**AACCC-UG e-Counseling Scheme for Admission to All India Quota seats of BAMS/BSMS /BUMS/ BHMS under Govt. /Govt. Aided/ Central Universities (CU)/National Institutes (NI)/Deemed University (DU) and of B. Pharm(Ay) Seats under ITRA, Jamnagar for the A. Y. 2024-25**

### DISCLAIMER

- a) It is assumed that every participating candidate of AACCC-UG Counseling has read, agreed, and accepted the Scheme and terms & conditions of the AACCC-UG counseling-2024.
- b) All Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) are mandatory and not optional. Candidates are advised to review these important questions before registering on the AACCC website (<https://aaccc.gov.in>).
- c) The candidate shall fill out the application form online (<https://aaccc.gov.in>), preferably on their own, for AACCC-UG Counseling-2024. Application submitted through any other mode shall be summarily rejected.
- d) While registering on the AACCC-UG portal, all candidates are advised to use the same mobile number/e-mail ID they submitted during registration for the NEET (UG)-2024 examination.
- e) The candidate should ensure that all the information filled in during the online registration/application form is correct and factual. The data entered by the candidate during registration on the NTA portal for NEET(UG) 2024 will be pre-populated, and the same data is used for AACCC-counseling purposes. The AACCC, M/o Ayush shall not entertain, under any circumstances, any request to change/modify/edit/alter the information provided by the candidates.
- f) Candidates can submit the AACCC-UG counseling registration/application form only once. Candidates who submit more than one registration/application form shall be debarred, and further action as deemed appropriate by the AACCC, M/o Ayush, shall be taken.
- g) Registration facility shall be available at the beginning of the 1<sup>st</sup> Round, 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, 3<sup>rd</sup> Round & Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I) as specified in the Counseling Schedule. Further, any request (for any reason) for registration shall not be entertained after the closing of registration. **Fresh registration is available during the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I) for the A.Y. 2024-25.**
- h) Conditions when counselling fees are forfeited:
  - (i) R-2 non-joined/ joined candidates who avail exit with forfeiture.
  - (ii) Candidate does not join the allotted seat in the 3rd Round/ Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & SVR-II)
  - (iii) Candidate does not join the upgraded seat from Round-1, and Round-2 admitted seats.
  - (iv) If the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration based on which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting.
  - (v) Not upgraded candidate of Round-1 resigns from his joined seat after the announcement of the R-2 final result
  - (vi) Candidate resigns his/her joined seat through offline mode after the completion of counseling.
  - (vii) Non-compliance with the AACCC-UG counseling scheme 2024.

- (viii) Candidates withdraw their admitted seats allotted through SVR-DU
- i) The Admission Authority will cancel the admission of the candidate who provided wrong information during registration and fails to produce the required original documents at the time of admission. If it is discovered at any stage that a candidate has used a false/fake/incorrect document at the time of admission, then such candidate shall be excluded from all admission processes and in case, such candidate has already been given admission, the admission shall stand cancelled.
- j) In case, the joined candidates of R-1 whose seats have not been upgraded in R-2 OR joined (allotted/upgraded) candidates of R-2 decided to exit from the institute, in that case:
- If they withdraw the seat till 3 days prior to the commencement of 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, the counseling fee will be forfeited.
  - If they withdraw the seat between 3 days prior to the commencement of 3<sup>rd</sup> Round and till the R-3 final result announcement (excluding the result date), the counseling fee will be forfeited and become ineligible for AACCC-UG counseling for the A.Y 2024-25.
  - If they withdraw the seat from the announcement of R-3 final result, the counseling fee will be forfeited, and they become ineligible for any AYUSH UG counseling (Central/State/UT) for the A.Y 2024-25.
- k) The reserved vacant (virtual and provisional seat matrix) AIQ (Govt. /Govt. Aided /CU/ NI) seats that published before 3<sup>rd</sup> Round will be converted during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of counseling as per the algorithm placed at **Chapter-4** only if the reserved seats are not opted by any candidates/non- availability of candidates of that particular category in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round. Further, unreserved category candidates cannot claim the reserved seats shown to them as a virtual vacancy if the candidate of that particular category chooses the same seat.
- l) Once a candidate is allotted a seat in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round or Stray Vacancy Round (1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> Allotment), he/she will not be allowed to exit from the admitted/allotted seat. If the candidate does so, he/she will not be eligible for any AYUSH-UG counseling (Central/State/UT), and the counseling fees of such candidates will be forfeited. Further, a list of such ineligible candidates will be circulated to concerned State/UT counseling authorities, National Institutes/ Central Universities/ Deemed Universities to prohibit them from participating in other AYUSH-UG counseling.
- m) Candidate may kindly note that merely registering for AACCC-UG Counseling-2024 does not confer automatic rights to secure an Undergraduate [BAMS/BSMS/ BUMS/BHMS/B. Pharm(Ay)]. AACCC, MoA does not allot any seat either on nomination basis or manually. The selection and admission in any of ASU & H Institutions, recognized for running UG courses as per NCISM Act, 2020 & NCH Act, 2020, is subject to the fulfilment of the merit, admission criteria, eligibility as prescribed by the respective Universities, ASU&H institutions, NCISM, NCH, Central/State Government. The selection and admission to AIQ seats of B. Pharm (Ay) course, ITRA shall be as per the relevant Regulations laid under the ITRA Act 2020. AACCC, M/o Ayush, shall not approve any admissions in contravention of the eligibility criteria specified for the courses.
- n) The information placed on the AACCC portal regarding fee structure/stipend/bond amount/rendering of service in rural or tribal areas/ hostel/ food/ other conditions has been provided by concerned Ayurveda /Siddha/ Unani/Homoeopathy Colleges. The

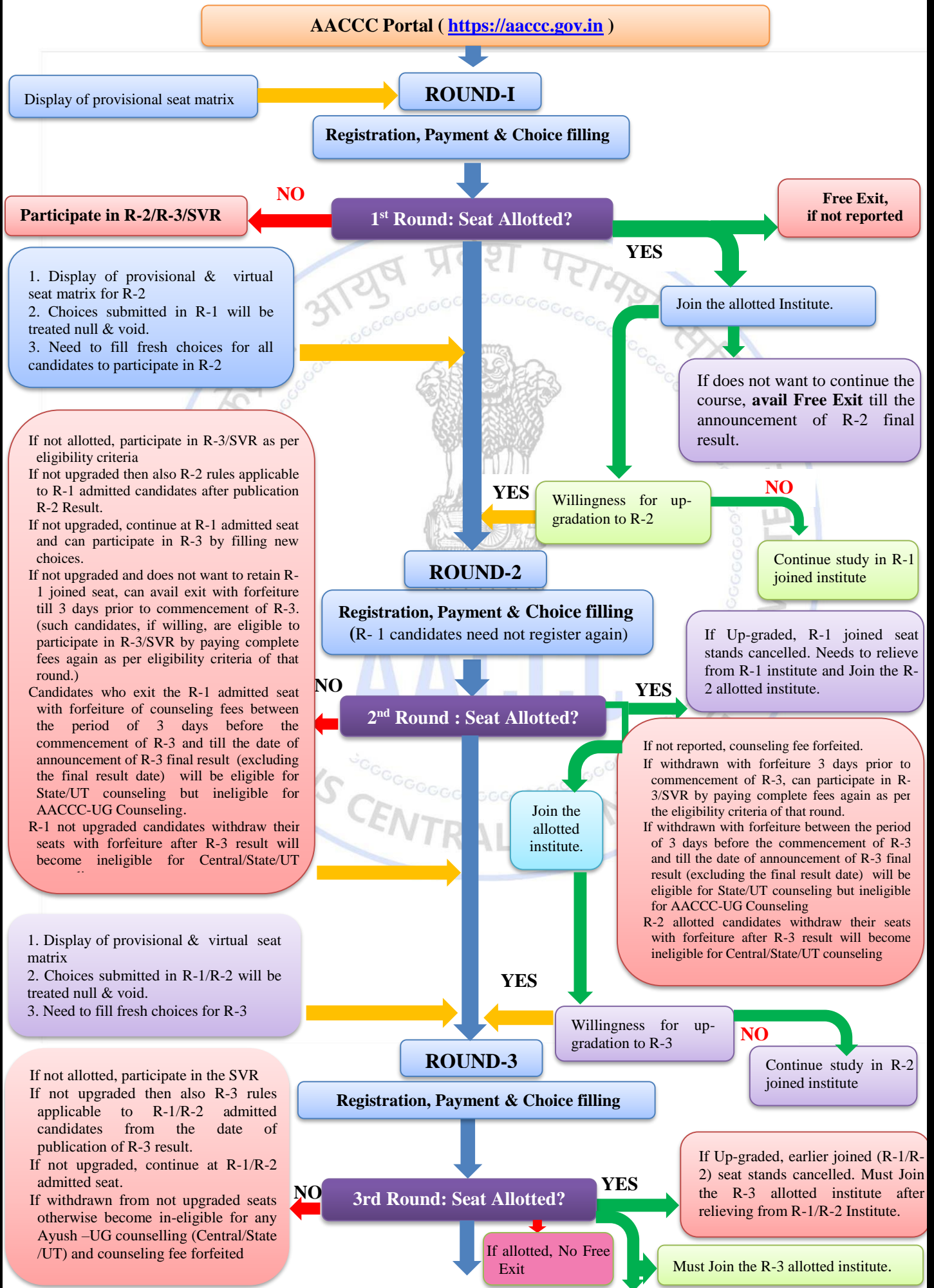
AACCC, M/o Ayush, shall not take responsibility for the information provided by the participating institutes. Hence, Candidates are advised to visit the College website or contact the College Authorities directly for any query regarding the above information before filling choices. Once locked, the choices cannot be modified, and any request regarding tinkering choices will not be entertained by AACCC, M/o Ayush.

- o) Candidates are advised to confirm the fee structure/ any other additional fee from the colleges especially Deemed Universities, before filling up the choices. Some colleges/institutes might have a high fee structure; therefore, accurate information about the fee should be made beforehand. The AACCC, M/o Ayush takes no responsibility for the fee structure of the colleges and will not entertain any request or complaint regarding the Fee Structure.
- p) Counseling for All India Quota-UG (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) seats of Private ASU&H Institutes will be conducted by respective State/UT counseling authority; hence, the candidates are required to contact the concerned State-UT Counseling/Admission Authority for the same.
- q) Candidates are advised to visit the AACCC website (<https://aaccc.gov.in>) regularly for updates on Schedule / Results / Notices / Refund of security money etc.
- r) **All admissions will be made through online mode only**; therefore, candidates are advised to ask for an online-generated 'Provisional Admission Letter' at the time of physical reporting at the allotted institute to ensure that the college has admitted him/her through online mode.
- s) The AACCC, M/o Ayush, **will not entertain** the admission/relieving/withdrawal/cancellation made **through offline mode** by the college under any circumstances. If such action is noticed, it will be considered non-compliance with the AACCC-Counseling scheme 2024, and appropriate action shall be taken. Hence, all candidates are advised to ensure their admission/relieving/withdrawal/ cancellation is made **through AACCC-Portal only**.
- t) Some institutes reserved all their seats of permitted intake capacity for minority categories such as Jain Minority (JM), Muslim Minority (MM), Hindi Linguistic (HL), etc. Only students of that respective category are eligible for admission to such institutes.
- u) **The AACCC, M/o Ayush, has no role in Counseling for Central Government Nominee (CGN) seats and Foreign Quota seats of ASU&H colleges and 20% reserved seats and Foreign Quota seats of B. Pharm (Ay) ITRA, Jamnagar.**
- v) The role of AACCC, M/o Ayush is limited to the allotment of seats to the registered candidates, as per their merit and choices, based on the data/Information of qualified candidates received from the National Testing Agency(NTA), i.e. the NEET (UG)-2024 examination conducting body.
- w) The security amount will be refunded to the bank account/credit card from which the payment has been made by the candidates on the AACCC-UG portal.

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**CHAPTER-1  
INTRODUCTION**

Ayush Admissions Central Counseling Committee (AACCC) of the Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India, New Delhi conducts Online Counseling for allotment of AIQ-Undergraduate [(BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS)] seats of Ayurveda/ Siddha/Unani/ Homoeopathy under Govt. /Govt. Aided/Central Universities/National Institutes/Deemed Universities to the NEET (UG) qualified eligible candidates since 2019. For the academic year 2024-25, the allotment of seats is based on the candidate's merit in the NEET (UG)-2024 Examination conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). Further, for the A.Y 2024-25, M/o Ayush has decided to include the AIQ seats of B. Pharm (Ay) ITRA, Jamnagar, in the AACCC-UG counseling and the allotment for the said seats is based on the candidate's merit in the NEET (UG)-2024 as per the eligibility conditions in the relevant Regulations laid down under ITRA Act 2020.

**The AIQ seats\* coming under AACCC-UG Counseling 2024:**

- i. 15% All India Quota UG (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) Seats of Govt./Govt. Aided Institute of all States/UTs
- ii. 100% BAMS Seats of BHU, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh
- iii. 100% BAMS Seats of ITRA, Jamnagar, Gujarat (except nominated seats)
- iv. 100% BAMS seats of NIA, Jaipur, Rajasthan (except nominated seats)
- v. 100% BAMS seats of NIA, Panchkula
- vi. 100% BHMS seats of NIH, Kolkata, West Bengal (except nominated seats)
- vii. 100% UG (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) Seats of all Deemed Universities
- viii. 100% BSMS seats of NIS, Chennai (except nominated seats)
- ix. 50% BAMS seats of AIIA, Goa
- x. 50% BUMS seats of AMU, Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh

**CHAPTER-2**  
**COUNSELING TYPES & ROUNDS**

**15% AIQ OF GOVT/GOVT-AIDED ASU&H COLLEGES**

- The AACCC, M/o Ayush will conduct four rounds of counseling for admission to 15% AIQ seats through online mode: i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> Round, 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, and Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II).
- The seats that remain vacant after 3<sup>rd</sup> Round will continue to be filled in the online Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & SVR-II) of AACCC-UG counseling.

**AIQ OF ASU&H CENTRAL UNIVERSITIES / NATIONAL INSTITUTES**

- The AACCC, M/o Ayush, will conduct four rounds of counseling for admission to AIQ seats under Central Universities and National Institutes through online mode: i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> Round, 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, and Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II).
- The seats that remain vacant after 3<sup>rd</sup> Round will continue to be filled in the online Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & SVR-II) of AACCC-UG counseling.

**100% AIQ OF AU&H DEEMED UNIVERSITY**

- There will be four rounds of counseling, i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> Round, 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, and Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-DU).
- Three rounds will be conducted online by the AACCC, M/o Ayush, i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> Round, 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Round.
- After 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, AACCC, M/o Ayush will forward the list of registered eligible and ineligible candidates to the respective Deemed Universities for smooth admission process in the online Stray Vacancy round (SVR-DU) through the AACCC-UG portal. Only registered candidates who opt for 'Deemed Universities' in the 'Selection of Counseling' on the AACCC-UG portal are eligible for the Stray Vacancy Round.
- **All UG seats of Deemed Universities are domicile-free and un-reserved, i.e., the reservation policy of Central Govt. is not applicable.**

**AIQ OF B. PHARM (AY) ITRA, JAMNAGAR, GUJARAT**

- NEET (UG) 2024 qualified candidates are eligible for Admission to B. Pharm (Ay.)
- The AACCC, M/o Ayush will conduct four rounds of counseling for admission to AIQ seats of B. Pharm (Ay) ITRA through online mode: i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> Round, 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, and Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II).

CHAPTER-3

B. PHARM (AYURVEDA), ITRA, JAMNAGAR, GUJARAT

**Introduction on Course:**

The Institute of Teaching and Research in Ayurveda (ITRA) conducts the undergraduate programme, Bachelor of Pharmacy (Ayurveda), which deals with the manufacturing of authentic, quality-controlled, and quality-assured Ayurveda products. The counseling and admission to this course is as per the relevant regulations under ITRA Act 2020.

**Availability and distribution of seats:**

The availability of seats for a particular academic year will be as per the permission letter issued by the institute. Maximum twenty per cent. Seats of the total intake capacity for the B. Pharma (Ayurveda) programme is reserved for the Diploma of Pharmacy (D. Pharma) degree holders. Two seats shall be reserved for foreign national candidates. The remaining seats are reserved for the candidates who qualified the NEET-UG examination and the counseling for admission to these seats shall be through AACCC-UG counseling based on the All India common NEET(UG) merit list.

**Reservation policy:**

Reservation for different categories (i.e. SC, ST, OBC, EWS and PwBD) shall be as per the orders and instructions issued by the Central Government at the time of admission. For details regarding the submission of certificates for the counseling/admission process; please refer to **FAQ 30 to FAQ 33**.

**Eligible criteria for Admission**

- (a) The candidate shall have passed the intermediate (10+2) or its equivalent examination from any examination board with the Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English and have obtained minimum of fifty per cent. marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology in the case of General category and forty per cent. marks in the case of the SC, ST and OBC. For persons with disability, candidate specified under the RPwD Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in the said examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be forty-five per cent. in the case of General category and forty per cent. in the case of the SC, ST and OBC.
- (b) To consider for admission to the Bachelor of Pharmacy (Ayurveda) degree programme for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain a minimum fifty percentile in the NEET for Under Graduate programme held for the said academic year. For candidates belonging to the SC, ST and OBC, the minimum marks shall be at 40<sup>th</sup> percentile. For candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the RPwD Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45<sup>th</sup> percentile in the case of General category and 40<sup>th</sup> percentile in the case of the SC, the ST and OBC.

## CHAPTER-4 RESERVATION POLICY

Reservation Policy of the Central Government for counseling & admission to All India Quota seats of ASU & H streams under Govt./Govt. Aided/National Institutes/Central Universities and of B. Pharm(Ay) ITRA, Jamnagar is as follows:

- S.C.- 15%
- S.T.- 7.5%

The benefit of reservation will be given only to those castes and tribes that are mentioned in the respective central list of corresponding states published by the Government of India. (websites: <https://socialjustice.gov.in> and <https://ncst.nic.in>).

- OBC-NCL- 27% (Non-Creamy Layer as per the current updated central list of OBCs <http://www.ncbc.nic.in> ; OBCs present in the state list but not covered in the Central list of OBCs are NOT eligible to claim the reservation under All India Quota. The criteria for the Non-Creamy Layer (OBC-NCL) will be as per the notification of the Government of India)

Candidates belonging to the **Creamy Layer** of OBC are **NOT** entitled to reservation. Such candidates are treated as belonging to the general (GEN), i.e. unreserved category, and they will be eligible only for the OPEN seats – the seats for which all candidates are eligible.

- GEN-EWS- 10% (The benefit of reservation will be given only to those General category candidates who satisfy the conditions prescribed in the prevailing norms and/or notifications issued by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment/Govt. of India.)
- PwBD- 5% (as per relevant Regulations under NCISM/NCH Act 2020) Candidates with at least 40% impairment, irrespective of the type of disability, i.e., locomotor, visual or SEVERE dyslexic, shall be eligible for the benefits of the PwBD category. Further, Leprosy-cured candidates who are otherwise fit to pursue the courses also included in this category. Candidates who want to avail of 5% PwBD reservation in AIQ-UG seats of Govt./Govt. Aided/Central/National ASU & H institutions and B. Pharm (Ay), ITRA Jamnagar should obtain a Disability Certificate (i.e., **online generated PwBD certificate from the MCC portal**) as per 21 Benchmark Disabilities given under RPwD Act 2016 from the designated Disability Centers as per the list enclosed in **ANNEXURE- II**. **The format of the online generated PwBD certificate from the MCC portal is attached in Annexure-I. The certificate issued by any other hospital/board will not be accepted.**

The category of candidates as provided by NTA in the **NEET(UG) 2024** result database is used for the AACCC-UG counseling process. **The requests of candidates to change the category will NOT be entertained.**

Candidates must note that the benefit of reservation will be given to them subject to verification of documents. If it is found at any stage that a candidate has used a false / fake / incorrect document, or has furnished false, incorrect or incomplete information, in order to avail the benefit of reservation, then such a candidate shall be excluded from all admission processes. In case such a candidate has already been given admission, the admission shall stand cancelled.

The reserved All India Quota vacant (virtual & Provisional) seats of ASU &H streams under Govt./Govt. Aided/National Institutes/Central Universities and of B. Pharm (Ay) ITRA that published after the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round will be converted during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of counseling as per the following centrally approved conversion algorithm, only if the reserved seat is not opted by any candidate/non-availability of candidate of that particular category in 3<sup>rd</sup> Round. Further, candidates of the unreserved category cannot claim the reserved seats shown to them as a virtual vacancy if the same seat is opted by the candidate of that particular category. The NRI quota seats under Deemed Universities also shall be converted to Management Quota seats during 3<sup>rd</sup> round, If the Deemed Universities inform their willingness for the same in advance.

**COUNSELING SCHEME-2024**

**IMPORTANT**

- ❖ NEET (UG) - 2024 qualified candidates are required to register on the AACCC website (<https://aaccc.gov.in/>) to participate in the AACCC-UG counseling 2024.
- ❖ Candidates are advised to use the same E-mail address and Mobile Number for registration on the AACCC-UG portal for Counseling which was submitted during NEET-UG, 2024 Registration.
- ❖ All the information/ communication will be sent by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush on the registered E-mail or registered Mobile Number only.
- ❖ Any request regarding change of registered mobile number or email address shall not be entertained by the AACCC, Ministry of Ayush.
- ❖ Candidates are advised to use a Laptop or Computer with the latest registered version of Chrome/Internet Explorer/Firefox/Windows/IOS during the Registration and Choice-Filling process to avoid any technical complications.
- ❖ Be extremely careful while registering in the AACCC-UG Portal. Your allotment will be as per the information provided at the time of registration.
- ❖ Candidates are advised to download 'Sandes App' for OTP on their registered mobile number for registration.

**ROUND-1**

**Eligibility for participation:**

Only NEET (UG)-2024 qualified candidates are eligible to apply/register for the AACCC-UG counseling.

**Process:**

**Step 1: Registration** for all NEET-UG qualified candidates who wish to participate in AACCC-UG Counseling for admission to ASU&H-AIQ seats under Govt. /Govt. Aided/ Central Universities/National Institutes/ Deemed Universities and to AIQ-B. Pharm (Ay) seats of ITRA, Jamnagar.

**Step 2: Payment of Counseling Fee** (Non-Refundable Registration Fee + refundable Security Money) as per the candidate’s preference on the ‘**selection of counseling**’ in the AACCC-UG Portal i.e., (i) AIQ-Govt. (ii) Central Universities-National Institutes (iii) AIQ- Govt. Aided and (iv) Deemed Universities.

**Step 3: Choice filling** as per the candidate’s preference on streams [BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS/B.Pharm(Ay)] and Institute. (candidates can lock their choices as per schedule; if the candidate cannot lock the choices in time, it will automatically be locked as per server time)

**Step 4: Processing of seat allotment** as per candidate’s merit and choices on streams & institutes locked by the candidate/locked as per server time on portal.

**Step 5: Publication of provisional result on the AACCC-UG portal:** If there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to [counseling-ayush@gov.in](mailto:counseling-ayush@gov.in) within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

**Step 4: Processing of seat allotment** as per candidate's merit and choices on streams & institutes locked by the candidate/locked as per server time on the portal.

**Step 5: Publication of provisional result on the AACCC-UG portal;** if there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to counseling-ayush@gov.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

- d) Round 1 admitted Candidates who availed of Free Exit till the date of announcement of the R-2 final result (**excluding the final result date**).
- e) Round 1 admitted candidates but not upgraded during R-2.
- f) Round 1 admitted candidates but not upgraded during R-2 and availed of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 can participate in R-3 with full payment of counseling fees.
- g) Candidates joined the R-1 allotted seats and submitted willingness for up-gradation but did not participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round of counseling.
- h) Candidates joined the Round-2 allotted/upgraded seat and submitted willingness for up-gradation in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round.
- i) Round 2 non-joined candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture can participate in R-3 with full payment of counseling fees.
- j) Round 2 joined candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 can participate in R-3 with full payment of counseling fees.

**Step 2: Payment of Counseling Fee** (Non-Refundable Registration Fee + refundable Security Money) as per candidate's preference on the **selection of counseling** in the AACCC-UG Portal, i.e., (i) AIQ-Govt (ii) Central Universities-National Institutes (iii) AIQ-

Govt.Aided and (iv) Deemed Universities. Those candidates who have availed exit with forfeiture of counseling fees need to pay complete counseling fees again for participating in the subsequent rounds.

**Step 3: Choice filling** as per the candidate's preference on streams [BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS/B.Pharm(Ay.)] and Institute. **The choices filled during the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Round become null & void** (candidates can lock their choices as per schedule; if the candidate cannot lock the choices in time, it will automatically be locked as per server time)

**Step 4: Processing of seat allotment** as per candidate's merit and choices on streams and institutes locked by the candidate/locked as per server time on the portal.

**Step 5: Publication of provisional result** on the AACCC-UG portal; if any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to counseling-ayush@gov.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

**Step 6: Publication of final Seat allotment list** (final result): Candidates can download the provisional allotment letter from the AACCC-UG portal.

**Step 7:** Publication of list of candidates who secured their AIQ-UG seats through R-1/R-2 till the date of announcement of R-3 final result and who have been allotted seats in R-3 are ineligible for any Ayush-UG Counseling 2024 (Central/State-UT). These candidates are ineligible to participate in other Ayush-UG counseling.

In this regard, it is also informed that the candidates who withdraw their seats during the period between 3 days before the commencement of R-3 and till the date of announcement of R-3 final result (**excluding the final result date**) are ineligible for AACCC-UG Counseling due to non-compliance of AACCC-UG Counseling scheme 2024.

### STRAY VACANCY ROUND

- The ASU & H- **Govt./Govt. Aided colleges/ Central Universities(CU) / National Institutes(NI)** seats and B.Pharm (Ay.) seats remain vacant (not joined/withdrawn) after the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of AACCC-UG Counseling will continue to be filled through the online **Stray Vacancy Round** conducted by the AACCC, M/o Ayush.
- The **Deemed University** seats that remain vacant after the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of AACCC-UG counseling will be forwarded to the respective Deemed Universities for conducting online Stray Vacancy Round through the AACCC-UG portal.

**Vide Court order dated 30.11.2023 in SCA No. 19485/2023 at the High Court of Gujarat, to comply with the direction of the court, AACCC, M/o Ayush has decided to conduct two-phase allotments in the Stray Vacancy Round for seats under Govt./ Govt.aided/CU/NI in the name of SVR-I and SVR-II. However, it is stated that Stray Vacancy Round Phase –II is not mandatory and it will be conducted only if any seat is vacant after Stray Vacancy Round Phase-I.**

### STRAY VACANCY ROUND FOR GOVT./GOVT.AIDED/CU/NI

#### Eligibility for participation:

- a) Only NEET (UG)- 2024 qualified candidates who have registered in the 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> / 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of AACCC-UG counseling are eligible to participate, provided that,-
  - i. Candidates who have not been admitted to any of the seats through AACCC-UG counseling or counseling conducted by State/UTs.
- b) Candidates who have not registered in the AACCC-UG counseling and have not been admitted to any of the seats through State/UTs counseling are eligible to participate after registration on the AACCC-UG Portal.
- c) Round-1 non-joined candidate availed of Free Exit.
- d) Round 1 admitted Candidates who availed of Free Exit till the date of announcement of the R-2 final result (**excluding final result date**).

- e) Round 1 admitted candidates but not upgraded during R-2 and availed of exit with forfeiture 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 can participate with full payment of counseling fees.
- f) Round 2 non-joined candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees can participate with full payment of counseling fees.
- g) Round 2 admitted/upgraded candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 can participate with full payment of counseling fees.

**Ineligibility for participation:**

- a) R-1/R-2 admitted candidates who secured their AIQ-UG seats till the date of announcement of the R-3 final result and candidates who have been allotted seats in R-3 are not eligible to participate in the Stray Vacancy Round.
- b) Candidates who withdraw their seats during the period between 3 days before the commencement of R-3 and till the date of announcement of the R-3 final result (**excluding the final result date**) are not eligible to participate in the Stray Vacancy Round.
- c) Candidates who have been admitted through any rounds of Ayush –UG State/UT counseling are ineligible to participate in the Stray Vacancy Round of AACCC-UG Counseling.

**Salient features of Stray Vacancy Round for AIQ seats under Govt./Govt.**

**Aided/CU/NI and B.Pharm(Ay), ITRA, Jamnagar**

- a) Registration & choice filling is available in SVR-I
- b) No upgradation is available from any of the 3 Rounds to the Stray Vacancy Round.
- c) There will be **the two-phase allotment**: –

During registration, Candidates must submit a **willingness in the AACCC-UG portal** to participate in the Stray Vacancy Round with an **undertaking** that they are not holding any UG (ASU&H) seats allotted through AACCC/State/UT-UG counseling and complied the AACCC-counseling scheme or counseling conducted by State/UTs. (**Note:** Appropriate disciplinary action shall be taken if the seat is allotted based on the false undertaking given by the candidate on the portal)

**Step 2: Payment of Counseling Fee** (Non-Refundable Registration Fee + refundable Security Money) as per candidate’s preference on the **selection of counseling** in the AACCC-UG Portal i.e., (i) AIQ-Govt (ii) Central Universities-National Institutes (iii) AIQ-Govt. Aided and (iv) Deemed Universities (Candidates eligible for SVR and whose counseling fee has been forfeited due to non-compliance with the counseling scheme need to pay the complete counseling fees again.)

**Step 3: Choice filling** as per the candidate’s preference on streams [BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS/B.Pharm(Ay.)] and Institute. **The choices filled during the 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> Round become null & void** (candidates can lock their choices as per schedule; if the candidate cannot lock the choices in time, it will automatically be locked as per server time). Option for **choice filling is available** on the portal only for Govt./Govt. Aided/ Central Universities- National Institutes. (choice filling is **not available** on the portal for Deemed Universities; however, eligible candidates who wish to participate in the Stray

Vacancy Round for Deemed Universities (SVR-DU) need to select 'Deemed Universities' as 'selection of counseling' on the portal. Further, candidates seeking admission to Deemed Universities need to contact preferred institutes to participate in the online Stray Vacancy Round through the AACCC-UG portal)

### **FIRST ALLOTMENT PHASE (SVR-I)**

**Step 4: Processing of the first allotment** as per the candidate's merit and choices on streams and institutes (Govt./Govt. Aided/CU-NI) locked by the candidate/locked as per server time.

**Step 5: Publication of provisional result** on the AACCC-UG portal; if any queries on the first allotment (SVR-I), candidates can mail to counseling-ayush@gov.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on the first allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

**Step 6: Publication of final SVR-I seat allotment list (final result)**

**Step 7: Publication of the list of ineligible candidates** for any Ayush-UG Counseling 2024 (Central/State-UT)

**Ineligible candidates after SVR-I includes** candidates who secured their AIQ-UG seats through R-1/R-2 till the date of announcement of R-3 final result and who have been allotted seats in R-3/SVR-I and who did not comply with the AACCC-UG Counseling scheme & candidates withdraw their seats from 3 days before the commencement of R-3.

**Step 8: Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute** with all original documents (Refer FAQ No. 30 to 33) within the stipulated time (SVR-I reporting phase) as per schedule.

### **SECOND ALLOTMENT PHASE (SVR-II)**

**Step 9: Publication of non-reported seats** on the last day of reporting for the SVR-I

**Step 10: Processing of the second allotment** as per candidate's merit and choices on streams and institutes (Govt./Govt. Aided/CU-NI) locked by the candidate/locked as per server time during the SVR-I

**Step 11: Publication of provisional result** on the AACCC-UG portal; if any queries on the second allotment (SVR-II), candidates can mail to counseling-ayush@gov.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on the second allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.

**Step 12: Publication of final SVR-II seat allotment list (final result)**

**Step 13: Publication of the final list of ineligible candidates** for any Ayush-UG Counseling 2024 (Central/State-UT).

**Ineligible candidates after SVR-II include** candidates who secured their AIQ-UG seats through R-1/R-2 till the date of announcement of R-3 final result and who have been allotted seats in R-3/SVR-I/SVR-II and who not complied with the AACCC Counseling scheme & candidates withdraw their seats from 3 days before the commencement of R-3.

**Step 14: Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute** with all original documents (Refer FAQ No. 30 to 33) within the stipulated time (SVR-II reporting phase) as per schedule.

## STRAY VACANCY ROUND FOR DEEMED UNIVERSITY (SVR-DU)

### Registration Facility

- Registered candidates who opted '**Deemed University**' as '**selection of counseling**' on the AACCC-UG portal during **R-1, R-2, R-3 and SVR-I** and not get allotted any seats during any rounds of AACCC-UG/State/UT counseling can participate in SVR-DU.
- Non-registered candidates **AND** Registered candidates who do not opted '**Deemed University**' as '**selection of counseling**' on the AACCC-UG portal till R-3 and do not get allotted any seats during any rounds of AACCC-UG/State/UT counseling can participate in SVR-DU by registering on the AACCC-UG Portal during SVR-I by opting '**Deemed University**' as '**selection of counseling**' on the portal

### Eligibility:

- Registered candidates who opted for '**Deemed University**' as '**selection of counseling**' on the AACCC-UG portal and not in the final list of ineligible candidates published by AACCC, M/o Ayush on the portal are eligible.

### Non-eligibility:

- Candidates who have been admitted through any previous rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling and State/UT counseling and in the final list of ineligible candidates published by AACCC, M/o Ayush on the portal are ineligible to participate in the SVR-DU of AACCC-UG Counseling.

### Salient features of Stray Vacancy Round For Deemed University

- AACCC, MoA forwards the list of eligible registered candidates to the Deemed University for conducting the SVR-DU counseling process through the AACCC-UG portal.
- The final list of ineligible candidates will also be sent to the Deemed Universities to prevent them from participating in the SVR-DU counseling process conducted through the AACCC-UG portal.
- For seat allotment under Deemed Universities, the online Stray Vacancy Round will be conducted by the respective Deemed Universities through the centralized AACCC-UG counseling portal.
- The Choice-filling option on the AACCC-UG Portal is not available for candidates seeking admission to the Deemed University in the online SVR-DU. (Candidates need to approach respective Deemed Universities for allotment of seats in the online SVR-DU conducted through the AACCC-UG portal.)
- These seats are domicile-free, which means no reservation is applied on the seats under Deemed Universities.

## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS & FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

### GENERAL GUIDELINES & ROUND-1 (FAQs)

FAQ's are an indicative of the AACCC-UG Counseling Scheme 2024 for more details/clarification, candidates are advised to refer the Counseling Scheme 2024 mentioned earlier.

**Q.No.1. When will the AACCC-UG counseling for this Academic Year start?**

**Ans:** The Online seat allotment process will start as per the Schedule of the AACCC-UG Counseling for the Academic Year 2024-25. Please see the schedule and notices uploaded on the AACCC website (<https://aaccc.gov.in/>) from time to time.

**Q.No.2. How do I register on the AACCC website/Portal, and how do I fill in Choices?**

**Ans:** Candidates must log on to the website (<https://aaccc.gov.in/>) to register and fill in choices. Before choice filling/locking for each round, candidates are advised to make a tentative list of colleges or courses as per their preference after looking into the provisional seat matrix uploaded in the “Current events” section of the AACCC website.

#### **IMPORTANT**

*The registration facility will be available at the beginning of the 1st Round, 2nd Round, 3rd Round and Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I)*

**Q.No.3. How and when do I have to make the payment for AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** After registration, the payment page appears automatically. Candidates can only make online payments using Net Banking, credit cards, debit cards (preferably from nationalised banks), or UPI. After the successful completion of payment, the candidate can proceed with choice filling.

**Q.No.4. Do I have to report to any counseling centre for registration or choice filling?**

**Ans:** No, Online registration and choice filling can be done from a place of convenience (including from home) using a laptop/computer with an uninterrupted internet facility.

**Q.No.5. Do I need to upload any documents to register on the AACCC-UG portal ?**

**Ans:** There is no need to upload any academic documents on the portal. However, you need to fill up the similar information you gave when registering for the NEET (UG)-2024 examination on the NTA website.

**Q.No.6. How do I get the password for logging in?**

**Ans:** During the process of online registration, you have to create your unique password. Candidates are advised to keep the password confidential till the end of the counseling process. The candidate can change the password as per convenience. Sharing a password can result in somebody else misusing it, even leading to the exclusion of genuine candidates

from the online allotment process. *(Please see the password policy uploaded on the AACCC portal).*

**IMPORTANT**

*During registration on the AACCC portal, you have to fill in exactly the same credentials (spelling, numbers, etc) which you had filled at the time of registration for NEET (UG)-2024 Examination.*

**Q.No.7. Difficulty in login; what may be the problem(s)?**

**Ans:** Follow the instructions about the use of the browser, the latest registered version of Chrome/Internet Explorer/Firefox/Windows/IOS, as it is difficult to log in from other browsers. Use similar spellings and the similar format of the date as in the online application form submitted at the time of registration for the NEET (UG)-2024 Examination. The internet connection should be uninterrupted. If an interruption in the internet connection occurs, the IP address being monitored will change, and the session expired message will be displayed.

**Q.No.8. I have difficulty in creating a Password; what may be the problem(s)?**

**Ans:** Create a password as per the password policy uploaded on the website. Please use the internet browser as suggested above at **Q.No.7** while creating a password. Use the 'Shift' key instead of the 'Caps Lock' key.

**Q.No.9. If I forgot the password, how can I retrieve it?**

**Ans:** To retrieve the forgotten password, the software system facilitates the following process:

**Reset password using a reset link via registered E-mail**

Candidate has to enter their NEET (UG)-2024 Roll No. If the entered data (Roll No.) matches with the backend database, then the system will send a reset password link to the registered email-id. After clicking the received link in the mail-inbox, candidates must follow the online instructions to reset the New Password.

**OR**

**Reset password using an OTP via SMS**

Candidate has to enter their NEET (UG)-2024 Roll No. If entered data (Roll No.) matches with the backend database, then the system will send a verification code through SMS to the registered mobile no. Candidates are required to enter a verification code, and if the verification code matches with the database, the system will prompt resetting New Password.

**IMPORTANT**

*It is strongly recommended that the OTP sent to the applicant for any activity like reset password etc. must not be shared with anyone. This OTP is confidential and to be used by the applicant only. Neither AACCC, M/o Ayush nor NIC will be responsible for violation or misuse of the password/OTP.*

**Q.No.10. Can I edit/modify the registration details if I fill in the wrong information during registration on the AACCC-UG portal?**

**Ans.** Yes. You can edit/modify the registration details by availing of the registration unlocking facility under tab ‘Available Services’ on the portal. Candidates can avail this facility before choice locking and it is available as a ‘one time measure’ in time bound manner. Candidates can make following changes on the portal by availing this facility:

- i. Edit/modify the registration details and choices submitted by the candidate.
- ii. Edit the ‘selection of counseling’.

**Q.No.11. When I try to log in for a choice filling, it says wrong roll number/password; what may be the problem(s)?**

**Ans:** Password is case-sensitive; therefore, use exactly the same password created earlier. In case the password is forgotten, try to retrieve it using the process mentioned in Q.No.9 above.

**Q.No.12. Is there any restriction for filling the number of choices of institutions and/or courses?**

**Ans:** You can give as many choices as you wish during online choice filling. However, the candidate must fill in the choices of colleges/courses in the order of his/her preference (higher to lower). There will be a common counseling platform (<https://aaccc.gov.in>) for AIQ(BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) seats under -Govt/Govt Aided/National Institutes/Central/ Deemed Universities and AIQ-B.Pharm.(Ay) seats- ITRA for filling up choices.

**Q.No.13. Can I know which seat I will likely get at my rank?**

**Ans:** You can have some idea on the selection of college/course from the following facts uploaded on the AACCC-UG portal:

- AACCC, M/o Ayush uploads the details of College/Course and category wise Opening and Closing rank of admission in ASU&H-UG courses for the A.Y. 2023-24) in the “Current Events” section under the “UG Counseling tab” on the AACCC- website (<https://aaccc.gov.in/>).
- Before registering on the AACCC-UG portal, all candidates are advised to review this information for a better idea on the allotment of seats for the A.Y. 2023-24. This will only be indicative, and the admission pattern for the current A.Y. may vary depending on the availability of UG seats in ASU&H courses.

**Q.No.14. How do I know the availability of seats in participating institutes during 1<sup>st</sup> Round of AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans.** AACCC, M/o Ayush will upload the data on the Provisional seat matrix in the “Current Events” Section on the AACCC-UG portal during each round of counseling. The



information on the vacant seats in the participating institutes will be available on the Provisional seat matrix.

**Q.No.15. Is filling up and locking of choices necessary to get the seat allotted? Or will I be allotted a seat automatically from leftover seats?**

**Ans:** After online registration, you must fill in the choices of colleges/courses in order of your preference (higher to lower) and lock it before the server time during each round of counseling as per schedule. The submitted/ filled choices can be modified before locking. If candidates do not lock the choices submitted by them, it will automatically be locked as per schedule/ Server time. You will not be allotted any seats if you don't fill in choices even after registering on the AACCC portal. Candidates can download/print out the locked choices for future reference.

**Q.No.16. Is it necessary to download the duly filled registration form for AACCC-UG Counseling from the portal?**

**Ans:** Yes. It is necessary to download the duly filled registration form for AACCC-UG Counseling from the AACCC-UG portal. Some Universities instruct the candidates to submit the same to complete the admission process.

**Q.No.17. Can I modify my choices during the choice submission period for counseling?**

**Ans:** Yes, you can modify, add or delete your choices during the choice Filling period. Further, it is advised to do the same before locking the choices by yourself or the System as per schedule/ server time.

**Q.No.18. What will happen to my choices if I have not locked my choices before the time specified in the counseling schedule on the last date of choice locking?**

**Ans:** The choices you submitted and saved will be locked automatically on the last date of choice locking as per server time.

**Q.No.19. How can I get a printout of my choices?**

**Ans:** Candidates are requested to login to the AACCC-UG portal and take a printout of their choices that they have locked during the choice filling /Locking period or after the specified time of the last date of choice locking.

**Q.No.20. Is it possible to modify/edit my choices after the choice locking?**

**Ans:** Once locked the choices, it is impossible to unlock the same, even from the AACCC, MoA end. Hence, the candidates are advised to verify all choices before locking in. The Choices, once locked, cannot be modified, and any request to the AACCC, M/o Ayush, regarding tinkering of choices will not be entertained.

**IMPORTANT**

*Don't wait till the last minute to Register and fill in choices. Please go through your selected/submitted choices before locking, as once you lock the choices it cannot be modified or changed. It may result in the allotment of a seat which you never wanted. (Please note that the choices once locked cannot be unlocked even from the AACCC, MoA end).*

**Q.No.21. Is there a separate counseling platform for counseling & admission to B.Pharm (Ay.) seats under ITRA, Jamnagar?**

**Ans:** No. There is no separate Counseling platform for counseling & admission to AIQ-B.Pharm (Ay.) seats under ITRA, Jamnagar. Candidates who wish to take admission in AIQ-B.Pharm(Ay.) seats can register through the AACCC-UG portal. Candidates have to opt 'Central University-National Institutes' in the section of 'selection of counseling' on the AACCC-UG Portal for B. Pharm (Ay) courses. Candidates can submit their preferences/choices of courses among BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS/B. Pharm (Ay) on the AACCC-UG portal.

**Q.No.22. Is there a separate schedule for counseling and admission to B. Pharm (Ay.) course?**

**Ans.** No. There is no separate schedule for B. Pharm (Ay.) counseling. The schedule for admission to B.Pharm (Ay.) course is as per the counseling schedule for counseling and admission to ASU & H –UG courses (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS).

**Q.No.23. How many seats are available under the All India Quota B. Pharm (Ay.) course, and what reservation policy is applicable to these AIQ seats?**

**Ans:** As per the letter dated 12.06.2024 of ITRA, Jamnagar, **46 AIQ** seats are available for allotment through AACCC-UG counseling 2024. The Centrally approved reservation policy is applicable on these AIQ-B.Pharm (Ay.) seats (Refer Chapter 4- Reservation policy)

**Q.No.24. How can I get an online allotment and admission to the B.Pharm (Ay.) course through AACCC-UG portal?**

**Ans:** Procedure for allotment and admission to B.Pharm (Ay.) Course under ITRA, Jamnagar:

- a) Registration on the AACCC-UG portal
- b) Opt 'Central Universities/National Institutes' in 'selection of counseling'.
- c) Payment of Counseling fees (Registration fees + Security deposit)
- d) Submit choice for the B.Pharm (Ay) course under the institute ITRA, Jamnagar.
- e) Lock choices as per the schedule or otherwise, it will be locked as per server time.
- f) Online allotment of seat based on the NEET-UG 2024 All India merit.
- g) Get an online generated allotment letter through the AACCC-UG portal.
- h) Physical Reporting to the ITRA, Jamnagar, as per schedule.

**Q.No.25. If I joined B. Pharm (Ay.) course at ITRA, Jamnagar during R-1, am I eligible for other UG courses (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) during subsequent rounds?**

Ans. Yes. You are eligible for allotment to other UG Courses (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) during subsequent rounds. However, eligible candidates are advised to submit willingness for upgradation during reporting at the ITRA, Jamnagar and submit fresh choices of their preferred course in the subsequent rounds (R-2/R-3).

**Q.No.26. What about the Stipend/fee structure/bond amount/accommodation/hostel/rendering of service in rural /tribal areas /other conditions for the allotted course/college?**

Ans: Stipend/Fee structure/bond amount/accommodation/hostel/rendering of service in rural areas/tribal areas/other conditions, etc., may vary amongst States/Universities/Institutes. The allotment made through the online Counseling process will be firm and final. Therefore, the candidates should be aware of these points before opting for a course at ASU & H Colleges. The AACCC, M/o Ayush shall neither be responsible nor entertain any cases on the above grounds.

The information received from the participating ASU&H-UG Colleges has been made available on the Counseling website. However, before choice filling, candidates are advised to visit the College website or contact the College Authorities directly for any query regarding the above information.

**IMPORTANT**

*AACCC, M/o Ayush has no role in the fixation of Fee Structure/ Stipend/Bond of ASU&H Colleges. Therefore, AACCC, M/o Ayush will not entertain any request or complaint regarding this.*

**Q.No.27. How much time will be given to join the allotted course/Institute?**

Ans: Candidates who have been allotted seats are advised to join the allotted College/Course as per the schedule and reporting rules for that round. However, candidates are advised to join at the earliest as per the schedule and not wait until the last day of joining. Some ASU & H Colleges may take **2 to 3 days** to complete the admission formalities due to the institute's different holiday/working hour schedules.

**Q.No.28. Whether my admission valid if the college admits me to the allotted seat through offline mode?**

Ans: No. The AACCC, M/o Ayush will not approve the admission made through offline mode by the college under any circumstances. Therefore, candidates are advised to ask for

‘Provisional Admission Letter’ generated online through the AACCC portal at the time of admission to ensure that the college has admitted him/her through online mode.

**Q.No.29. What will be the fate of the seat at which the college makes offline admission?**

**Ans:** If a candidate is admitted through offline mode at the allotted seat, the seat occupancy will be shown as ‘vacant’ in the UG-admitted/reported list in the AACCC-Portal; subsequently, this vacant seat will be allotted to another candidate in the subsequent round of AACCC-UG counseling. Therefore, the offline admitted candidate will lose his/her allotted seat in the respective round of the AACCC-UG counseling.

**Q.No.30. What documents are required at the time of Joining/ Reporting in allotted ASU& H College?**

**Ans:** Original documents (along with attested photocopies, preferably 02 sets of documents) required at the time of joining in allotted ASU& H College are as below:

- i. Provisional Allotment Letter generated online from the AACCC portal.
- ii. Admit Card for the NEET (UG)-2024 Exam issued by NTA.
- iii. NEET (UG)-2024 re-revised score card issued by NTA on 26.07.2024
- iv. Date of Birth Certificate (if the 10th Standard Certificate does not bear the same)
- v. Class 10th Pass Certificate and Marks sheet
- vi. Class 12th Pass Certificate and Marks sheet
- vii. Eight (8) Passport size photographs. (Same as affixed on the NEET (UG)-2024/AACCC-UG counseling-2024 online application form).
- viii. Proof of identity (Aadhar/PAN card/Driving License/Voter ID/ Passport)
- ix. Medical Fitness Certificate issued by Registered Medical Practitioner in the prescribed format as attached in **Annexure-VI**.
- x. Transfer Certificate from the last studied institution.
- xi. The candidate should also bring the following **certificate in the prescribed format** attached in annexures, if applicable:
  - a) **Disability Certificate** issued by a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board for 21 Benchmark Disabilities as per the Rights of Persons with Disability Act, 2016, will be accepted. Further, the authorized designated disability centres will issue the online generated PwBD Certificate from the MCC portal, and the format of the same is annexed in **ANNEXURE-I**. No other PwBD certificate issued by any other Authorities/ Hospital will be considered for admission.  
(The qualified candidates with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)- should get themselves certified at one of the Disability Assessment Boards, constituted in various States/UTs. The list of Authorized designated Centers that will issue

Disability Certificates as per 21 Benchmark Disabilities given under RPwD Act-2016 is attached as **ANNEXURE-II.**)

- b) **The SC/ST Certificate issued by the competent authority should be** in English or Hindi. Sub-caste should be mentioned in the certificate and tally with the respective central list of corresponding states published by the Government of India ( <https://socialjustice.gov.in/common/76750> ) and ( <https://tribal.nic.in/KnowledgeHub.aspx> ). The certificate should be **as per the prescribed format** of the Government of India (**ANNEXURE-III**).
- c) **OBC-NCL certificate** issued by the Competent Authority (**issued on or after 1 April 2024**) **as per the prescribed format** of the Government of India. The sub-caste in the OBC-NCL certificate should tally with the updated Central List of OBC: <http://www.ncbc.nic.in>. The OBC-NCL certificate format is attached as **ANNEXURE-IV**.
- d) **Economically Weaker Section (GEN-EWS) certificate issued on or after 1 April 2024** by the Competent Authority. (**ANNEXURE-V**)
- e) In case of admission to the BSMS course, the candidates are advised to produce the Certificate of 10th or 12th standard having Tamil as one of the subjects; otherwise, the candidate shall have to study Tamil as a subject during the first professional B.S.M.S course.
- f) In case of admission to the BUMS course, the candidates are advised to produce the Certificate of 10th or 12th standard having Urdu or Arabic or Persian language as one of the subjects; otherwise, the candidate shall have to study the Urdu language along with Arabic and Mantiq wa Falsafa (Logic and Philosophy) as a subject during the First Professional B.U.M.S session

**IMPORTANT**

*Candidates without original certificates/documents shall not be allowed to take admission to the allotted ASU&H College. Candidates who have deposited their original documents in any other Institute/College/University and come for admission with a certificate/undertaking stating that "original certificates are deposited with the Institute/College/University" or bring coloured photo copy of original documents shall not be allowed to take admission in allotted ASU & H College.*

**Q.No.31. Is it necessary to submit Domicile Certificate for admission to AIQ-UG seats under ASU & H stream?**

**Ans.** No, it is not necessary to submit Domicile Certificate for AIQ-UG seats at the time of admission to the allotted institute as the AIQ seats are domicile-free, informed vide the Ministry's letter No. L-18020/2/2023-EP-I dated **26.05.2023**.

**Q.No.32. Should I submit any other certificate (e.g. Caste validity certificate) to complete the admission process?**

**Ans.** Candidate is advised to confirm with the allotted College regarding any requirement of certificate other than that mentioned in **FAQ No.30**. If so, the candidate is instructed to bring such required certificates (e.g. Caste validity certificate) at the time of reporting at the allotted seat.

**Q.No.33. In which format should I submit the certificates; if I do not submit certificates in the prescribed format, what will happen to my allotted seat?**

**OR**

**What are the instructions regarding EWS, OBC, SC, ST & PwBD certificates and Reservations?**

**Ans.** Candidates are requested to submit the relevant certificates issued by the competent authority in the prescribed format of the Government of India, as mentioned in annexures. If the candidate fails to produce the Caste, EWS and PwBD certificate in the prescribed format, at the allotted ASU & H College, then he/she will not be permitted to take admission.

**Q.No.34. From where will I get the details of the reservation and certificates?**

**Ans.** You must read NEET(UG)-2024 Bulletin/Prospectus carefully regarding Caste, EWS, and PwBD Reservation/Certificate. Refer NEET (UG)-2024 Information Bulletin (<https://exams.nta.ac.in/NEET/>)

**Q.No.35. Is there any lower age limit for the candidate seeking admission to ASU & H-UG courses?**

**Ans:** Candidate should have completed **17 years of age at the time of admission** or will complete that age **on or before 31<sup>st</sup> December** of the year of his/her admission to the first year of the ASU & H Undergraduate Course is eligible for admission. (Please see NEET (UG)-2024 Information Bulletin)

Accordingly, the lower age limit shall be as under:

<b>For Candidates of General (UR)/General-EWS</b>	<b>Born on or before 31.12.2007</b>
<b>For Candidates of SC/ST/OBC-NCL/PwBD Category</b>	

**Q.No.36. Is there any upper age limit for the candidates seeking admission to ASU &H-UG courses for the academic year 2024-25?**

**Ans:** The NCISM and NCH vide its letter dated **15.07.2022** have jointly decided not to insist any upper age limit for candidates seeking admission in ASU & H (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS) undergraduate courses since the academic year 2022-23, i.e. **there is no upper age limit for admission in ASU & H-UG courses.**

**Q.No.37. If I have a Birth Certificate/Caste Certificate/other certificates (s) in the regional language, will it be acceptable at the time of reporting/joining?**

**Ans:** Certificates issued by the Competent Authority should be in Hindi or English. In case the certificate is issued in regional language (other than Hindi or English), candidates are advised to carry a certified (attested) Copy of the English version of the original certificate along with the original certificate, as Certain States insist on certificates issued in English.

**Q.No.38. What can I do if there is a spelling discrepancy between the Certificates and the AACCC-application/registration form/provisional allotment letter?**

**Ans:** If there is a discrepancy in spelling on Certificates, the candidate must carry an affidavit/undertaking to prove that the documents belong to the same person.

**Q.No.39. At the time of admission during any round, will my original certificates be retained by the allotted college/institution?**

**Ans: Yes,** all participating colleges/institutions have been instructed to retain the original certificates of admitted students and release them only after the seat has been upgraded or the candidate withdraws/cancels the seat.

**Q.No.40. Whether candidate's category will be changed during admission at the allotted institute if a category candidate (OBC-NCL/EWS...etc.) gets allotted a seat under the UR category?**

**Ans:** No, if the candidate has a valid category certificate (OBC-NCL/EWS...etc.), the candidate's category (OBC-NCL/EWS...etc.) will not be changed to the allotted UR category during admission at the allotted institute. But, if the candidate fails to produce a valid category certificate (OBC-NCL/EWS...etc.), the college has to change the candidate's category to the allotted category on the portal while verifying documents after getting consent from the candidate for completing admission process.

**Q.No.41. What happens if the college/institute changes the candidate's category (e.g. OBC-NCL/ EWS) to the allotted category (UR) during admission if the candidate gets allotted a UR category seat?**

**Ans.** Suppose the college changes the candidate's category (e.g.OBC-NCL/EWS) to the allotted UR category on the portal during admission for any reason; in that case, the candidate will be considered as a UR candidate in subsequent rounds of counseling, and they are not eligible for allotment of the seat of their category (e.g. OBC-NCL/EWS). Hence, candidates are advised to be aware of this category change during choice filling for the subsequent rounds.

**Q.No.42. Is NRI (Non-Resident Indian)/OCI (Overseas citizens of India)/PIO (Person of Indian Origin) candidates eligible for admission to ASU & H UG courses ?**

**Ans.** Yes. NRI/OCI/PIO candidates are eligible for admission to ASU & H- UG courses after qualifying for the NEET-UG 2024 examination. Please refer to **Chapter 5 of NEET UG -2024** Information Bulletin for the eligibility criteria and submission of relevant documents at the time of admission for NRI/OCI/PIO candidates.

**Q.No.43. What is the procedure for admission at foreign quota seats in ASU & H- UG courses?**

**Ans.** Foreign nationals need not qualify for the NEET- UG 2024 examination for admission to ASU&H-UG courses. Further, AACCC, M/o Ayush has no role in counseling for foreign quota seats.

**Q.No.44. What are the documents mandatorily required for NRI quota admission ?**

**Ans.** Following certificates are mandatorily required for NRI quota admission

- a) Passport/ Visa copy of sponsorer,
- b) Embassy certificate of the Sponsorer (Certificate from the Consulate).
- c) Sponsorship affidavit (stating that sponsorer is ready to bear the expenses for the whole duration of study)
- d) Relationship Affidavit (Relation of Candidate with the sponsorer)
- e) NEET Score Card of the candidate.

**Q.No.45. Where will I get NRI quota admission for Ayurveda, Unani and Homoeopathy undergraduate courses through AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans.** The NRI quota seats are available at Deemed Universities participating in the AACCC-UG counseling. The details of the seat availability will be uploaded in the provisional seat matrix of Deemed Universities under the 'Currents Events' section on the AACCC-UG portal during each round of counseling.

**Q.No.46. If I joined a course during R-1/R-2, am I eligible for other UG courses (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS/B.Pharm (Ay.)) during subsequent rounds?**

**Ans.** Yes. You are eligible for allotment to other UG Courses (BAMS/BSMS/BUMS/BHMS/B.Pharm (Ay.)) during subsequent rounds. However, eligible candidates are advised to submit their willingness for upgradation during reporting



at the R-1/R-2 allotted institute and submit fresh choices of their preferred course in the subsequent rounds (R-2/R-3). Upgradation is available upto Round-3.

### ROUND-2 (FAQs)

**Q.No.47. I have registered in the 1<sup>st</sup> Round; should I register again for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round?**

**Ans:** Only candidates who have not registered in the 1<sup>st</sup> Round need to register afresh for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round.

**Q.No.48. I have submitted willingness for up-gradation in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round while joining the 1<sup>st</sup> Round allotted seat. Later, I changed my decision and wanted to retain the 1<sup>st</sup> Round allotted seat; how it is possible?**

**Ans:** The candidate does not need to fill any fresh choices for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, so the earlier R-1 allotted seat will be retained. If the seat gets upgraded on submission of fresh choices during R-2, the earlier R-1 allotted seat will be cancelled. Further, the candidate needs to join the Round-2 upgraded seat as per the R-2 reporting rules of Counseling Scheme 2024.

**Q.No.49. Is it necessary to join the Round 1 allotted college to get a chance to participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round?**

**Ans: No.** If the candidate is not interested in the R-1 allotted seat, he/she can avail of free exit without reporting/joining the allotted college; further, he/she can participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round with the filling of fresh choices. However, if he/she wants to hold the Round-1 allotted seat, he/she should join the allotted College physically and submit up-gradation willingness for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round.

**Q.No.50. Who is eligible for the R-2 seat allotment?**

**Ans:** Candidates eligible for seat allotment in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round would be from one of the following groups:

**Group-I:** Newly registered candidate for R-2

**Group-II:** Registered candidates who got no seats in the R-1.

**Group-III:** Candidates who have reported at the R-1 allotted institute and submitted willingness for 2<sup>nd</sup> Round up-gradation as 'Yes'.

**Group-IV:** Candidates who have been allotted seats in the 1<sup>st</sup> Round but availed of 'free exit'.

**Group-V:** Candidates who have resigned/availed free exit from the R-1 joined seats before the commencement of R-2 and filled choices till the last day of the choice-filling period for R-2.

**Q.No.51. What is the procedure for 2<sup>nd</sup> Round?**

**Ans:** All eligible candidates who wish to participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round of online allotment will have to submit fresh choices and lock the choices during the choice-filling/locking period. All choices will be published as provisional and virtual seat matrices on the portal.

The virtual vacancies are seats likely to be get vacated during up-gradation. Eligible candidates will be allotted seats based on their merit and choices.

**Choices submitted during R-1 will become null and void.** In the case of candidates who have submitted willingness for up-gradation in R-2, their remaining choices submitted during R1 would be initialized (i.e., the choices remaining after allotment of seats in Round-1 will stand cancelled); hence, **all candidates are required to submit fresh choices for up-gradation to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round.**

**Q.No.52. Do I have to fill up the choice of courses and Colleges to participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round of the online allotment process?**

**Ans:** Yes, eligible candidates must submit fresh choice(s) of college(s)/course(s) for online seat allotment during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round. In case a candidate does not fill in fresh choice(s) during the choice-filling period, the candidate will not be considered for seat allotment during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round and will retain the already joined seat in the 1<sup>st</sup> Round, if any.

**IMPORTANT**

*If candidate want to upgrade his/her admitted seats of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Round, need to fill in fresh choices during 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Round.*

**Q.No.53. Is it necessary to join the R-2 allotted college/seat that upgraded from R-1?**

**Ans:** Yes. If the candidate gets upgraded a seat during R-2, the R-1 joined seat will automatically be cancelled immediately (i.e., that seat will be allotted to somebody else). **Upgraded candidates of R-2 are advised to join the college/seat as per the reporting rules after obtaining an online-generated relieving letter from the R-1 joined college.** If R-1 joined candidates upgraded in R-2 and do not wish to join the upgraded college/seat, they can avail of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees.

Seats can also be upgraded in the same college (same course) by change of category (i.e.ST/SC/OBC to UR or PwD to non-PwD) during R-2; in such a case, the candidate has to take fresh admission on the upgraded seat of R-2 by taking online generated '**Relieving letter**' from the R-1 Joined seat.

**Q.No.54. Is it necessary to join the R-2 allotted college/seat?**

**Ans:** If candidates get allotted a seat in R-2 and wish to join, they are advised to join the allotted seat as per schedule; otherwise, they can avail of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees.

**Q.No.55. What is the time period for the free exit for R-1 admitted candidates?**

**Ans:** R-1 admitted candidates who wish to resign the R-1 seat can avail of free exit till the date of announcement of the R-2 final result. After this stipulated time, R-1 joined candidates are treated as R-2 joined candidates, and R-2 rules will apply to them.

**Q.No.56. If my R-1 seat is not upgraded in R-2, and I wish to withdraw R-1 joined seat, will I be eligible to participate in further rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling ?**

**Ans:** After the announcement of the R-2 result, R-1 joined candidates who have not been upgraded in Round 2 are treated as R-2 joined candidates, and R-2 rules apply to them. If such candidates wish to withdraw their R-1 joined seat, they can exit with forfeiture of counseling fees till three days prior to the commencement of R-3, then they will be eligible to participate in AACCC/State/UT-UG counseling. If the candidate withdraws the seat beyond the stipulated period, he will be ineligible for Ayush-UG Counseling. (*For details, refer counseling scheme for R-2*)

**Q.No.57. I opted for up-gradation in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round/3<sup>rd</sup> Round of counseling when reporting to the 1<sup>st</sup> Round/2<sup>nd</sup> Round allotted college. Will my earlier joined R-1/R-2 seat be cancelled?**

**Ans:** Yes, once the seat is upgraded during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round/ 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, the earlier R-1/R-2 joined seat will automatically be cancelled, respectively, and the same will be allotted to another candidate. Therefore, you are advised to fill in only higher choices or choices which you prefer over the earlier joined seat.

**Q.No.58. Can I join the college directly if my seat gets upgraded during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round/3<sup>rd</sup> Round from the 1<sup>st</sup> Round/2<sup>nd</sup> Round of AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** No. You must get an online-generated relieving letter from the earlier R-1/R-2 joined institute/college before joining the R-2/R-3 upgraded seat/college. The candidate will not be permitted to join the upgraded seats without a relieving letter from earlier admitted institutes and original documents.

**Q.No.59. If I get an upgraded seat in the same college because of a change of category (e.g. from SC/ST/OBC to UR category), do I have to take admission on the upgraded seat again?**

**Ans:** Yes, you have to proceed as follows:

**Step-1:** Get an online-generated relieving letter through the AACCC portal from the institute for the earlier joined seat.

**Step 2:** You must join the upgraded category seat and get a Provisional Admission Letter, generated online, for the upgraded category seat. (your earlier joined seat would be cancelled and allotted to another candidate).

**Q.No.60. Is it necessary to join the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round allotted/upgraded seat to participate in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round?**

**Ans:** If a candidate gets allotted/upgraded a seat in R-2, following rules he must follow to participate in 3<sup>rd</sup> Round:

- If a candidate wishes to hold the R-2 allotted/upgraded seat, he/she needs to join the college physically and give up-gradation willingness for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round at the time of admission to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round allotted/upgraded college.
- If a candidate does not wish to hold the R-2 allotted/upgraded seat, he can avail of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees as per the reporting schedule for R-2 (need to pay complete fees again to participate in subsequent rounds as per the eligibility criteria for that round.)
- If a candidate wants to resign Round-2 joined seat, he/she can withdraw the seat 3 days prior to the commencement of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round with forfeiture of counseling fees; then he/she will be eligible to participate in further AACCC/State/UT- UG counseling. If a candidate fails to do so, he/she shall become ineligible for AACCC-UG counseling.

**IMPORTANT**

*In case, candidates have not submitted willingness for up-gradation in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round at the time of joining/reporting to 1<sup>st</sup> /2<sup>nd</sup> Round allotted College, he/she will not be considered eligible for up- gradation in 3<sup>rd</sup> Round.*

**Q.No.61. If I joined the Round-2 allotted seat but later changed my decision and wanted to exit, can I participate in further AYUSH counseling (AACCC/State/UT)?**

**Ans:** Conditions to participate in further AYUSH counseling (AACCC/State/UT) is as follows:

- Round-2 joined candidates who withdraw/surrender their seats three days before the commencement of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round with forfeiture of counseling fees can participate in further AACCC/State/UT- UG counseling.
- R-2 joined candidates who withdraw their admitted seat with forfeiture of counseling fees between the period of 3 days before the commencement of R-3 and till the date of announcement of R-3 final result (excluding the final result date) will be **eligible** for State/UT counseling but **ineligible** for further rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling.
- R-2 joined candidates who withdraw their admitted seat with forfeiture of counseling fees from the date of announcement of R-3 final result will become **ineligible** for AACCC-UG counseling / State-UT Counseling.

**Q.No.62. Is there free exit available in Round 2?**

**Ans:** There is no free exit available in R-2. Candidates who get allotted/upgraded a seat in R-2 are advised to join the R-2 allotted/upgraded seat as per the reporting schedule; otherwise, their counseling fees will be forfeited.

**Q.No.63. Am I eligible for further AYUSH counseling if I resign from the R-2 joined institute/ course?**

**Ans:** Yes. Candidate shall be eligible for further AACCC/State/UT AYUSH-UG counseling if he/she withdraws the R-2 joined institute/ course three days prior to the commencement of registration for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round with forfeiture of counseling fees, otherwise ineligible as mentioned in **FAQ. No. 61.**

**Q.No.64. Who will be eligible for the “Exit with Forfeiture” option in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round?**

**Ans:** Following candidates will be eligible for ‘Exit with Forfeiture’

- Candidates who do not wish to join the R-2 allotted seat can avail of exit with forfeiture within the reporting schedule as per the AACCC-UG counseling scheme.
- Candidates who wish to withdraw the R-2 joined seat can avail of exit with forfeiture three days before the commencement of the 3rd Round so that he/she will be eligible for AACCC/State/UT/Central pool quota Ayush-UG counseling. If the candidate fails to do so within the stipulated period, he/she will be **ineligible, as mentioned in FAQ. No. 61.**
- R-1 joined candidates whose seat has not been upgraded in R-2 can avail of exit with forfeiture three days before the commencement of the 3rd Round so that he/she will be eligible for AACCC/State/UT/ Central pool quota Ayush-UG counseling. If the candidate fails to do so within the stipulated period, he/she will be ineligible, **as mentioned in FAQ. No. 61.**

**Q.No.65. Am I eligible for Central Pool Quota Counseling if I join the R-2 allotted seat of AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** R-2 joined candidates can participate in the Central Pool Quota Counseling; however, once he/she gets allotted a seat through Central Pool Quota (CGN) counseling, he/she needs to withdraws the Round-2 joined seat till the date of announcement of R-3 final result (excluding the final result date) with Forfeiture of counseling fees. If the candidate fails to do so within the stipulated time, he/she shall be ineligible for Central Pool Quota counseling. Further, the AACCC, M/o Ayush has no role in the Counseling for Central Pool Quota seats.

**Q.No.66. If I withdraw the R-1/R-2 joined seat on or after the announcement of R-3 final result, will I be eligible for Ayush-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** If the candidates withdraw the R-1/R-2 joined seats on or after the announcement of the R-3 final result with forfeiture of counseling fees, they will be **ineligible for AACCC/State/UT/Central pool quota Ayush-UG counseling.**

**ROUND-3 (FAQs)**

**IMPORTANT**

*Candidates are advised to take a calculated decision to participate in 3<sup>rd</sup> round as they would not be permitted to resign from 3<sup>rd</sup> round allotted seat. They will also not be allowed to participate in any AYUSH-UG Counseling for that year once a seat is allotted in 3<sup>rd</sup> round.*

**Q.No.67. I have registered in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Round; should I register again for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round?**

**Ans:** Only candidates who have not registered in the 1<sup>st</sup> Round and 2<sup>nd</sup> Round need to register afresh for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round. Further, candidates who avail of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees need to pay complete fees again to participate in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round as per the eligibility criteria for R-3.

**Q.No.68. Who will be eligible for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of AACCC-UG Counseling?**

**Ans:** The following categories of candidates are eligible for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round:

**Group I:** Candidates who are registering for the first time.

**Group II:** Registered candidates who have not been allotted seats in Round 1 & 2.

**Group III:** Round 1 allotted candidates who availed of free exit.

**Group IV:** Round 1 joined candidates who opted for up-gradation but did not participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round of counseling (with fresh choice filling).

**Group V:** Round 1 joined candidates who availed of free exit till the date of announcement of the R-2 final result (**excluding final result date**) and did not participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round

**Group VI:** Round 1 joined candidates but not upgraded during R-2

**Group VII:** Round 1 admitted candidates but not upgraded during R-2 and availed of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 can participate with full payment of counseling fees.

**Group VIII:** Round 2 allotted/upgraded candidates who avail of exit with forfeiture can participate with full payment of counseling fees.

**Group IX:** Round 2 joined candidates who submitted willingness for upgradation at the time of reporting to the R-2 allotted institute.

**Group X:** Round 2 joined candidates who avail of exit with forfeiture of counseling fees 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 can participate with full payment of counseling fees.

**Q.No.69. What is the procedure for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of Counseling?**

**Ans:** Eligible candidates may submit fresh Choices during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round choice filling period and will be allotted seats based on merit and choices locked by the candidate/as per server time.

The provisional and virtual seat matrix for vacant seats will be published on the AACCC portal. Candidates will be shown all available choices against actual and virtual vacancies. (Virtual vacancies are likely to be available when the seats get vacated during up-gradation and the seat conversion as per the following algorithm).

The reserved vacant AIQ-ASU& H (Govt. /Govt. Aided /CU/NI) seats and B.Pharm (Ay.) seats that published after the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round will be converted during the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of counseling as per the following algorithm, only if the reserved seat is not opted by any candidate/non-availability of candidate of that particular category in 3<sup>rd</sup> Round.

**IMPORTANT**

*During 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, conversion algorithm will be applied on those reserved category seats which are not opted by any candidate (or may be due to non-availability of candidate of that particular category) and such converted seats are exhibited as virtual vacancies during choice filling for Round-3 on the portal. Candidates cannot claim for such virtual vacancies because such seats will be allotted to them only if the same seats are not opted by the candidate of the reserved category.*

**Q.No.70. Is the Up-gradation allowed from the 1<sup>st</sup> /2<sup>nd</sup> Round to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of the AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** Yes. Up-gradation is allowed from the 1<sup>st</sup> /2<sup>nd</sup> Round to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round of AACCC counseling for the candidates who submitted willingness for upgradation at the time of

reporting to the R-1/R-2 allotted institute. However, the candidates must join R-3 allotted seat that upgraded from 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Round admitted seats as their earlier joined R-1/R-2 seat stands cancelled. If such candidates do not join the upgraded seats in Round-3, their counseling fees will be forfeited, and they will become ineligible for further AYUSH-UG counseling. (Central/State/UT/Central Pool Quota).

**Q.No.71. Should I be eligible for Central/State/UT/Central Pool Quota Counseling if I am allotted/upgraded a seat in the 3rd Round of AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** No. The candidates must join their upgraded/allotted seats in the 3rd Round. If such candidates do not join their upgraded/allotted seats, their counseling fees will be forfeited, and they will become ineligible for further AYUSH-UG counseling. (Central/State/UT/Central Pool Quota).

The names of all ineligible candidates will be circulated to all Central/State counseling authorities to prohibit them from participating in any AYUSH-UG counseling (Central/State/UT/ Central Pool Quota).

**Q.No.72. What will happen if a candidate does not join the 3rd Round allotted/upgraded seat?**

**Ans:** If a candidate does not join the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round allotted/upgraded seat as per schedule, the candidate's admission will be cancelled with forfeiture of counseling fees. Further, he/she will become ineligible for any other AYUSH counseling. (Central/State/UT/Central Pool Quota).

**Q.No.73. I joined the R-1 allotted seat and submitted my willingness to upgrade the seat; for some reason, I could not participate in the 2nd Round. Will I be eligible to participate in R-3?**

**OR**

**I joined the R-1 allotted seat but was not upgraded during R-2. Will I be eligible to participate in R-3?**

**Ans:** Yes. You are eligible to participate in R-3 of AACCC-UG Counseling as per the eligibility criteria fixed for Round 3.

**Q.No.74. What will happen to vacant seats after the completion of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round?**

**Ans:** All India Quota (AIQ) seats of Govt./Govt. Aided/CU/NI institutions and AIQ seats of B.Pharm (Ay.) that remain vacant after the completion of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round will continue to be allotted during the online Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & SVR-II) conducted by the AACCC, M/o Ayush.

Deemed University seats that remain vacant after the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round will revert to respective Deemed University after the completion of the Stray Vacancy Round for Govt./ Govt. Aided/CU/NI Institutions. Further, Deemed Universities are instructed to conduct



Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-DU) through the AACCC-UG portal and for the same, AACCC, M/o Ayush will provide the list of eligible registered candidates and list of ineligible candidates.

**Q.No.75. How does AACCC, M/o Ayush, prohibit ineligible candidates from participating in further Ayush-UG Counseling (AACCC/State/UT/Central pool quota)?**

**Ans:**

- **Ineligibility for AACCC-UG Counseling**

Candidates who withdrew their seats between the period from 3 days before the commencement of R-3 to the date of announcement of the R-3 final result (excluding the final result date) or did not comply with the AACCC-UG counseling scheme 2024 are ineligible to participate in AACCC-UG counseling, which means the AACCC UG portal will block the candidature of the applicant from participating in further rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling.

- **Ineligibility for AACCC/State/UT/Central pool Quota-UG Counseling**

Candidates who secured their AIQ-UG seats through R-1/R-2 till the date of announcement of the R-3 final result and who have been allotted seats in R-3/SVR-I/SVR-II and who did not comply with the AACCC-UG Counseling scheme and withdraw their seats beyond the period mentioned for each round as per the counseling scheme are ineligible to participate in AACCC/State/UT/Central pool Quota-UG Counseling. The list of such candidates will be circulated to all State/UT Counseling authorities/ National Institutes/Central Universities/Deemed Universities to prohibit them from participating in further Ayush-UG Counseling.

**Q. No.76. When will the AACCC, M/o Ayush, publish the list of ineligible candidates for further Ayush-UG Counseling (Central/State/UT/Central pool quota) ?**

**Ans:** AACCC, M/o Ayush will publish the list of ineligible candidates at the following level:

- On the date of the announcement of the R-3 final result.
- On the date of the announcement of the SVR-I final result.
- On the date of the announcement of the SVR-II final result.

Further, the Ministry will direct the State/UT counseling authorities to prohibit the ineligible candidates from participating in the Ayush-UG counseling for the A.Y 2024-25

## STRAY VACANCY ROUND (FAQs)

**NOTE**

*The seats remain vacant (not joined/withdrawn) after the 3rd Round of AACCC-UG Counseling of Govt./Govt. Aided colleges/CU/NI will continue to be filled through the online Stray Vacancy Round conducted by the AACCC, M/o Ayush. Further, for seat allotment under Deemed Universities during the Stray Vacancy Round, candidates need to report the respective Deemed Universities to complete their admission process through centralized AACCC-UG counseling portal.*

**Q.No.77. What is the peculiarity of the Stray Vacancy round?**

**Ans :**

**Q.No.78. Is registration available in the Stray vacancy round of AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** Yes. Fresh registration is **available** in the Stray vacancy round (SVR-I) of AACCC-UG counseling. Candidates who wish to participate in the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II)- for Govt./ Govt. Aided/CU/NI and Stray Vacancy Round – Deemed Universities (SVR-DU) are advised to register during SVR-I as per eligibility criteria fixed for SVR.

**Q.No.79. Is choice filling available in the Stray vacancy round of AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** Yes. The choice filling is **available** in the Stray vacancy round (SVR-I) of AACCC-UG counseling for allotment of seats under Govt./ Govt. Aided/CU/NI; however, the choice filling is **not available** during SVR-II of AACCC- UG counseling for allotment of seats under Govt./ Govt. Aided/CU/NI. Further, there is **no choice filling** available for allotment of seats under Deemed Universities; however, candidates who wish to participate in SVR-DU are advised to select '**Deemed Universities**' in '**selection of counseling**' while registering on the AACCC portal during 1<sup>st</sup> , 2<sup>nd</sup> , 3<sup>rd</sup> Round and SVR-I.

**Q.No.80. Is there any separate registration option for counseling and admission at Deemed Universities during the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-DU)?**

**Ans:** There is no separate registration option for counseling and admission at Deemed Universities. Non registered candidates till R-3 who wish to participate in SVR-DU can register on the AACCC-UG portal during SVR-I.

**Q.No.81 Is there any institutional-level counseling for seat allotment under Deemed Universities during SVR-DU?**

**Ans:** No. After completion of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round, the vacant seats under Deemed Universities will be published on the AACCC-UG portal. Eligible candidates for SVR-DU who have registered and selected 'Deemed Universities' in the 'selection of counseling' on the portal as per the schedule (Registration period during R-1, R-2, R-3 and SVR-I) and wish to participate in SVR-DU can approach Deemed Universities for online seat allotment and reporting through the centralized counseling portal (AACCC-UG portal). The allotment of seats will be based on the merit and preference of the candidate for the course/institute. No admission is allowed without counseling as per the relevant regulations of the NCISM/NCH Act, 2020.

**NOTE:** There is no separate registration schedule during SVR-DU; however, non-registered candidates till R-3 who wish to participate in SVR-DU can register by opting 'Deemed University' as 'selection of counseling' on the AACCC-UG portal during SVR-I.

**Q.No.82. Should I submit any willingness to participate in the SVR for Govt./Govt. Aided./CU/NI (SVR-I & II) and SVR for Deemed Universities (SVR-DU)?**

**Ans.** To participate in the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I, II & SVR-DU), candidates must submit willingness cum undertaking on the AACCC-UG portal that they are not holding any UG (ASU&H) seats allotted through any rounds of AACCC-UG counseling/State-UTs Counseling.

**Q.No.83. Is any Up-gradation allowed from the 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> Round to the Stray Vacancy Round of the AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** No. Up-gradation is not allowed from the 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> Round to the Stray Vacancy Round of the AACCC-UG counseling.

**Q.No.84. Is any Up-gradation allowed from SVR-I to SVR-II (Govt./Govt Aided/CU-NI) of the AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** No. Up-gradation is not allowed from SVR-I to SVR-II of the AACCC-UG counseling.

**Q.No.85. Who is Eligible for the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) for Govt./Govt. Aided/ CU/NI and Stray Vacancy Round- Deemed Universities (SVR-DU)?**

**Ans.**

**A) Eligibility for Stray Vacancy Round for Govt./Govt. Aided/ CU/NI (SVR-I & II)**

**Group I:** Candidates who are registering for the first time. (need to register afresh on the portal during SVR-I)

**Group II:** Registered candidates who do not hold any seats through previous rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling or State/UTs counseling.

**Group III:** Round 1 non-joined candidate availed of Free Exit.

**Group IV:** Round 1 allotted candidate availed of free exit but did not participate in R-2/ R-3 of AACCC-UG Counseling

**Group V:** Round 1 joined Candidates who availed of Free Exit till the date of announcement of the R-2 final result (**excluding the final result date**).

**Group VI:** Round 1 joined candidates not upgraded during R-2 who availed of exit with forfeiture 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 and not registered in R-3 can register afresh with full payment of counseling fees to participate in SVR.

**Group VII:** Round 2 non-joined candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture and not registered in R-3 can register afresh with full payment of counseling fees to participate in SVR.

**Group VIII:** Round 2 joined candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 and not registered in R-3 can register afresh with full payment of counseling fees to participate in SVR.

**NOTE:** There is no separate registration schedule during SVR-DU, however, not registered candidates till R-3 who wish to participate in SVR-DU can register by opting 'Deemed University' as 'selection of counseling' on the AACCC-UG portal during SVR-I.

**B) Eligibility for Stray Vacancy Round for Deemed Universities (SVR-DU)**

**Group I:** Candidates who are registering for the first time. (need to register afresh on the portal during SVR-I)

**Group II:** Registered candidates who do not hold any seats through previous rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling (R-1/R-2/R-3/SVR-I & II) or State/UTs counseling.

**Group III:** Round 1 non-joined candidate availed of Free Exit.

**Group IV:** Round 1 allotted candidate availed of free exit but did not participate in R-2/ R-3 of AACCC-UG Counseling

**Group V:** Round 1 joined Candidates who availed of Free Exit till the date of announcement of the R-2 final result (**excluding the final result date**).

**Group VI:** Round 1 joined candidates not upgraded during R-2 who availed of exit with forfeiture 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 and not registered in R-3 can register afresh in SVR-I with full payment of counseling fees and participate in SVR-DU.

**Group VII:** Round 2 non-joined candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture and not registered in R-3 can register afresh in SVR-I with full payment of counseling fees and participate in SVR-DU.

**Group VIII:** Round 2 joined candidates who availed of exit with forfeiture 3 days prior to the commencement of R-3 and not registered in R-3 can register afresh in SVR-I with full payment of counseling fees and participate in SVR-DU.

**IMPORTANT**

*There will be data sharing between State and Centre and if any candidate has its name in the list of admitted candidates (State/Centre lists), then such candidates shall be ineligible for AACCC- Stray Vacancy Round.*

**Q.No.86: Who is ineligible for the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) for Govt./Govt. Aided/ CU/NI and Stray Vacancy Round for Deemed Universities (SVR-DU)?**

**Ans:**

**A) Ineligibility for Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) for Govt./Govt. Aided/ CU/NI**

**Group I:** Candidates who have been admitted through any previous rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling and State/UT counseling

**Group II:** R-1/R-2 admitted candidates who secured their AIQ-UG seats till the date of announcement of the R-3 final result.

**Group III:** Candidates who withdraw their seats from 3 days before the commencement of R-3.

**Group IV:** Candidates who have been allotted seats in R-3

**Group V:** Candidates who did not comply with the AACCC-UG Counseling scheme 2024.

Further, candidates who have been allotted seats in SVR-I will not be considered for seat allotment during SVR-II.

**B) Ineligibility for Stray Vacancy Round for Deemed Universities (SVR-DU)**

**Group I:** Candidates who have been admitted through any previous rounds of AACCC-UG Counseling and State/UT counseling

**Group II:** R-1/R-2 admitted candidates who secured their AIQ-UG seats till the date of announcement of the R-3 final result.

**Group III:** Candidates who withdraw their seats from 3 days before the commencement of R-3.

**Group IV:** Candidates who have been allotted seats in R-3/SVR-I/SVR-II

**Group V:** Candidates who did not comply with the AACCC-UG Counseling scheme 2024.

**IMPORTANT**

***Further, candidates who have been allotted seats in SVR-I will not be considered for seat allotment during SVR-II.***

**Q.No.87. Will I be eligible for State/UT/Central Pool Quota Counseling if I am allotted a seat in the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) of the AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** No, if a candidate has been allotted a seat in the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II), he/she will not be eligible for further AYUSH-UG Counseling.

Further, the candidates must join their allotted seats in the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II). If such candidates do not join the allotted seats, their counseling fees will be forfeited, and they will become ineligible for further AYUSH-UG counseling. (Central/State/UT/Central Pool Quota) for that particular year.

**Q.No.88. What will happen if I do not join the seat allotted through the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I /SVR- II) of the AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** Candidate must join the seat allotted through the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I /SVR-II); otherwise, the admission will be cancelled and become ineligible for other AYUSH counseling (Central/State/UT/ Central Pool Quota) with forfeiture of counseling fees.

**Q.No.89. What will happen if I withdraw the joined seat of SVR-DU?**

**Ans:** If a candidate withdraws the joined seat of SVR-DU,

- i) Counseling fees will be forfeited
- ii) Ineligible for further Ayush-UG Counseling
- iii) Refund of admission fees/bond amount, etc., remitted during admission is in accordance with the rules/norms of the respective Deemed University. AACCC, M/o Ayush, has no role to play in this regard.

**Q.No.90. Should the Security money be refunded if a candidate is not allotted a seat through any round of AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans:** Yes. If the candidate is not allotted any seat during AACCC-UG counseling, the security money will be refunded to the bank account/credit card from which the payment of counseling fees has been made.

## CHAPTER-5 REGISTRATION FEE & SECURITY MONEY

### FEES RELATED FAQ's

#### Q.No.1. Who is the Financial Custodian?

**Ans:** National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), a statutory body under the Ministry of Ayush, is the Financial Custodian for AACCC-UG counseling-2024. On behalf of AACCC-M/o Ayush, the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) will collect non-refundable Registration Fees and refundable security money from the candidates. After completion of the AACCC-UG counseling, on the advice of AACCC-M/o Ayush, the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) will refund the security money to the candidates.

#### Q. No. 2: What are the various fees to be paid at the time of registration?

**Ans:** At the time of registration, students must pay two kinds of fee

##### a) Non-Refundable Registration Fee

b) **Refundable Security money** will be refunded to candidates as per the counseling schedule to the bank account/credit card from which payment of counseling fees has been made for AACCC-UG counseling.

#### For example:

- Any candidate opting for Deemed University will have to pay an amount of Rs.55,000/- at the time of registration (i.e., Rs.5000/- Non-Refundable Registration fee + Rs.50,000/- Refundable Security money)
- Any UR/EWS/OBC-NCL candidate opting for AIQ- Govt./Govt. Aided/CU/Ni seat only will have to pay an amount of Rs.21,000/- at the time of registration (i.e., Rs.1,000/- Non-Refundable Registration fee + Rs.20,000/- Refundable Security money)

3. Any SC/ ST/ PwBD candidate opting for AIQ-Govt./Govt. Aided/CU/NI Seat only will have to pay an amount of Rs.20,500/- at the time of registration (i.e., Rs.500/- Non-Refundable Registration fee + Rs.20,000/- Refundable Security money)

**Q. No. 3: If a candidate wishes to apply for both AIQ-Govt/AIQ-Govt.Aided/CU-NI and Deemed University, how much fee should he pay?**

**Ans:** In such case, the candidate has to pay only the higher fee i.e. of Deemed University Rs. 5,000/- (Registration fee) plus Rs. 50,000/- (security money).

**Q.No. 4: If I selected AIQ-Govt as the counseling type and paid counseling fees during registration, and later decided to participate in Deemed University counseling, what procedure should I follow?**

**Ans: In such cases, the candidate should do the following procedure:**

**Condition I (Candidate wants to change counseling type during the same round):** By availing registration unlocking facility, the candidate can modify their counselling type and pay counseling fees again as per Deemed University counseling type on the portal. This facility is available for those candidates who have not locked their choices as per schedule.

**Condition II (Candidate wants to change counseling type during the subsequent rounds):** By availing registration unlocking facility, the candidate can modify their counselling type and pay counseling fees again as per Deemed University counseling type on the portal. This facility is available for those candidates who have not locked their choices as per schedule.

### REFUND RELATED FAQ's

**Q.No.1. When will the Refundable security money be refunded if I am eligible as per the Refund Policy?**

**Ans.** Refunds will be initiated only after all AACCC-UG Counseling rounds are completed.

**Q.No.2. When and where will the security money be refunded?**

**Ans:**

- Security money will be refunded only after 20 working days from the date of publication of the refund list by AACCC on its website (<https://aaccc.gov.in>)
- The security money will be refunded to the bank account/ credit card from which the payment of counseling fees has been made.
- The candidates are advised to keep their bank account active till the refund process is completed.

**Q.No. 3 In which bank account the security money will be refunded, (if at all the candidate is eligible for refund)?**

**Ans:** The security money will be refunded to the bank account/credit card from which payment of counseling fees has been made (*through Netbanking/Credit card/Debit card/UPI*) while registering



at AACCC-UG portal. It is strongly advised to keep that particular bank account/credit card active (and keep checking the refund status) till the whole process of refund is completed by Financial custodian for A.Y. 2024-25. For example:

Eg.1: If the security amount was deposited through Card#1234XXXXXXXXX6789, then the refund will go to Card #1234XXXXXXXXX679 only.

Eg.2: If the security amount was deposited from account # 123456789012 of State Bank of India IFSC Code SBIN0001234 then the refund will go to account#123456789012 of State Bank of India IFSC Code SBIN0001234 only

**Q.No.4. What happens if the candidate, by mistake, makes more than one payment for the same Roll #?**

**Ans:** Candidate can approach the Financial Custodian after 15 days of closing the Registration Window. The Financial custodian will refund the excess payment, if any, as per the refund policy.

**Q.No.5. Is the Security money refundable in all the cases?**

**Ans: No.** Security Money with registration fee shall be forfeited in the following conditions:

- R-2 non-joined/ joined candidates who avail exit with forfeiture.
- Candidate does not join the allotted seat in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Round/ Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & SVR-II)
- Candidate does not join the upgraded seat from Round-1 and Round-2 admitted seats.
- If the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration based on which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting.
- Not upgraded candidate of Round-1 resigns from his joined seat after the announcement of the R-2 final result
- Candidate resigns his/her joined seat through offline mode after the completion of counseling.
- Non-compliance with the AACCC-UG counseling scheme 2024.
- Candidates withdraw their admitted seats allotted through SVR-DU.

**Q.No.6: What are the norms for the forfeiture of counseling fee during AACCC-UG counseling?**

**Ans.** Following forfeiture norms are in the AACCC-UG counseling: If the candidate does not comply with the AACCC-UG counseling scheme 2024, the full counselling fee will be forfeited irrespective of the category of seat (e.g. AIQ-Govt or Deemed University) allotted/ irrespective of the type of counseling selected on the portal in multiple attempts by using registration unlocking facility. The following examples are placed for reference:

- if a general category candidate selected '**Govt/Govt. Aided**' as counseling type on the portal during registration for the first round and paid **21000/Rs**; further, during the second round, he selected '**deemed University**' as counseling type by availing registration unlocking and paid **55000/Rs**, and later he not complied with the counseling scheme, in that case, his full counseling fee will be forfeited (**i.e., 76000/Rs**).

- b) If the GEN/EWS/OBC candidate or SC/ST/PwD candidate is selected as 'Govt/Govt. Aided/CU/NI' as counselling type on the portal and paid 21000/Rs and 20500/Rs, respectively; further, he has not complied with the AACCC-Counseling Scheme; in that case, his counselling fee (21000/Rs for general candidate and 20500/Rs for SC/ST candidate will be forfeited.
- c) If a GEN/EWS/OBC candidate or SC/ST/PwD candidate selected 'Deemed University' as counselling type on the portal and paid 55000/Rs (same fees for both categories); further, he has not complied with the AACCC-Counseling Scheme; in that case, his counseling fee (55000/Rs) will be forfeited.

**Q.No.7. Do I have to request the Financial Custodian to refund the security money? What is the schedule for the refund of the security money?**

**Ans:**

- a) Candidate need not approach the Financial Custodian for refund of the security money.
- b) Once the Financial Custodian completes the refund, AACCC, M/o Ayush will publish the refund details along with the refund date & transaction # on the AACCC website (<https://aaccc.gov.in>). The refund will be credited, depending upon the level of digitalization of the candidate's bank, to the candidate's account between 02 to 15 days from the date of refund by the Financial Custodian.

**Q.No.8. Can I initiate refund proceedings through chargeback claim through the card issuing bank ?**

**Ans: No.** Candidates who have been allotted seats should not initiate refund proceedings through chargeback claims through the card issuing bank. If the chargeback claim is initiated, the Financial Custodian will not be in a position to initiate the direct refund, and thereby, the refund of the security amount will be delayed.

**Q.No.9. How do I contact the Financial Custodian?**

**Ans:** The candidate can contact the Financial Custodian (finance-aaccc@aiia.gov.in) through a registered mail Id.

- a) The financial custodian will entertain only payment and refund-related queries through finance-aaccc@aiia.gov.in
- b) For other than financial-related queries, the candidates may contact AACCC through mail [counseling-aaccc@aiia.gov.in](mailto:counseling-aaccc@aiia.gov.in)

**Note:** Direct queries to AACCC, M/o Ayush, regarding payment/refund will not be entertained.

**Q.No.10. Will AACCC, M/o Ayush bear the bank charges the candidate incurred while registering for counseling?**

**Ans:** No. Bank Charges, if any, incurred by the candidates should be borne by themselves.

**Ans:** No. AACCC M/o Ayush will not pay interest on the refundable security money.

**Q.No.12. Can the candidate remit the Registration Fee and Security money from the NRI Account?**

**Ans: No.** As per Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Rules, AACCC, M/o Ayush cannot refund the security money to NRI Account. If the candidate wants to use the funds available in his/ her NRI Account for registering for counseling, he/she has to first transfer funds from NRI Account to NRO Account and from the NRO account to AACCC' Financial Custodian account. Further, the refund from AACCC will be credited to NRO Account only.

**Q.No.13. If the candidate does not get payment confirmation from the payment gateway provider, whom should he/she contact for payment confirmation?**



**Appendix “A”**

**[See regulation 5 (4)]**

SCHEDULE relating to “SPECIFIED DISABILITY” referred to in clause (zc) of section 2 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), provides as under:-

**1. Physical disability-**

(A) Loco motor disability (a person’s inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including-

(a) “Leprosy cured person” means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from-

(i) Loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity,

(ii) Manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity,

(iii) Extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression “leprosy cured” shall construed accordingly,

(b) “Cerebral palsy” means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth.

(c) “Dwarfism” means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimetres) or less,

(d) “Muscular dystrophy” means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for health muscular. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue,

(e) “acid attack victims” means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

**(B) Visual impairment-**

(a) “blindness” means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction-

(i) Total absence of sight, or

(ii) Visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction, or

(iii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

(b) “Low-vision” means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:-

(i) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or

(ii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

**(C) Hearing impairment-**

(a) “Deaf” means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

(b) “Hard of hearing” means person having 60 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ear,

(D) “Speech and language disability” means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

**2. Intellectual disability** a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in a dative behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including-

(a) “Specific learning disabilities” means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematic calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia.

(b) “Autism spectrum disorder” means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person’s ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

**3. Mental behaviour-** “means illness” means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviours, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person,



4. Disability caused due to-

(a) Chronic neurological conditions, such as-

(i) "Multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other.

(ii) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

(b) Blood disorder-

(i) "Haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding,

(ii) "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "Sickle cell disease" means a haemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage, "Haemolytic" refers to the destruction of cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin,

5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

6. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government from time to time.

**Appendix "B"**

[See regulation 5 (4)]

**Guidelines regarding admission of students, with "Specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), in B.A.M.S.**

1. The "Certificate of Disability" shall be issued in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017, published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part II, Section 3, Sub-section (i), vide number G.S.R. 591 (E), dated the 15th June, 2017.
2. The extent of "specified disability" in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the "guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016)", published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part II, section 3, Sub-section (ii), vide number S.O. 76 (E), dated the 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2018.
3. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability.
4. The term 'Persons with Disabilities' (PwD) is to be used instead of the term 'Physically Handicapped' (PH)
