1	Tetracycline	Treatment of Rocky Mountain spotted fever, typhus, Q fever, rickettsial pox, tick fever caused by Rickettsiae, respiratory tract infections caused by Mycoplasma pneumonia, Chlamydia infection , nongonococcal urethritis, chancroid, plague, tularemia, cholera, brucellosis, bartonellosis, granuloma inguinale, haemophilus and kleibsella infections, psittacosis.	Fixed Drug Eruption
