**Sub:-** KNRUHS – Examination Wing – NMC Post-Graduate Medical Education regulations, 2023 – Implementation of guidelines in the University Examinations - Communicated – Reg.

**Ref:-** 1. NMC Post-Graduate Medical Education regulations, 2023.  
2. NMC F.No.N-P016(11)/2/2023-PGMEB-NMC, Dated:10.04.2024 from the President, PGMEB.

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With reference to the subject cited, I am by direction to inform that the National Medical Commission has published the Post-Graduate Medical Education regulations, 2023 vide reference 1<sup>st</sup> cited above and notified that the that the Regulations shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official gazette i.e., 29.12.2023.

In this regard, the NMC in its Post Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2023 have made following changes:

1. A post-graduate student of a degree course in broad specialty/super specialty will do at least one of the following to make him/her eligible to appear in his/her final examination:
  - a) Poster presentation at a National/Zonal/State conference of his/her speciality;
  - b) Podium presentation at a National/Zonal/State conference of his/her speciality;
  - c) Have one research paper published/accepted for publication in journal of his/her speciality as first author

**2. Course in Research Methodology:**

All post-graduate students shall complete an online course in Research Methodology. The above certification shall be a mandatory requirement to be eligible to appear for the final examination of the respective post-graduate course.

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**3. Course in Ethics:**

All post-graduate students shall complete course in ethics including Good Clinical Practices and Good Laboratory Practices, whichever is relevant to them, to be conducted by institutions/Universities. No post-graduate student shall be permitted to appear in the examination without the above certification.

**4. Course in Cardiac Life Support Skills:**

All post-graduate students shall complete a course in Basic Cardiac Life Support (BCLS) and Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) skills to be conducted by the institution. No post-graduate student shall be permitted to appear in the examination without the above certification.

The NMC vide reference 2<sup>nd</sup> cited has clarified that all the PG students admitted from 2021 and after will have to complete course in Ethics and in Cardiac Life Support Skill before appearing in the examination. The courses will be designed and conducted by the respective medical college/institution till further directions.

5. The total marks for practical/clinical including viva voce are 400 marks.

**6. Evaluation of Dissertations:**

Five percent of mark of total marks of Clinical/Practical and Viva Voce marks (20 marks) will be of dissertation/thesis and it will be part of clinical/practical examination marks. External examiner outside the state will evaluate dissertation/thesis and take viva voce on it and marks will be given on quality of dissertation/thesis and performance on its viva voce.

Hence, the Principals of all Medical Colleges are hereby directed to inform the students, faculty and HODs concerned that the said regulations will be implemented in the upcoming University Examinations and a copy of the regulations is herewith enclosed for your information.
