



Note: MCC of DGHS is conducting Counseling for 15% All India Quota and 85% Internal Quota Seats of Delhi University. Hence the rules of MCC will supersede and subsume that of Delhi University. Since, the same Rules & Regulations, software and timeline are used for the counseling of various quotas conducted by MCC.

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1. Information related to the Admission process:

The counseling for admission to Under Graduate (MBBS/BDS) Courses -2024-2025 for both quotas i.e.85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota will be undertaken by Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India).

ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-

A. ONLINE REGISTRATION FOR COUNSELLING:

ONLINE REGISTRATION FOR COUNSELLING: The candidates are required to register themselves online on www.mcc.nic.in / Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Govt. of India) to participate in Counselling of UG (MBBS/BDS) courses-2024-2025 for both 85% delhi quota and 15% all india quota.

B. Admissions (After successful allotment of MBRS/BDS seats by MCC for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota):

1. Only those candidates who are allotted seats in Colleges affiliated to University of Delhi, after successful allotment of seats by the MCC, DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) are required to register themselves on the online admission portal on the official website https://fmsc.du.ac.in.pf Faculty of Medical Sciences through online link* for admission to MBBS/BD3 for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota after verification of their documents by the respective colleges. They are required to complete the registration by uploading their documents, photograph, signatures and the online payment of registration Fee.

* Online link will be provided later on the official Faculty of Medical Sciences website i.e. https://fmsc.du.ac.in under Course updates - UG (MBBS/BDS).

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- 2. Before initiating the registration for admission, the candidates are advised to refer to UG (MBBS/BDS) Bulletin of Information 2024 thoroughly.
- 3. Any candidate, who has not been allotted any seat in University of Delhi under 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota or if otherwise ineligible to register for admission, somehow registered himself/herself on https://fmsc.du.ac.in such cases their registration will be invalid and no refund of fee will be done under any circumstances.

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Note: The candidates are required to bring Print out of Registration Form, Allotment letter alongwith original certificates (02 sets) of self-attested photocopies at the time of admission at the respective allotted college.

- Once all the above mentioned files are uploaded, applicant can proceed with "Make Payment". Applicant can also update the uploaded files and application form using Back button before making payment. Once the payment is made, no changes can be made in the application form.
- (h) Candidate's application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fee.
- in case a candidate wishes to apply in more than one Course then the candidate is required to submit total fee as prescribed for each course applied separately.
- Please note that the candidature is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned programme of study. In case a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it is done at the candidate's own risk and cost and if at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelledipsofacto. And the feepaid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.

After payment for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The candidates are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.

- (b) Registration fee has to be paid during online registration process through one of the available online paymentoptions.
- (C) It may be noted that the application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fee.
- (D) The counseling for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota shall be done by MCC, DGHS Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India through online mode. The candidates are required to fulfill all the admission criteria, eligibility, merit and such criteria as may be prescribed for Registration for counselling as specified by MCC, DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India at www.mcc.nic.in. Also, all the Rules & Regulations of MCC shall be followed in letter and spirit for admission to UG courses.

1. Course, College, Institutions, Number of seats and duration of Course:

- The University of Delhi conducts MBBS Course in three Medical Colleges i.e. Lady Hardinge Medical College (LHMC), Maulana Azad Medical College (MAMC), (a) University College of Medical Sciences (UCMS) and BDS Course at Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences(MAIDS).
- Only female candidates are eligible for admission in LHMC.

Note:

- 1. Seats may be added/deleted depending upon the status of approval from University/National Medical Commission/Dental Council of India/Ministry of Health & Family welfare (MOHFW) Government of India. However, in case of any increase in intake capacity in MBBS/BDS course (s) the same will be displayed before the start of the counseling session(s).
- 2. The candidates are advised to visit website https://fmsc.du.ac.in of Faculty of Medical Sciences and website www.mcc.nic.in of Medical Counseling Committee to see distribution of seats.

2. Duration of Courses:

MBBS Course:

The normal duration of the course is 4½ years, followed by one year compulsory rotating Internship Training.

BDS Course:

The duration of the course is 4 years, followed by one year compulsory rotating Internship Training.

3. Eligibility Conditions/Requirement for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses

(a) Age: The candidates should have completed the age of 17 (seventeen) years on or before 31st December 2024. The candidates completing the age of 17 years on 1st January 2024 or later on will not be eligible for admission, i.e., the candidate must be born on or before 31.12.2007.

(For details please refer to the Bulletin of Information to Undergraduate Medical Courses of National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET – UG 2024)

(b) Qualifying examination:

- (i) The educational qualification for admission is as per NEET conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA). Further to become eligible for 85% Delhi Quota, the candidate must have passed 11th and 12th standard examination under 10 + 2 system conducted by CBSE/Indian school certificate examination/Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi or any other equivalent examination from a recognized school situated within the NCT of Delhi only. (see Appendix 1)
- The Candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Patrachar Vidyalaya or National Institute of Open Schooling will be eligible for admission in MBBS/BDS courses under 85% Delhi Quota provided their study center and the examination Center were within the

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National Capital Territory of Delhi (NCTD) and they must upload a certificate from the controlling authority of Patrachar Vidyalaya/NIOS in this regard.

NOTE: However, the candidature of candidates who have passed the qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 from NIOS or state of open school or as private candidates from recognized state boards, or with Biology/Biotechnology as additional subject shall be allowed subject to the outcome of the specialleave petitions/Appeals filed by National Medical Commission (NMC).

- (iii) The candidates who do not qualify the NEET-UG 2024 Examination conducted by NTA are not eligible.
- (iv) Further, guidelines/eligibility conditions and other requirements will be decided by the Medical Sciences Course Admission Committee (MCAC) from time to time.
- (c) Medical fitness: The candidate should be medically fit for the course.

4. Nominee of Govt. of India (NGOI / Central Pool Scheme):

(a) Twenty One Seats (6-MAMC + 15-LHMC) in MBBS Course will be filled up on the basis of recommendations of the Ministry of Health & Family Weifare, Govt. of India, New Delhi. These recommendations are made by the Ministry for the names sponsored by various authorities as given below. The eligible candidates should not apply for such seats to the institutions/Colleges/University or to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India. Such applicants for Central Pool Scheme should apply to following authorities only after obtaining the minimum marks in NEET-UG-2024.

The candidates belonging to 'Central Pool Scheme' (NGOI) category for the Session 2024-2025 will be required to register online on or before the last date of admission. (b)

Note: The concerned College may take necessary action pertaining to admission in the UG Courses (MBBS) under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW).

5. Procedure for selection to MBBS/BDS Courses shall be as follows:

The University of Delhi will not conduct a separate entrance examination for admission to MBBS/BDS courses under 85% Delhi Quota. Candidates are required to appear in NEET-UG 2024 conducted by NTA.

6. Display of merit list:

The counseling for admission to UG (MBBS/BDS) courses 2024 for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota will be undertaken by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare. All applicants may regularly visit Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Govt. of India) website: www.mcc.nic.infor regular updates.

7. Procedure for admission, assignment of College/Institution:

- The candidate will be required to produce admission tickets of NEET-UG 2024 and all original certificates including score card of NEET-UG-2024 at the time of admission to a.
- The admission would be made strictly on merit on the basis of percentile of the eligible candidates in each category, determined by rank/ marks obtained in the NEET-UG-2024. b.
- As soon as a candidate is allotted his/her selected seat, they are required to register themselves online at https://fmsc.du.ac.in after verification of their documents from the c. respective college.

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8. Counseling Schedule:-

The counseling for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota shall be done by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India through online mode. The candidates are required to fulfill all the modalities for registration for counselling as specified by MCC, Govt. of India at www.mcc.nic.in.

9. Counseling procedure:-

- The counseling will be done by Medical Counseling Committee, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt of India and the candidates are advised to visit website of MCC (www.mcc.nic.in) for all updates and procedure relating to counseling.
- (ii) The left over seats/stray vacancy seats if provided by MCC will be filled up through Stray Vacancy Round as and when notified.
- 10. An undertaking is to be given by the candidate to the affect that they are not pursuing MBBS/BDS Courses anywhere in India. In case admitted/pursuing MBBS/BDS Courses anywhere in India they will be required to produce cancellation certificate from the concerned College/ Institution at the time of reporting/joining.
- 11. Resignation: Regarding resignation / withdrawai of seats by the candidates, the rules guidelines of MCC shall prevail in letter and spirit.

12. Surety BondMoney:-

A bond worth Rs.3 lakhs with two sureties should be executed by the candidates at the time of their provisional admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Surety Bond is executed by the candidate. The Performa of Surety Bond is available on website: https://fmsc.du.ac.in

Rules regarding payment of Surety Money:-

- a. If a student surrenders seat in violation of MCC rules/instructions after joining the allotted institution.
- b. If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
- c. If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactoryperformance/misconduct/indiscipline.

The Original Certificates of the students would be kept in the custody of the admitting Institution and would be returned only after completion of the course or on payment of Surety Bond money, as the case may be. The **thirty percent** of the Bond Money thus collected will be deposited with the University (Faculty of Medical Sciences) by the institution and the rest could be utilized by the Institution for development of U.G teaching and training programmes.

13. Joining:

a. The candidates, who have been admitted in a course, shall be required to join the assigned institution by stipulate date.

The candidates must report to the college concerned by the date mentioned in their admission letter for completing the admission formalities at allotted college failing which his/her admission is liable to becancelled.

c. As soon as a candidate is allotted his/her selected seat, he/she will be provisionally admitted in that course. College fee will be paid at college.

14. Migration:

No Migration (to and fro) is permitted in the Medical College at the University of Delhi.

15. General instructions for the candidates:

- (i) The fee for online application for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) shall be applicable at par with Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe candidates. (EC Resolution No. 64(24) dated 23.06.2006).
- (ii) The Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) shall be exempted from payment of fee, including examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity card fee. (vide DU circular no. Aca.I/082/2001/PwBD/2012-13/355 dated 13th September, 2012)
- (iii) The candidature for the Under-graduate MBBS/BDS courses in University of Delhi is strictly provisional and mere appearance at the National Eligibility Entrance Test (NEET-UG-2024), and registering online with www.mcc.nic.in/ Ministry of Health & Family Welfare

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
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(Government of India) as well as in University of Delhi will not entitle the candidate for admission, which will be subjected to the marks/merit of NEET- UG-2024 and candidate's fulfilling all the requirements for admission. Those candidates who are not eligible would apply at their own risk and would not be entitled for admission. If at a later stage it is detected that they are not eligible as per rules, the registration and admission of such candidates will be invalid and no refund of fee will be done under anycircumstances.

Further, if any information furnished by the applicant is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue, at any time during admission / course, he/she shall be liable to criminal prosecution; it will entail disqualification and shall render the candidate unfit for admission without any notice. The candidate shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of theUniversity.

- The candidates shall comply with all the instructions while filling in the application form. Any (iv) error arising on this account shall be the responsibility of thecandidates.
- Candidates, before filling in online application form, should satisfy themselves of their (v) eligibility for admission to the courses. The candidates are required to go through the BOI carefully and acquaint themselves with all requirements with regard to the filling-in of the application form and admissionprocess.
- This Bulletin of Information contains only brief extracts of the ordinances, rules and (vi) regulations of the University. The candidates should, therefore, acquaint themselves with the relevant ordinances, rules and regulations of the University regarding eligibility requirements, payment of fee, attendance, examination and other matters pertaining to their respectivecourses.
- (vii) The candidate should seek the information with regard to the hostel and other facilities from the collegeconcerned.
- (viii) The various terms & conditions mentioned in the Bulletin of Information are subject to changes made in the Ordinances, Rules and Regulations by the University from time to time as per the decision of the University/ Medical Council of India. The University reserves the right to amend the rules at its discretion as and when considerednecessary.
- In case candidates are found to have furnished false information or document(s) etc. or are found to have withheld or concealed any material information while submitting their (ix) application, their candidature/ result/ admission will be cancelled and fee deposited by him/her shall beforfeited.
- The medium of teaching and examination for MBBS and BDS courses shall be English. (x)
- No TA/DA is admissible for appearing in the Admission/Counseling. (xi)
- Admission shall not be claimed by any candidate as a matter of right. The admission shall be entirely at the discretion of the Medical Courses Admission Committee of the University, (xii) which may refuse to admit any candidate without assigning any reasonthereof.



- (xiii) In case of any dispute, the decision of the Medical Courses Admission Committee shall be final. However, an appeal may file with the Vice- Chancellor, University of Delhi against suchdecision.
- (xiv) For all legal matters, the jurisdiction will be the National Capital Territory of Delhi only.
- (xv) The candidates must register themselves for online Counseling on the stipulated date and time to be notified by MCC (Government of India) website (www.mcc.nic.in /Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) as per the schedulenotified.
- (xvi) The candidates nominated by the Government of India (NGOI) having qualifications of a University/ Board which are not recognized by the University, should submit an equivalence certificate from the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). The admission of these students shall be subject to recognition of their qualifications by the University. The list of foreign qualifications recognized by the University equivalent to 12th class examination under 10+2 system is contained in Appendix-I

16. Span Period

The span period including internship to complete MBBS Course will be as per the provision of MBBS Ordinance 2019 of the University:

Clause 7.1: Every very learner shall undergo a period of certified study extending over 4½ acaemic years, divided into nine semesters from the date of commencement of course to the date of completion of examination which shall be followed by one year of compulsory rotating internship.

Clause 7.7: No more than four attempts shall be allowed for a candidate to pass the first Professional examination. The total period for successful completion of first Professional course shall not exceed four (4) years. Partial attendance of examination in any subject shall be counted as an attempt.

<u>Clause 11.2.6</u>: A learner shall not be entitled to graduate after 10 years of his /her joining of the first part of the MBBS Course.

BDS Span Period EC Resolution No. 18-1-16 dated 18.08.2022

As per DCI Revised BDS (Course) 7th Amendment 2015 notified in official gazette on 23.05.2015.

"Any student who does not clear the BDS Course in all the subjects within a period of 09 years, including one year Compulsory Rotatory paid internship from the date of admission shall be discharged from the Course."

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SECTION-B

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR MBBS/ BDS COURSES

1. Reservations:-

A. Reservation of Seats for Schedule Caste (SC)/Tribe (ST)Applicants:-

Fifteen percent (15%) seats are reserved for candidates belonging to SC category and Seven& Half percent (71/2%) for ST category.

The SC/ST candidate should attach a certificate to the effect that he/she belongs to SC/ST category from any one of the competent authorities as listed below without which concession of reservation of seats for SC/ST will not be given:

- District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy (a) Collector/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary magistrate)/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra AssistantCommissioner.
- Presidency Magistrate/ (b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief PresidencyMagistrate.
- Revenue Officer not below the Rank of Tehsildar. (c)
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate or his/ her family (d) normallyresides.
- Administrator/ Secretary to Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands). (e)

If the applicant happens to belong to SC or ST category, applicant's caste/ tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule. The Caste /Tribe Certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/ her caste/ tribe (b) whether applicant belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of applicant's usual place of residence, and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe is approved as SC orST.

If the applicants do not have the SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of registration/applying, the applicant may upload the acknowledgement slip of the SC or ST caste/tribe certificate application. However, at the time of admission, the applicant will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate.

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- Note: 1. The students belonging to SC/ST categories admitted to the various college departments of the University whose parents income was such that they are not paying income tax be exempted from the payment of the tuition fee and admission fee vide letter No. SPLC/ Fee exemp./SC/ST/2015-2016 dated 09.09.2015 & office letter no. Ref. No. Spl.Cell/2000.
- Note: 2 Reference to University circular no. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863dated 12.11.2015& letter no. F.No. 14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13/01/2015 Ministry of Education. Facilitating admission of deserving and eligible candidates facing financial constraint:-
 - (i) No fee need to be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-metric Scholarship/Top class Scholarships. At the time of admission they may advised to deposit the fee with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the Centrally Funded Higher Education Institute (CFHEI) will responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
 - (ii) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fee in the Institute then fee may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs whereapplicable.
 - (iii) Special schemes under Schedule Case subplan /Trible Subplan (SCSP/TSP)may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective Centrally Funded Higher Education Institute (CFHELs)/ for providing other facilities like book, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under those Scholarship Schemes, for SC/STdents.

B. Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (Non-Creamy Layer, CentralList):-

27% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to OBC category, while applying for admission to MBBS/BDS Course, should enclose a copy of the certificate alongwith the Application Form to the effect that he/she belongs to OBC Category duly certified by one of the competent authorities as listed below. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes

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The authorities competent to issue Caste Certificates are indicated below:

- (i) District Magistrate/Additional Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner (not below the rank of 1stClass Stipendiary Magistrate).
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and /or his familyresides.

The OBC applicants who belong to the Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of _creamy layer' status of the applicants as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the financial year 2024 2025 i.e. certificate issued on or after 01.04.2024.

The OBC candidate who belongs to Creamy Layer are not eligible for anyconcession applicable for OBC category candidates. The proof of non-creamy layer certificate issued by one of the Competent Authorities as mentioned above, should be uploaded with the online Registration Form.

C. Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PWBD)

As per Gazette notification dated 4.02.2019 issued by Government of India regarding Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India related to Americant Notification for guidelines regarding admission of students with "specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 with respect to admission in MBBS. (Appendix- H) 5% of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 based on the merit list of 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test'. For this purpose the "Specified Disability" contained in the Schedule to Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in medicine with specified disability shall be in accordance with Appendix 'H'. If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category.

NOTE: Before initiating the registration for admission in MCC website www.mcc.nic.in, the PwBD candidates are advised to refer to Range of 21Benchmark Disabilities, Medical <a href="Council of India Comprehensive Reportregarding Guideline for admission of Person with specified disabilities areavailable on MCC website: www.mcc.nic.in and <a href="www.mcc.

The persons with Physical Disabilities steel pay the of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee-in respect of the PuBD students is being met by the University of Delhi, Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwHD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.

It is clarified further that the PWBD students who are getting fellowships / financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fee / charges / mess fee subject to the following conditions:

Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging: OrdinanceXVC:-

- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department of Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on publiciransport. (i)
- Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall (ii) be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct of practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to beer on students freshly (iii) enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
 - involve physical assault or threat to use of physicalforce; (a)
 - violate the status, dignity and honor of womenstudents;
 - violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled (b) (c) castes andtribes:
 - expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect theirself-esteem;
 - entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior. (d) (e)
- The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any (iv) information of the occurrence ofragging.
- Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have (v) engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of (vi) ragging and the nature of the raggingincident.
- If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an (vii) enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice- Chancelloraccordingly.
- When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her (viii) decision shall befinal.

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- On the receipt of a report under Clause (8) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority (11) under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (e) the Vice Chancellor shall direct or order rustleation of a student or students for a specific number of ears.
- The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of rapping order or direct that any student or students (1) be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared becauselled
- In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guiltyunder this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the (11) University shall beinitlated.
- For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or (10) incitement of rapping will also amount torapping.
- All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-(Mil) Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.
- The Medical Council of India (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India (XIV) on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adheredto.
