1. Jurisdiction of the University

Admission to the following full-time courses under The West Bengal University of Health Sciences shall be made on the basis of the inter se merit lists of different categories / castes of candidates by The West Bengal University of Health Sciences (WBUHS).

- 1.1. Post Doctoral Fellowship in Onco-Anaesthesia
- 1.2. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Nephropathology
- 1.3. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Interventional Radiology
- 1.4. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Neuroradiology
- 1.5. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Pain Management
- 1.6. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Neuroanaesthesiology
- 1.7. MSc in Public Health (Maternal and Child Health)
- 1.8. MSc in Public Health (Health Promotion)

2. Eligibility criteria

- 2.1. Citizens of India who have obtained the following qualifications shall be eligible to apply for the courses as detailed herein under:

2.2 Candidates would be appearing at examination through his/her declaration. If it is found that declaration is not true, s/he is debarred for admission at any stage before or even after admission.

3. Seats Available

The total number of available seats are detailed as under:

- 3.1. Post Doctoral Fellowship in Onco-Anaesthesia : 2 seats
- 3.2. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Nephropathology: 2 seats
- 3.3. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Interventional Radiology: 2 seats
- 3.4. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Neuroradiology: 2 seats
- 3.5. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Pain Management: 2 seats
- 3.6. Post Doctoral Certificate Course in Neuroanaesthesiology: 2 seats
- 3.7. MSc in Public Health (Maternal and Child Health): 10 seats
- 3.8. MSc in Public Health (Health Promotion): 10 seats

- The question of allowance of the in-service candidates for Trainee Reserve facility by the Govt. of West Bengal rests entirely with the State Govt. All in-service candidates will have to produce a no-objection certificate from the employing authority at the time of counseling for the course, if their name appear in the provisional merit list published by the University after the examination
- The reservation policy into SC / ST/ OBC-A / OBC-B will be applicable to the courses run in the state or Central Govt. only and will be in accordance with the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2013. Of the above courses, reservation will be available in the MSc in Public Health (Maternal and Child Health) and MSc in Public Health (Health Promotion) courses only.
- In case the number of seats for category candidates are not filled up by the candidates of same category; those vacant seats could be converted to the available candidates of other categories according to the extant rules of conversion of seats in different rounds of counselling.

4. Method of Submission of application

The candidates will have to visit the University website www.wbuhs.ac.in and search for the link provided on the home page for the admission test. They will have to navigate through the different steps of online registration system provided in the portal to register and finally submit the requisite fees to enroll themselves for the examination. They are instructed to go through the user manual provided in the portal to have a thorough information about the procedure of enrollment. The candidates must be ready with the

scanned copies of signature, photograph of himself and a scanned copy of the mark sheet of the final part of the qualifying examination which will have to be uploaded at the time of submission of form.

5. Admit Card

Admit Card will be downloaded by the individual candidate through from the portal created by the candidates themselves. No application for non-receipt of the admit will be entertained by the University. **The admit card would contain information about the time and venue of the admission test** along with the detailed instruction about the conduct of examination.

6. Admission test

Separate Admission tests of will be conducted by the WBUHS for each courses to prepare merit lists of the candidate seeking admission to the above courses as per the schedule of events notified in the information booklet.

6.1 Applicants will be provisionally allowed to appear in the Admission test provided he/she submits his/her application on-line in the prescribed form for the respective course and pay the **application fee of Rs.10, 000/- (Rs. Ten Thousand only) for the PDF and PDCC courses and Rs. 5000 /(Rs. Five Thousand only) for MSc in Public Health (Maternal and Child Health) and MSc in Public Health (Health Promotion) courses** (in online mode).

6.2 The question papers of the Admission tests will be set in English and shall contain **100 single best response type Multiple Choice Questions** relevant to the concerned course. The standard of the MCQs will be of that of the qualifying examination(s).

6.3 For each correct response, one (1) mark will be awarded. There will be **no negative marks** awarded for wrong answers and for questions not attempted. However multiple answers to a single question will be regarded as wrong answers.

6.4 The duration of each Admission test will be of **80 minutes**.

7. Counselling and Admission

a. The provisional merit list for the individual courses will be available its website (<https://www.wbuhs.ac.in>). No separate information will be sent to individual candidate in this regard.

b. Admission will be made through a process of counselling strictly according to the time schedule to be published by the WBUHS. **The notice of the time, date and venue of counseling will be available only in the website** (<https://www.wbuhs.ac.in>) and no separate information about it will be sent to the individual candidates.

c. The candidate will have to bring the following original documents along with their attested copies at the counsellig:

- (i) All relevant Mark-sheet(s) as per eligibility criteria
- (ii) Proof of age, e.g., Admit card or Certificate of Madhyamik or equivalent
- (iii) SC/ST/PH certificate, if applicable
- (iv) Photo Identity card e.g. EPIC/ADHAR/Passport.
- (v) Any other relevant document.

8. Reservation of Seats

1. Reservation to Category candidates will be done in accordance with the prevailing rules in the seats at the Govt. colleges only. The distribution of the category seats will be displayed at the counselling venue according to 100 or 200 point roster in state and central Govt. institutions respectively.

2. Seats reserved for SC candidates when remaining vacant even after following the instructions laid down in the Govt. orders and notifications, shall be filled in by the ST candidates and vice- versa. Likewise seats reserved for OBC-A and OBC-B can also be interchangeably allotted if situation is so needed.

3. Reserved category candidates appearing from other state will be treated as unreserved candidates in the state Govt. institution. .

9. Stipend and Study Leave:

The candidates are instructed to contact the individual institutions for the amount of stipend they are entitled for. The University is not, in any manner, related to the issues of stipend for the candidates, neither any query arising on the issue of stipend can be addressed to the University. The candidates should take the responsibility upon themselves as to whether they can get study leave of any kind from their appointing authority. A proof that they have been released from their current postings must have to be submitted at the time of counselling that they will be engaged in twenty four hour training for the above mentioned courses.
