

INTRODUCTION

1. Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) conducts Post Graduate training primarily for the doctors of the Armed Forces Medical Services so as to fulfill the specialist requirements. Surplus seats, if any, are offered to sponsored candidates of Friendly Foreign Countries, Para-military / other Govt. of India organizations, ex-servicemen (Ex-SSC AMC officers) and civilian doctors. **The civilian doctors who get admission in post graduate courses at any AFMS institution shall be liable to serve for 05 years in AFMS.**

AIM & OBJECTIVES

2. The courses are being conducted to fulfil the following requirements:-

- (a) To meet the requirements of specialist cadre vacancies by training serving Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) officers.
- (b) To meet the training requirements of foreign students sponsored by Govt of India.
- (c) To offer PG courses to Medical Officers sponsored by Para-Military / other Govt. of India organization.
- (d) To maintain a reserve pool of specialist officers by offering PG courses to Ex-SSC officers who are on the reserve lists of AFMS.
- (e) To maintain a pool of Specialist Medical officers by selecting and training civilian doctors who will have to execute a bond to serve in AFMS for a period of 05 years as Commissioned Officers on successful completion of the post graduate course.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS

3. Candidates may kindly note that appearance in NEET-PG does not confer any automatic rights to secure a Post graduate MD/MS/Diploma seat in AFMS institution. Candidates who have registered for AFMS PG counseling on the DGHS/MCC website only will be considered for PG seats at AFMS institutes through AFMS counseling subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility, medical fitness and any such criteria as may be prescribed by the respective universities, AFMS institutions, National Medical Council and State/Central Government.

4. Candidates producing false or fabricated information shall not be considered for admission in AFMS institutes.

5. Candidates should go through the Information Bulletin carefully before contacting the AFMS for any queries. Queries pertaining to eligibility and other issues shall only be entertained if the information requested is not given in this bulletin.
6. Instructions in the information bulletin are liable to changes based on decisions taken by the AFMS /NBE /NMC/ MoHFW from time to time. **The candidate will have to fulfil all the criteria stipulated at the time of admission.**
7. AFMS reserves the right to withdraw permission to participate in AFMS counseling, if any, granted inadvertently to any candidate who is not eligible to appear in the AFMS counseling.
8. Candidates' eligibility is purely provisional and is subject to the fulfilment of eligibility criteria as prescribed in this Information Bulletin.
9. The existing schedule, pattern, policy and guidelines are for ready reference only for admission for the year 2022.
10. In case of any ambiguity in interpretation of any of the instructions/ terms/ rules/ criteria regarding the determination of eligibility of candidates/ conduct of AFMS counseling/ information contained herein, the interpretation of the AFMS will be final and binding.
11. All the correspondence should preferably be addressed by e-mail. The e-mail query shall be addressed only if it contains NEET-PG Roll No. and contact telephone number of the sender. An e-mail containing vague or general queries that are contained in the Information Bulletin shall not be entertained. Queries shall not be entertained from person claiming themselves to be representative, associates or officiates of the applicant candidate.
12. Candidates are advised to visit the websites www.afmcdg1d.gov.in & www.mcc.nic.in regularly for information and notices pertaining to admission to PG courses at AFMS institutions for the year 2022.
13. Candidates may note that by registering for AFMS PG counseling on the DGHS/MCC website, the candidate is deemed to have read, agreed and accepted the terms and conditions in the Information Bulletin of AFMS for admission to PG courses for year 2022.

NUMBER OF SEATS

14. The institution wise tentative number of seats available, in each speciality for the year 2022 session will be uploaded before the counseling. After fulfilling the

AFMS requirements, remaining seats, if any will be available to Priority II (Sponsored candidates from Friendly Foreign Countries), Priority III candidates (Para Mil and other Govt. of India sponsored candidates), Priority IV (Ex-SSC AMC Officers) and Priority V (Civilian doctors) in that order. The number of seats in AFMS institutions available in a particular year for admission may not tally with seats depicted on NMC or MCC website & will be governed by the existing recognized faculty / resources available, after approval of the Office of DGAFMS. It is also likely that no seat may be available for some of the priority categories.

15. The exact number of seats available along with their status as recognized/ permitted by NMC in different AFMS institutes for the 2022 session, with their subject-wise break-up, will be displayed on the AFMS website before the commencement of counseling of that particular priority. Stipend/ Fee structure/ course duration & contents etc. may vary from state to state and from institution to institution. The candidates need to examine these points during counseling before opting for a seat at the AFMS institutes. The AFMS shall neither be responsible nor shall entertain any case on the above grounds. Candidates are advised to visit the AFMS website regularly.

PRIORITY / CATEGORY FOR ADMISSION

16. Admissions for PG studies are strictly governed by Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No F/PC-8510/DGAFMS/DG-1/345/2013/D(Med) dated 6th March 2013 and amendments thereof. The admission and training is controlled by the Office of the DGAFMS in accordance with prevalent rules. The priority for admission of candidates is as follows:-

- (a) **Priority-I** - AFMS Officers detailed on advance specialist course/other courses as per guidelines of NMC/ NBE.
- (b) **Priority-II** - Foreign students sponsored by Government - On approval of DGAFMS/MoD/MEA subject to conditions laid down by the Govt. of India
- (c) **Priority-III** - Medical Officers sponsored by Para Military Organization / other Govt. of India organization. Sponsorship certificate mentioning the subjects for sponsorship by the sponsoring authority is mandatory requirement for the candidate to be considered for counseling.
- (d) **Priority-IV** – Ex-SSC AMC Officers released from service after completion of contractual service and within three years after their release from service. The date of release **should not be before 01 May 2019 or**

after the date of AFMS counseling for the NEET PG 2022 session.

- (i) SSC officers in their last year of initial contractual service and likely to finish the initial contractual service before the day of admission to the college allotted may appear under this category. They will have to produce their original release order and other documents as specified in our Information Bulletin.
- (ii) SSC officers in their extended contractual service may apply for this category subject to having submitted their application for release and only with permission of the DGAFMS.
- (iii) SSC officers still in service and are confirmed of their attaining the Ex-SSC status prior to the date of admission and are not willing for further extension will register as Priority IV candidate at the time of registration on the MCC website for the counseling.

In all the above cases they will have to apply for NOC from the Armed Forces Medical Services at the time of registration on the MCC website. At the time of admission to any college, they will have to produce documentary proof of their attaining Ex-SSC status without which they will not be considered for admission to the college.

- (iv) Officers who have resigned their commission /dismissed /removed from service/ not completed their initial contractual service are NOT eligible under this category. Such officers are also not eligible as Priority-V candidates.
- (e) **Priority-V** - Civilian candidates willing to serve in the Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) subject to their fulfilling the eligibility criteria mentioned at para 20 below. It may be noted that offering of PG seats to civilian candidates as Priority V is with sole objective to meet the specialist requirement of the Armed Forces Medical Services. Civilian candidates will have **to submit a bond agreement to pay an amount as sanctioned by the Govt. of India at the time of allotment of PG seat, in case they are unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission**. They also have to be medically fit to the standards required for commission in the AFMS at the time of admission. Officers of the AFMS who have resigned their commission/ dismissed/ removed from service/ not completed their initial contractual service as SSC officers are not eligible to be considered even as Priority-V candidates, though they may fulfill the age criteria.

17. All candidates desirous of admission to postgraduate courses should have appeared in the NEET-PG 2022 and secured minimum qualifying score as indicated by MCC to be eligible for AFMS counseling. Candidates, who have registered on DGHS/MCC website for AFMS PG Counseling, secured minimum qualifying score or more marks as indicated by NBE in NEET-PG 2022 and also produce the necessary documents, shall only be eligible to participate in the AFMS counseling.

18. The actual number of courses/ seats available shall be subject to vacancies available after fulfilling the training requirements of AFMS subject to available resources and in consonance with the Govt. of India / NMC and relevant University regulations. The number of seats available for non-service candidates, based on available resources shall be displayed on the website and at the time of commencement of counseling. It is reiterated that there may not be any seat available in some subjects/ courses if they have been allotted to candidates higher in priority and merit.

SPECIFIC AGE CRITERIA FOR PRIORITY-V (CIVILIAN) CANDIDATES

19. The age criteria is as mentioned under:-

(a) Maximum permissible age shall be less than 30 years as on 01 Dec 2022 (i.e date of birth is on or after 01 Jan 1993) to fulfill the service liability as mentioned here under.

(b) A doctor who fails to complete the course successfully before crossing 35 years of age as on 31 Dec 2025 **WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE** for commission in the Armed Forces and would have to pay the **cost of training of the course which is Rs. Thirty Six Thousand Five Hundred and Fifty One only) (Rs 36,551/- per week) to Govt. of India.**

(c) **The candidate should be willing to serve the Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS) for 05 years subject to fulfilling other eligibility criteria. Candidate will have to execute a bond agreement as per Appx 'B' at the time of admission, to pay a sum of Rs. 54,50,000/- (Rupees Fifty Four Lakhs and Fifty thousand only) for the session 2022-25 to Govt of India, in case unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission on completion of the course.**

(d) Civilian candidates (Priority V) will have to undergo medical examination by duly constituted medial board at the time of admission, so as to assess their fitness for commissioning as per laid down criteria and will be admitted only if found **MEDICALLY FIT**.

OTHER ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

20. The following eligibility criteria shall be applicable:-

(a) Admission to the postgraduate medical courses at AFMS institutions, subject to the priorities laid down in the prospectus is open to graduates of medical colleges recognized by National Medical Council and who have registered themselves as Registered Medical Practitioners with any State Medical Council recognized by NMC. Students who have completed / are completing internship on or before 31 Jul 2022 as notified by NBE in their Information Bulletin are eligible to apply. However, the Provisional Registration Certificate / Permanent Registration Certificate should be available at the time of admission.

(b) The candidate must be a **citizen of India** (except Priority-II candidates).

(c) Priority-II (Friendly Foreign Candidates) sponsored by the Government and approved by the DGAFMS should have passed their MBBS / equivalent examination (Authority: Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No F/PC- 8510/DGAFMS/DG-1/345/2013/D(Med) dated 6th March 2013) and also qualified NEET-PG 2022. As per NMC guidelines, Priority-II candidates are required to apply for temporary registration in NMC under NMC Act.

(d) A candidate shall not be eligible if he / she has cancelled or failed to report for admission in the past which has resulted in lapse of a seat.

(e) A candidate who is already pursuing any PG course shall not be eligible for admission to PG course.

(f) The number of candidates to be admitted in any discipline during the academic session 2022 - 2025 will be determined by the number of post-graduate teachers available, the student-teacher ratio and any other criteria laid down by the Board of Governors in suppression of NMC and affiliated University from time-to-time. However, the exact number of available seats in each priority will be displayed before the commencement of counseling for

that particular Priority.

(g) Any Priority III candidate leaving the seat after the seat allotment on conclusion of the counseling will have to submit an application duly signed by competent authority delegated by the Sponsoring Organization. Any such application requesting to leave the seat without recommendation of the sponsoring authority will not be accepted.

(h) The liabilities for any candidate leaving the seat after the seat allotment on conclusion of the counseling will be as per the MCC Policy. Any candidate leaving a seat mid-session after the commencement of course will not be considered eligible to participate in the AFMS counseling in the next session and will be liable to pay the University charges to which the college is affiliated.

METHODOLOGY FOR APPLYING

21. The following methodology will be adopted by candidates:-

(a) All candidates seeking admission to any of the institutions of the AFMS will have to mandatorily appear in the NEET- PG 2022.

(b) All candidates will have to register and opt for AFMS on the Medical Counseling Committee website www.mcc.nic.in to be eligible for AFMS PG counseling.

(c) A copy of the printed registration slip / printout of the registration details page should be kept safely by the candidate to be produced at the time of physical counseling.

(d) Merit list of the candidates (priority-wise) who have successfully registered on the DGHS/MCC website and have secured a minimum of 50th percentile marks in NEET-PG 2022 will be displayed on the website. Only these candidates will be provisionally eligible for the AFMS PG counseling, the schedule of which shall be available on the website in due course of time.

(e) There is a provision for a mop up round of counseling for the seats remaining vacant after 1st round of counseling. Candidates desirous of participating in mop up round of AFMS counseling will have to register on the DGHS/MCC website, to be eligible for AFMS PG counseling.

(f) List of certificates to be submitted in original by selected candidate at the college on the day of admission:-

- (i) 06 (Six) Passport size photographs
- (ii) Copy of the NEET-PG 2022 Admit card and printed copy of the DGHS website registration slip.
- (iii) NEET-PG 2022 rank card allotted by NBE.
- (iv) Class X / SSLC / ICSE certificate as valid certificate of proof of age.
- (v) Nationality Certificate/ Xerox copy of valid passport /Domicile Certificate (where applicable)/ Birth Certificate endorsed with nationality as **Indian** on it.
- (vi) First to Final year MBBS Mark Sheets of respective university.
- (vii) MBBS Pass Certificate / Degree Certificate.
- (viii) Internship Completion Certificate.
- (ix) Permanent / Provisional State Medical Council registration certificate.
- (x) **Attempt Certificate.**
- (xi) Transfer Certificate / Migration certificate
- (xii) Educational Gap affidavit, if any
- (xiii) Allotment letter which will be provided at the time of AFMS PG counseling
- (xiv) **Priority III candidates** (Para-Military Officers / other Govt of India Org): Subject-specific sponsorship certificate (as per format placed at **Appx 'A'**) issued by the respective Para-Military / other Govt of India organization is mandatory. This has to be produced at the time of counseling without which candidate shall not be allowed to attend the counseling. During counseling, eligible candidates will be considered eligible for only those subjects, which are mentioned in their sponsorship certificate duly signed by competent authority delegated by the Head of the respective Organization. Original copy of the sponsorship certificate will be required to be deposited at the time of counseling.
- (xv) **Priority IV candidates** - In case of Ex-AMC SSC officers, release order from Armed Forces Medical Services by DGAFMS / concerned Medical Directorate and movement order from last unit for

proceeding on release will be required to be shown in original at the time of counseling and admission. SSC officers in their last year of contractual service will have to produce their original release order from the Armed Forces Medical Services at the time of counseling without which candidate will not be allowed to attend the counseling. SSC officers in their extended contractual service must, in addition, have a copy of the NOC from the O/o DGAFMS besides the proof of being released from service on the date of admission.

(xvi) Declaration by the candidate is placed at **Appx 'B'**.

Applicants without the above documents will be summarily rejected.

Admission of any candidate found to be willfully giving wrong information will be summarily rejected during any stage of the admission process by the Commandant of the institution where a seat has been allotted finally. The decision of the Commandant will be final.

METHOD OF SELECTION

22. The following method shall be adopted:-

(a) **Entrance Examination**: All candidates desirous of joining the AFMS institutes must have mandatorily appeared in the NEET-PG 2022 and registered for AFMS Counseling on DGHS website www.mcc.nic.in.

(b) **Merit List**: A priority-wise merit list will be prepared after receipt of the list of registered candidates from the DGHS and the same will be uploaded on the AFMS website www.afmcdg1d.gov.in before the AFMS counseling. Candidates are advised to follow the notices on the websites regularly for updates.

Note : Merit of candidates who have NOT registered for AFMS PG counseling on the DGHS website www.mcc.nic.in will NOT be declared and no correspondence in this regard shall be entertained from any candidate at any point of time. There is **NO** provision of correction of any information by AFMS once it is entered into the MCC website at the time of registration

COUNSELING SESSION

23. Counseling for allocation of subjects will be held as described below :-

- (a) Priority-wise online counseling will be held based on candidates' merit-cum-choice except P-V whose counseling will be held physically.
- (b) The seat matrix will be displayed at the time of counseling.
- (c) Counseling for Priority-I candidates will be followed by all other priorities. **ONLY** those vacancies which remain vacant after filling of the seats by the serving officers and foreign sponsored candidates will be available for allotment to other priorities. These seats will be filled in the order of priority and merit secured by the candidates.
- (d) All candidates are requested to watch the AFMS website www.afmcdg1d.gov.in for updates regularly for schedule of counseling.
- (e) Eligibility of a candidate will be the responsibility of the candidate themselves as per the criteria mentioned in the Information Bulletin. He / She should check his / her eligibility for Priority/ Institution/ subject before participating in the counseling process.
- (f) The candidates who have been issued the admission letter shall produce all the originals certificates for verification as applicable. Candidates without documents in original at the time of admission will not be eligible for admission to the college even if he / she has got the necessary merit.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

24. Admission procedure shall be as follows:-

- (a) Admission to PG courses at AFMS institutions is provisional subject to confirmation / ratification by the Office of DGAFMS & University concerned. The selected candidates are required to submit additional documents/ certificates as per specific requirement of the institute/ University. Candidates should ascertain these details from the Dean Academics of the institute.
- (b) Decision of Commandant of the college regarding admission of candidates shall be final and binding.
- (c) All candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Cards of the NEET-PG 2022 and NEET Rank card till allotment of the seats and admission to the institution.
- (d) **Medical examination of civilian (Priority V) candidates** : This is a mandatory requirement for all civilian (Priority V) candidates. The medical standards required for civilian candidates are those applicable for selection as commissioned officers in Armed Forces Medical Services. Admission to PG courses shall only be given to those civilian doctors who are found medically

fit for commission by a designated Medical Board as per laid down medical standards for commissioning. For reference of the candidates, the medical parameters are available at www.indianarmy.nic.in and same are also available on DGAFMS website. **The candidates who are found medically unfit by the Medical Board will not be admitted to any of the AFMS institutes.** There is a provision of appeal / review for any candidate who has been found to be medically unfit by a Board of Medical Officers as per directions of the O/o DGAFMS. **If the candidate wishes to appeal, he / she should apply to the Commandant, AFMC, Pune by 1800h on the day of being declared medically unfit.** The decision of the Appeal Medical Board will be final. There is **NO** provision for medical examination / board of any other nature after a candidate has been declared unfit by the Appeal Medical Board. There is no provision for declaring a candidate temporary unfit. Candidates finally declared unfit, will not be considered for admission. No seat will be kept pending on account of the candidate wishing to undergo treatment (Medical / Surgical) for a disease / disability for which he / she is made unfit.

BOND AGREEMENT

25. All civilian candidates are offered remaining seats in AFMS institutions with the sole objective to fulfil any service requirements of specialist doctors. Therefore, all civilian candidates, if selected, are required to execute a bond agreement to serve as Short Service Commissioned (SSC) Officers for 5 years with the AFMS or pay an amount **as sanctioned by the Govt. of India at the time of admission in case they are unwilling to join AFMS when offered commission.** All Civilian students joining AFMS institutions for Postgraduate Degree (MD/MS/DNB Broad speciality) course from the session commencing will have to execute a Bond of Rs. 53 Lakhs (Rupees Fifty three lakhs), the value of which will be increased every year by Rs. 1.5 Lakhs (Rupees One Lakh Fifty Thousand) to a maximum of Rs. 60.5 Lakhs. The bond value will remain at Rs. 60.5 Lakhs (Rupees Sixty Lakhs Fifty Thousand) till such revision takes place. (Authority: Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No.17436/DGAFMS/DG-1D/334/21/D(Med) dated 15th Mar, 2021). The format of the Surety Bond may be amended from time-to-time as per the Govt. regulations and all affected civilian PG students will be required to furnish fresh bond to the Commandant of the institution where candidate takes admission, if so

required. The bond is to be executed on a Rs.500/- non judicial stamp paper and registered / notarized with office of sub-registrar and submitted on the day of admission. Expenses in connection with registration of Bond Agreement are to be borne by the respective candidate.

DISCIPLINE

26. PG students are expected to conduct themselves in a befitting manner as follows :-

- (a) Any candidate found obstructing or trying to influence the counseling and or admission process in an unlawful manner/ creating nuisance shall be liable for disqualification for the process of admission. Canvassing directly or indirectly for allotment of seat would disqualify the candidates for admission on the basis of the entrance examination. Influencing the staff by unfair means shall lead to the cancellation of allotment of seat and such a candidate is liable to face disqualification from the appearance in counseling in subsequent years. The decision taken by the authorities in this respect shall be final and binding.
- (b) All candidates selected for admission shall be subject to the disciplinary rules of the College, University and the Govt of India.
- (c) Post graduate students of the institute will not indulge in ragging. In the instance of any incidence of ragging coming to the notice of the college authorities, the accused student will be given an opportunity to explain and if his explanation is not satisfactory the student will be expelled from the institute. All students will be required to furnish an undertaking annually stating that they have understood relevant regulations/ instructions regarding ragging and that if found guilty shall be liable for administrative action.

LEGAL JURISDICTION

27. Disputes, if any, with regard to any matter referred to herein shall be subjected to the arbitration and in that event, arbitration will be decided by the DGAFMS. However, fees of the arbitration will be paid by both the parties.

GENERAL

28. The following aspects will be applicable:-

- (a) Stipend - Selected candidates under Priority IV and V only shall be paid

stipend, as per Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No F/PC-8510/DGAFMS/DG-1/345/2013/D/(Med) dated 06 March 2013. Details of the institutions are available and placed at **Appx 'C'**.

(b) Accommodation - No accommodation will be provided to Priority IV and V candidate as per Govt of India, Ministry of Defence letter No F/PC-8510/DGAFMS/DG-1/345/2013/D/(Med) dated 06 March 2013.

(c) Security Deposit - All selected candidate who opt to join the course at AFMS institution (except serving officers) will have to deposit Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) as security deposit by DD in favour of Commandant of the AFMS institution where he / she has accepted the seat. The same will be refundable after completion of course.

(d) Non-Completion of Degree / Diploma - Once registered, the candidate is expected to complete the Degree Course of the respective University. The students shall be liable to give an undertaking to this effect as per the regulations of respective University. Any candidate opting to forgo his seat mid-session/ before completing the course will have to pay the requisite penalty/ bond money as decided by the DGAFMS, to the Institution / affiliating University/ DGHS as per the prevailing rules in vogue.

(e) Discipline - All candidates are expected to be well turned out, polite, courteous, disciplined and sincere and will follow the rules of the college. The college reserves the right to prematurely terminate the course of a candidate in case of repeated breaches, or a major breach of discipline by him/her. Registration once granted is valid only if the Head of the Dept and Commandant of the Institute are satisfied about regularity and diligent pursuit of the studies by the student as well as good conduct and discipline befitting the institution and the University. The Commandant in consultation with the Officer I/C Training and Head of the Department may recommend to the University for removal/ withdrawal of registration of a Postgraduate student for irregularity and or misconduct.

(f) Fee Structure - The candidates will follow the fee structure as laid down by the University / existing Govt. of India regulations. Fees will not be refunded once admission is completed.

(g) Amendments - Amendments to the rules / procedures for admission may be carried out as per regulations laid down by the Govt of India/ NMC /DGAFMS / University from time to time and candidate will

have to abide by such rules/ regulations/ policy.
