#### <u>ORDER</u> 27.01.2023

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the present writ petition survives only for a direction to issue guidelines as prayed for in paragraph 9.45 of the writ petition. She also states that the petitioner has filed a new application being C.M.No.27228/2021 seeking elaboration of the prayers namely for establishment of minimum standards for sample collection/sample collection centres and sample transport policy for medical diagnostic laboratories.

Since the Court neither has the domain knowledge with regard to sample collection nor it has the jurisdiction to set standards or frame the rules, it disposes of the present writ petition along with pending applications with a direction to the Union of India to consider the petitioner's application being C.M.No.27228/2021 as a representation and to decide the same by way of a reasoned order within twelve weeks after giving an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner. This Court clarifies that it has not expressed any opinion on the merit of the controversy and the said application shall be decided on its own merit. The rights and contentions of all the parties are left open.
