the institution and the University. The Commandant in consultation with the Officer I/C Training and Head of the Department may recommend to the University for removal/ withdrawal of registration of a Postgraduate student for irregularity and or misconduct.
- (f) <u>Fee Structure</u> The candidates will follow the fee structure as laid down by the University / existing Govt. of India regulations. Fees will not be refunded once admission is completed.
- (g) Amendments Amendments to the rules / procedures for admission may be carried out as per regulations laid down by the Govt of India/ NMC /DGAFMS / University from time to time and candidate will have to abide by such rules/ regulations/ policy.
